<u>Mr. David Miller</u> <u>All breeds (except Borzois and Salukis) and</u> <u>Junior Handling</u>

Mr. Miller has been a dog enthusiast all his life. From an early age, his parents raised various terriers. In the early seventies while residing in France, he fixed his sights upon the dogs that he has raised for over thirty-five years, Salukis. Under the prefix of Shandell, and coupled with the French Saluki kennel, Arab Bahari, he still occasionally breeds and shows. In addition, he has owned Afghans, Dalmatians and Italian Greyhounds.

In the mid-seventies and throughout the eighties, Mr. Miller showed not only his Salukis, but dogs in several breeds for clients. In 1988, he applied to the American Kennel Club and was approved to judge Salukis. Since then, he is approved for the Hound Group, Non-Sporting Group, and the Sporting Group, Norfolk, Norwich Terriers, Italian Greyhounds, Pugs, Toy Poodles and Pyrenean Shepherd. He has held many offices in the Grand River Kennel Club, currently Treasurer, and is the show chairperson for their cluster weekend – The Regatta Classic. Moreover, he is the Vice-President of the Cuyahoga Valley Hound Association.

Mr. Miller has officiated in the United States, Canada, Columbia, France, Germany, Belgium, Italy, Sweden, Finland, Estonia, Hungary, Romania, Russia, Australia, China and South Korea. He is published in both English and French in professional periodicals as well as dog publications. Moreover, he has given seminars on the Saluki. He travels frequently to North Africa due to his association with Sighthounds and conducts tours of Marrakech, Morocco and its surroundings. As an avid traveler, he has visited many kennels in India.

Professionally, Mr. Miller is the department coordinator of World Languages for a school system in the Cleveland, Ohio metropolitan area. He has also instructed on the university undergraduate and graduate levels. Furthermore, he has been a former member of the Advisory Board of the Montreux School of Business, Montreux, Switzerland. He holds a Master's Degree in Education with a specialization in French as well as a Certificat Du Premier Degré from the Université De Strasbourg, France. He is a translator and has conferred on projects for officials at the United Nations as well as the French government in relation to indigenous canine breeds of the Sahara. At the World Dog Show in Paris 2011, he served as a translator for the Poodle World Congress.

In his spare time, he is an amateur photographer whose work has been published internationally. Mr. Miller speaks French, German, Italian and English.

Since 1969, under the Savladai prefix, I have bred 20 litters of Borzoi, many of which ranked in the top three Borzoi in Canada with limited showing. Of those I've finished in the US, most won three or more majors. Over the years, Savladai Borzoi have taken Best BBE, Best Stud Dog and Best Brood Bitch at BCOA nationals and most recently, an Award of Merit from the Veteran Bitch 10 and older class (she was a week short of 12 at the time). I am thrilled to count among my provisional assignments for judging approval in the US the 2008 Borzoi Club of Greater New York specialty, the 2011 Rocky Mountain Borzoi Club specialty, a supported entry and a hound specialty in Washington State plus the Fall 2010 Del Valle show in California. I've also judged

many sighthounds in Canada over the years, both in specialty sweepstakes and in all-breed sweeps and matches. CONFORMATION CLASSIFICATIONS

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

Junior Puppy Senior Puppy	6 months and under 9 months on the day of the show. 9 months and under 12 months on the day of the show.
12-18 Months	12 months and under 18 months on the day of the show.
Canadian Bred	For dogs born in Canada, champions in any country excluded.
Bred by Exhibitor	For dogs owned and handled in the ring by the Breeder.
Open Veterans	All dogs. For all dogs 7 years of age or over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class DO NOT COMPETE FOR POINTS but rather the winner of the Veteran Male and Veteran Female class goes on to the Best of Breed competition. (Spayed or neutered dogs may compete in this class).
Specials Only	Dogs of either sex individually registered with the CKC, possessing an ERN number, who have earned all points required for the Championship status at the time of the close of entries. Entry of a "listed" dog is not permitted in Specials Only. (<i>The request to move a class dog to Specials Only must be made at least one hour prior to the start of the show</i>).
Exhibition Only	All dogs entered in this class will be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class <u>may not compete</u> in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY.

THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL NON-REGULAR CKC CLASSES WILL BE OFFERED BY WESTERN GAZEHOUND CLUB:

Any dog entered in a non-regular class <u>must</u> also be entered in a regular class or for Exhibition Only, except for Get and Progeny which MUST be entered in a Regular Class. Spayed/neutered dogs may be entered but must also be entered in a regular class (as specified in the Dog Show Rules) or for Exhibition Only.

Sweepstake Rules Yearling Sweepstake

Eligibility:

- 1. All puppies within each Specialty, 6 months of age but under 18 months of age on the day of the show, shall be eligible to compete, regardless of place of birth. Altered dogs may not compete.
- 2. All dogs entered must also be entered in one of the official breed classes in the Specialty.
- 3. Professional handlers are permitted to handle **ONLY** dogs which they have bred or co-bred, own or co-own.

Classification: For the purpose of judging, the dogs will be divided by sex into the following classes:

6 months and under 9 months 9 months and under 12 months 12 months and under 18 months

For final judging the First Place dog from each class above will be brought together for the final placings of "Best in Sweepstake" and "Runner-Up in Sweepstake."

Veterans Sweepstake

Eligibility:

This competition is open to all Gazehounds age 7 years of age and older. All dogs must be entered in one of the regular Breed classes or for Exhibition Only. Spayed or neutered dogs may compete provided they are also entered in the official Veterans class or for Exhibition Only.

Classification: The Sweepstake Classes are divided by sex and offered as follows:

7 years of age and under 10 years of age10 years of age and under 12 12 years of age and over For final judging the First Place dog from each class above will be brought together for the final placing of "Best in Veterans Sweepstake" and "Runner-Up in Veterans Sweepstake."

Prize List:

For both Sweepstakes, there will be a rosette for First place in each class, and flat ribbons for 2nd through 4th. Best in Sweepstake, and Best in Veteran Sweepstakes will receive a Rosette and 50% of the entry. Runner-Up in Sweepstake and Runner-Up in Veterans Sweepstake will receive a Rosette and 25% of the entry. The Club will retain 25% of the entry fees for expenses.

HAVE YOUR DOG READY; JUDGING WILL NOT BE HELD UP WAITING FOR EXHIBITORS.

Western Gazehound Club is offering an award for -

Best Canadian Bred in Specialty, Best Bred By Exhibitor in Specialty and Best Veteran in Specialty

As the rules for these awards are at the discretion of the Club, they have specified how the awards will be given at these shows. Dogs eligible for the Canadian Bred in Specialty award will be identified by way of their country of birth as shown on the entry form. Dogs eligible for the Veteran in Specialty award will be identified by way of their date of birth as shown on the entry form. For those wishing to compete for the Bred by Exhibitor in Specialty award, you must identify on the entry form whether the dog will be eligible to compete based on these rules. Dogs entered in these classes must also be entered in one of the regular classes in the show. The rules for these three awards are listed below.

General Rules that apply to all of the above awards:

Should the Best in Specialty winner be Canadian Bred, Bred by the Exhibitor, or a Veteran, that dog shall automatically be awarded the ribbon. The dog awarded Best of Opposite Sex is considered to have defeated all dogs entered of that sex. If the dog awarded Best in Specialty is not Canadian Bred. Bred by Exhibitor or a Veteran, then all other Canadian Bred. Bred by Exhibitor or Veteran dogs entered as Specials, including the Veteran Male and Veteran Female are eligible to compete. The dog awarded Best of Winners is considered to have defeated all class dogs. If either the Winners Male or Winners Female is Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor or a Veteran, they shall be deemed to have defeated all other Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor or Veteran Class dogs. If either or both of these dogs are not Canadian Bred, Bred By Exhibitor, or a Veteran dog, then all Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor or Veteran dogs winning First in Class are eligible to compete. If any First Place Class winner is not Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor or a Veteran, then the Second Place, Third Place, or Fourth Place dog will be eligible, based on their qualification. On completion of the awarding of Best in Specialty, all eligible dogs for the Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor or Veteran Award will return to the ring to be judged. Those dogs that were awarded Best Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor or Veteran in Breed will compete for Best Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor or Veteran in Specialty, unless the dog awarded Best in Specialty also was awarded Best Canadian Bred, Bred by Exhibitor or Veteran in Breed.

