SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

Welcome & Scent Theory 101 – Want to know more about how scent behaves in the environment and how dogs work it? This session will help you understand what is happening to the invisible scent molecules we are training our dogs to target and will help you know what to look for in your dog's behaviour when scenting. **Location: Training Hall**

Get Started 1, 2, 3 – These successive sessions are for anyone starting a dog in the sport and will be customized to each working team. With her extensive background in shaping and breaking down complex behaviours into simple steps, Stacey Shaw will guide beginner teams to develop both odour obedience and keen search behaviour. **Locations: Training Hall & Clubhouse**

Distraction Proofing (two sessions) – Increase your dog's odour commitment and decrease false alerts in this session focused on teaching your dog to choose target odours over increasingly potent distractors. If your dog has a kryptonite, bring it with you! **Location: Clubhouse**

Leash Handling for Interior Searches – Tips on helping your dog work tight spaces and avoiding crowding or hindering the search behaviour. **Location: Portables**

Leash Handling for Vehicles – Tips on how to approach and detail vehicles efficiently, safely and thoroughly. **Location: Vehicle Area**

Perfect Container Searches – Develop your dog's focus and your handling to work a variety of container searches. This session will be especially useful to dogs with a hectic search style. **Location: Training Hall**

Get Focused on Vehicles – If your dog sniffs the ground instead of working vehicles consistently or needs frequent search reminders, this dog-centric session will help get him or her more dedicated. **Location: Vehicle area**

Excellent Interiors Strategy & Planning – Advice on planning your approach to clear rooms and unknown hide numbers. **Location: Office**

Excellent Interiors – Put your planning session into practice working three different interior areas. **Location: Training Hall**

Introducing Interior Searches – Transitioning off containers? This session will help you start developing your technique to work a room and teach your dog that odour can be anywhere. **Location: Clubhouse**

Advanced Vehicles – Get your dog working those difficult vehicles hides whether in seams, higher areas or unusual locations without damaging the paint. **Location: Vehicle area**

Mental Prep and Goal Setting – Let mental training counsellor, Andrea Harrison, help you set training and competition goals that will work for your life and create a winning attitude. Location: Office

Handling Competition Nerves (two sessions) – Andrea will teach you strategies to combat competition anxiety and how to cope with adversity and use it to your advantage. **Location: Office**

Interiors – Watch the Dog! – Learn to spot when your dog is in odour to help you decide when to take control of the search and when to let the dog work independently. **Location: Clubhouse**

Exterior Search Trouble Shooting – Choose vehicles or area searches to tackle specific problems in your outdoor searches. **Location: Vehicles and Exterior Area**

Detailing and Patterned Searches – Your questions answered about the value of planning a patterned search (and when not to), leash or off-leash, plus detailing without distracting your dog. **Location: Office**

High Hides for Short Dogs – Is your dog limited in reach either by size or structure? This session will teach you what to look for and how to teach your dog to get as close as possible to source. **Location: Training Hall**

Working Multiple Interior Hides – Does your dog quit after the first hide is found or does your dog continuously return to the first hide? Learn how to deal with multiple odour clouds in a search area. **Location: Clubhouse**

Inaccessible Hides – If you have a dog that "surface surfs" and misses hides that are difficult to reach, this session will help provide ideas on creating more boldness and commitment to odour. Will also address fringe alerts. **Location: Portables**

Building Hunt Drive – Games to build your dog's independent searching skills and desire. Location: TBA

Alerts (2 sessions) – Choose one (or both!) sessions to develop a trial-ready formal alert. 10:00 session Location: Training Hall; 1:30 Location: Clubhouse

Get Your Dog Trial Ready – Learn what your dog needs to be comfortable searching in novel locations and under time pressure. **Location: Office**

Starting on Vehicles – An introduction to starting on and searching vehicles. Location: Vehicle area

Scored Interior Search – A chance to do a practice Interior competition search and have your score explained. All searches will be blind. Single hide searches first, followed by unknown number, followed by two hides (your choice). **Location: Portables**

Designated Odour Test – A blind container search test to see if your dog will locate a designated odour. Certificate and ribbon provided to passing teams! **Location: Training Hall**

Attendees please note: Dogs must be on leash at all times on the Boot Camp property unless they are in a safe search area and the instructor has allowed off-leash training. Please be considerate of other working teams, give everyone space and do not visit or pet unknown dogs unless specifically invited to do so. As much accommodation as possible will be made for shy or reactive dogs in working sessions, however, with the number of ongoing sessions it may be difficult to have each dog working completely out of sight of other dogs. Assume several auditors will be present at any session.

Each session will have a limited number of working spots available. The number depends on the subject matter and the available time. Handlers will be allowed one dog per session (any dog). If a session has not filled by the closing date, we will contact registered attendees and offer space for a 2nd dog for \$10.

SPEAKER BIOS

Karin Apfel has been training and titling dogs for over 25 years in a wide variety of sports from Obedience to flyball and agility, dock diving and tracking. She now focuses almost exclusively on sporting detection training at various locations and working her own dogs in IPO. Her scent detection education includes teaching sessions with bed bug, police and military trainers in Canada and the US. Her speciality is helping low confidence or stressed dogs find joy and confidence in training. Karin is a founder and the President of the Sporting Detection Dogs Association (SDDA).

Paul Dyer is a former club member of River Valley Obedience and Field Trial Club (Fredericton, NB) titling to UD and TDX in obedience and tracking and for two years in a row campaigned the National Grand Victor GSD. Paul was an OPP dog handler and trained multiple dogs for cadaver searches, tracking and narcotics detection as well as obedience and protection. He is a member of the Canadian Police Canine Association and National Association of Professional Canine Handlers. Paul is an SDDA judge and Rule Book consultant.

Andrea Harrison is an educator who is passionate about all species, including dogs and humans. She has explored the science of brain research and worked with people of all ages on being successful and reducing anxiety and stress using her training in counselling, education, personality typing, and experiences. Andrea is active in dog and horse training (particularly scent work, agility, and dressage) and an instructor at the online Fenzi Dog Sport Academy.

Stacey Shaw is a Karen Pryor Certified Trainer and a founder and Treasurer for the SDDA. She has attended a wide variety of behavioural and detection courses and clinics and has competed and titled in several sports including flyball, Rally-Obedience and disc with a variety of breeds. She is currently training and competing in herding and sport detection and has conducted clinics on shaping for both dogs and horses.

Pando Stepanis is the co-owner of Olympus K9 Security & Investigations, responsible for training and deploying K9 teams in utility and detection work for narcotics, explosives and bed bugs. He has been a trainer and competitor for over 30 years in obedience, tracking and IPO with multiple titles achieved. He is a Council/Teaching Professor at George Brown College of Applied Arts — Policing and Security K9 Division plus co-professor for general behaviour, tracking, detection and aggression for the diploma programs; a K9 Training Advisor for the Orangeville Police Department Police K9 Team; member of the International Association of Bomb Technicians and Investigators; and a Master Trainer with National Association of Professional Canine Handlers, responsible for certifying police K9s in the fields of Patrol, General Purpose, Narcotic Detection and Explosive Detection. Pando is an SDDA judge and director.
