12.2 Classes

12.2.1 Regular official classes at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in (a) to (k) of this section. All classes must be divided by sex (except for Specials Only). Only dogs entered in one of the regular, non-regular, or unofficial classes shall be allowed within the show precincts.

(a) Junior Puppy Class

Dogs 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show.

(b) Senior Puppy Class

Dogs 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show.

(c) 12-18 Month Class (All-Breed Shows)

Dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

(e) Canadian Bred Class Dogs born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded.

(f) Bred By Exhibitor Class

Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner and breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/ breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards. Should the owner/ breeder be unable to handle the dog in this class, the dog may be moved to the Open Class (at least one hour prior to the judging of the breed in question.

Conformation

Regular

(g) The Open Class

All dogs. Dogs may be divided by colour if permission of the CKC is obtained.

(j) Specials Only

Classes

- (i) Dogs which have a recorded CKC registration, Event Registration Number (ERN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and have attained the required points for Championship status. All awards earned at the show will be cancelled if it is found that a dog is not registered or has not completed the requirements for a CKC Championship. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible. After awarding Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best of Winners in each breed, the judge may choose a Select Dog and Select Bitch if there are dogs in the ring eligible for these awards. The Select Dog and Bitch must be awarded in the Specials Only class. The dog and bitch selected must be champions and cannot be the Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex Winners.
- (ii) A dog entered in Specials Only shall be identified by gender in the judge's book and if incorrectly entered and substantiated by the show secretary or superintendent, shall be excused from the ring by the judge.

Miniature Dachshund - Foreign Born

If still under one year of age, a foreign-born Miniature Dachshund is eligible to enter the Specials Only class after completing the requirement for a CKC championship provided the application for registration is received by the CKC within 30 days of the dog reaching one year of age. Failure to do so will result in automatic cancellation of all points on record.

12.6 Non-Regular Classes

12.6.1 The non-regular classes allowed at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in this section. If offered, these classes must be included in the premium list. A dog entered in the Brace or Team class that is spayed/neutered must be entered in an Altered Class or in Exhibition Only.

Non-regular

(a) Baby Puppy Class

Dogs 3 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are:

Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed

Best Baby Puppy in Group

Conformation

Best Baby Puppy in Show

(e) Order of Judging

When any or all of the above described non-regular classes are offered, and including Altered Classes as described in Section 13, these classes will be judged after Best Puppy in Breed, after Best Puppy in Group and before Best In Show, in the following order: Baby Puppy, Veterans, Altered, Brace, Team, Exhibition Only (g) Exhibition Only

Classes

All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competitions. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades if provided for in the premium list.

4.1 Conformation Class Structure

4.1.1 Classes in Junior Conformation Handling competition shall be divided by age as follows:

(a) Pee Wee Class

This class is for handlers 4 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 7th birthday. This class is optional and non-competitive. No placements are to be awarded; only participant ribbons, rosettes and token trophies may be presented.

(b) Junior Novice Class

This class is for handlers 7 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 11th birthday who have not won 6 first places in the same class with competition.

(c) Junior Open Class

This class is for handlers 7 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 11th birthday who have not won 6 first places with competition.

(d) Intermediate Novice Class

This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have not won 6 first places in the same class with competition.

Handling

Junior

(e) Intermediate Open Class

This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have not won 6 first places with competition and for any handler who has progressed through the Junior Open level and feels that he has enough experience to compete at this level.

Classes

(f) Senior Novice Class

This class is for handlers 15 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 18th birthday who have not won 6 first places with competition in this class. Handlers from the Intermediate levels progress to this class.


(g) Senior Open Class

This class is for handlers 15 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 18th birthday who have not won 6 first places with competition in the Senior Novice Class, and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that he has enough experience to compete at this level.

4.1.2 Method of moving between classes shall be as follows:

- (a) If a handler achieves 6 first place wins with competition, he must move to the Open Class within his age group.
- (b) Points are to be carried forward from one level to the next.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

15.1 Championship Points

15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows;

*Dogs Competing 1 2 3 to 5 6 to 9 10 to 12 13 & more Points Allocated 0 1 2 3 4 5

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

- 15.1.3 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Breed at the show, then all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.4 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.5 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.6 If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.
- 15.1.7 The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

Clarification:

Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the Group level.