Eligibility to compete in Canadian Bred in Breed or Specialty - the dog must have been bred in Canada.

Eligibility to compete in Bred By Exhibitor in Breed or Specialty – Only dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder for all competition are eligible for this award. Exhibitors are required to mark the entry form as to whether their dog(s) will be eligible to compete for this award if offered by the Club.

Eligibility to compete for Veteran in Breed or Specialty - the dog must be at least seven (7) years of age on the date of the show as identified by the date of birth shown on the entry form.

* * CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS * * *

SECTION #1. A dog awarded WINNERS at a Championship show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5), and the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder.

SECTION #2. Schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: DOGS COMPETING* 1 2 3 to 5 6 to 9 10 to 12 13 or more

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points to be credited a dog awarded Winners, total all dogs in competition which were defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite and then consult the schedule set forth above. The point system provides for additional points if a class dog, awarded Best of Breed, also places in the Group as listed below:

Best of Breed

A dog may not be credited with more than 5 championship points at a single show. In order for a dog to be recognized as a Canadian Champion it must: (1) earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and (2) must have earned at least one 2-point win either at breed or group level; and (3) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ER No.).

SAFETY NOTICE

This is an outdoor show and there are no provisions for cover in the event of inclement weather. The show will be conducted outdoors rain or shine. Since this time of the year can also see very warm weather, exhibitors, owners and handlers should take necessary precautions to protect their dogs from the heat. The use of shade tents is recommended. Please ensure you have sufficient water available to your dog at all times.

Your dogs will be welcome at the accommodations listed below. Please leave the rooms and grounds in such condition that this will be true again next year. Motels and hotels in Kamloops fill up very early for the Labour Day weekend, SO BOOK EARLY!

Be sure to mention you are with the dog show.

Rules Governing This Show:

The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of this show which will be governed by CKC Rules.

Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or Veterinarian for any reason shall not compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.

Dogs must be on the grounds one hour prior to the judging of their breed. The owner of a dog entered in the show is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.

Dogs must be on leash at all times on the show grounds. Crates will be allowed at ringside but are to be kept 15 feet from ringside.

The Club asks that you pick up after your dog.

Use of the buildings and their facilities is a privilege; please be considerate. The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you as the exhibitor will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the day of the show, so as not to affect the enjoyment and safety of the other exhibitors and spectators.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property.

The Club reserves the right to refuse an individual's entries, for just cause, and to ask a person to remove themselves from the precincts of the show.

There will be no delays in the show program waiting for dogs.

The Club and the Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of an accident or misfortune to either the dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

All owners/operators of recreational units using the parking area must ensure that there is no discharge of any kind from their waste holding tanks. Anyone found discharging water on the grounds will be removed by order of the Health Department, and may be subject to a fine.

If, because of civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the Club, it is impossible to open or complete the shows, no refund of entries will be made.

CONFORMATION SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

These shows are conducted under the Canadian Kennel Club Conformation Show Rules and Regulations that are in effect on the date of the shows. It is the responsibility of every person who enters or exhibits at these shows to obtain a copy of these Rules and Regulations and to make themselves familiar with them. The Dog Show Rules for Conformation are available from the Canadian Kennel Club, #400 – 200 Ronson Drive, Etobicoke, Ontario, M9W 5Z9 at a cost of \$6.00, plus \$3.50 Shipping and Handling, plus \$.48 GST.

Event Registration Number

For the sole purpose of entering CKC events to acquire CKC titles and degrees, foreign born, foreign owned dogs may apply for an ERN — Event Registration Number. This number must be obtained within 30 days of the first show entered to avoid cancellation of the points or legs earned and can be obtained by submitting a copy of your foreign certificate of registration along with a fee and a letter of request to the CKC. This ERN replaces an individual CKC registration number or MCN — Miscellaneous Certification Number for Trial entering purposes only. For breeding purposes, the individual CKC registration number must still be obtained.

Personal Identification and Dog's Rabies Certificates

Canadian Government regulations require that a dog entering into Canada must have a valid Rabies Certificate. The Rabies Certificate must be dated 30 days prior to be valid for re-entry into the United States. When entering into Canada, all persons must present proper photo identification and/or a valid passport to Canada Customs and Immigration at the border crossing, or airport terminal.