- 15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.
- 15.1.10 Permission shall be granted a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a Specialty for that breed or group.
- 15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners which also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.
- 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must: (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 different judges and,
- (b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN), or have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).
- (c) have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.
- 15.1.13 The Board interprets the words "earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges" to mean:
- (a) 3 or more Winners awards at not less than 3 different shows, under 3 different judges at the breed level;
- (b) each of the 3 Judge's awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing;
- (c) all points required for championship status may be earned at winners, best of winners, best of breed or group placing.

15.2 Grand Champion (GCh)

- 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation Championship.
- 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation Championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.
- 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- a) Grand Champion Point System

Points awarded beyond breed level shall be:

Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level:

*b) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

15.2.4 The title of Grand Champion shall not be awarded retroactively and all points towards this title must be achieved after the date of January 1, 2013.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)

- 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may only be earned after the completion of the CKC grand championship title.
- 15.3.2 Points for this title may be accumulated at any time after the completion of the CKC grand championship but does not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship or the grand championship.

15.3.3 A minimum of 100 points which must include one (A) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of ten dogs have competed) or a Best in Multiple-Breed Specialty with at least three breeds represented plus three (3) Group 1sts or three (3) breed Specialty wins.

Excellent

15.3.4 Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. For example, a dog that wins first in group and then wins Best in Show, earns 10 points, not 15.

15.3.5 The title of Grand Champion Excellent shall not be awarded retroactively. However, dogs that have been awarded the Grand Champion title prior to January 1, 2013, will be awarded the Grand Champion Excellent Title on application to the CKC. 15.3.6 Additional Requirements

To attain a Grand Champion Excellent title, a dog must have been awarded a CKC performance title from any CKC event. A CGN, Herding Tested Certificate, or Chase Ability Program title are not considered performance titles for the awarding of this title.

8.2 Entry Forms

- 8.2.1 An official CKC entry form must be completed in full and signed by the owner or authorized agent. Failure to do so may result in the cancellation of all wins
- 8.2.2 A show-giving club must reject an incomplete entry form and return it immediately to the sender.
- 8.2.3 Entry forms received by the CKC, which are incomplete and/or contain incorrect information may result in awards being cancelled.
- 8.2.5 An error in an age specified class, date of birth, or sex, may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

8.3 Entries

- 8.3.1 Every dog entered in a conformation show must be one of the following:
- (a) registered with the CKC,
- (b) have an Event Registration Number,
- (c) eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- (d) with the exception of baby puppy, if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN)
- 8.3.2 No person shall enter a dog in a Championship Show which is known to be blind (in one or both eyes), deaf, castrated or spayed or which has had its appearance changed by artificial or surgical means other than those recognized by the standard for its breed.

8.4 Listed Dogs

- 8.4.1 If a dog is not registered as in 8.3.1 (a) or (b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC, it may be entered at a show as a listed dog provided:
- (a) that if born in Canada, it is eligible for individual registration;
- (b) that if not born in Canada, it is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC;
- (c) that if it is a foreign born and owned dog, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.
- 8.4.2 Entry of a listed dog at a show must be accompanied by a listing fee as set by the Board in addition to the regular entry fee.
- 8.4.4 When a CKC registration number for a listed dog is received after the closing date and prior to the date of the show, this number may be added to the entry and noted in the marked catalogue. Listing fees will not be refunded. This then allows a dog who completes the requirement for championship status to be moved up to Specials.

Entries

8.5 Acceptance of Entries

- 8.5.1 If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.
- 8.5.2 Telephone and telegraph entries are prohibited except as provided by the Board in the event of a postal disruption.
- 8.5.3 No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for purebred dogs.
- 8.5.4 After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in the case of a postal strike.
- 8.5.7 No entries may be changed or altered after the close of entries with the exception as stated in section 8.2.5.
- 8.5.8 In case of a judge change (substitute or overload), an exhibitor may enter a dog under the replacement judge providing that the dog is entered in one of the regular classes of a show being held at the same venue by the same club and has been assigned a competition number. A new entry, along with accompanying fees, will be accepted by the Show Secretary up to one hour prior to the start of the show (see sections 3.3.1, 3.5.1 and 8.5.4).

8.6 Refusal of Entries

- 8.6.1 The authorities of any show may:
 - (a) decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or
 - (b) refuse to receive, or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness. A club declining an entry or ordering the removal of a dog from its show must report, in writing, all such matters to the CKC with a full explanation and/or reason within 14 days after its show has been held;
 - (c) in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.
- 8.6.2 A club may refuse an entry from an exhibitor known to have tendered a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card unless entries are accompanied by cash, money order or certified cheque.
- 8.6.3 No one shall have any claim or recourse against the club holding the show or any official connected therewith for the refusal of an entry for just cause.

8.7 Withdrawal of Entries

Withdrawal

8.7.1 An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry at any time up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone, but either written or electronic notification must be received by the show secretary no later than the official closing date and time as stated in the premium list. If written or electronic notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the show.

8.9 Moving a Dog to Specials

8.9.1 A dog that is registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one hour prior to the opening of the show.

Move Ups

- 8.9.2 If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the championship requirements, all awards will be cancelled and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.
- 8.9.3 When one or more all-breed and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to specials must be made a minimum of one hour prior to the scheduled start of the show for which the dog is being moved up to. The Show Secretary shall amend the judge's book and the marked catalogue, which is to be sent to the CKC with the requests attached to the appropriate entry forms.
- 8.9.4 No dog may be transferred to another class except as provided in sections 8.2.5 and 8.9.1

4.7 Indignities to a Judge

4.7.1 A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

11 UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

- 11.1 It shall be deemed unsportsmanlike conduct if a person during the running of or in connection with an event abuses or harasses a judge, show official or any other person present in any capacity at the event.
- 11.2 Any handler who displays unsportsmanlike conduct or who is seen to kick, strike or otherwise roughly manhandle a dog at any time during the holding of the event, may be expelled from the show by the Conformation Show Committee.
- 11.3 The judges shall also have the authority to expel a handler from a show if they observe unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of the handler or see the handler kicking, striking or otherwise roughly manhandling a dog while the event is in progress. It will be the duty of the judge to report promptly to the Conformation Show Committee the expulsion of a handler.

Conduct

11.4 The Conformation Show Committee shall investigate, at once, any instance of alleged unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of the handler, or any report that a handler has been observed kicking, striking or otherwise roughly manhandling a dog. If the Conformation Show Committee, after investigation, determines that a handler is in violation of this section, and that the incident, if proven, would constitute conduct prejudicial to the sport or the CKC, it shall exercise its authority in accordance with the Complaints section of these rules.

12.4 Failure to Compete

- 12.4.1 Except for Puppy in Group or Show, an owner or handler shall be subject to disciplinary action for withholding a dog from competing for higher awards for which that dog is eligible. Any dog so withheld or absent will result in the cancellation of all awards won at that show (unless the dog is excused by the Show Superintendent).
- 12.4.2 Should a dog be marked absent in an official class, it may still compete in an unofficial or non-regular class at the same show

Attention Foreign Exhibitors

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted.

Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor.

Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks.

To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds.


OBEDIENCE UPDATE

Class descriptions: See Classes Page 9

12.12 Change of Positions

12.12.1 The principal features of this exercise are that the dog stays where left, responds correctly to each position change as indicated by the judge on one command and/or signal and remains in the final position until the handler has returned to heel position

12.12.2 The judge will choose one of the following six sequences (except in the Open 18A class where only sequence (a) will be used) with the first position being performed in heel position before the handler leaves the dog.



12.12.3 The orders for this exercise are "Stand (or Down) your dog" (according to the sequence to be performed), "Leave your dog," "Back to your dog" and "Exercise finished."

(f) Stand - Down - Stand - Sit

12.12.4 The handler shall stand where indicated by the judge, which shall be about 1.8m (6 ft) behind a clearly marked line, with the dog sitting in heel position. On the judge's orders, the handler will give the first position command and/or signal. On further order, the handler will give the command and/or signal to stay, walk straight forward about 3 m (10 ft) beyond the line, and turn to face the dog, standing with hands and arms hanging naturally at the sides. On specific signals from the judge, the handler shall command and/or signal the dog to assume the position ordered. Finally, the judge will order the handler to return by walking around behind the dog to heel position.

12.12.5 The dog should remain in the last position until the judge orders "Exercise finished."

12.12.6 No dog shall qualify that fails to change position correctly after a single command and/or signal, hold that position until the next command and/ or signal, remain in the final position until the handler has returned to heel position or steps over the 1.8 m (6 ft) line at any time.

12.12.7 Substantial or minor deductions, depending on the circumstances, shall be given for a dog that makes minor moves from the position commanded at any time or is slow to respond.

12.14 Group Sit - Walk Around Exercise

12.14.1 The principal features and deductions are the same as for the Novice Group Sit exercise.

12.14.2 The orders for the Group Sit - Walk Around exercise are: "Sit your dogs," "Leave your dogs," "Walk around your dogs," "Back to your dogs," "Exercise finished. Put your leashes on your dogs. Maintain control of your dogs."

12.14.3 The exercise shall be performed in the same manner as the Group Sit in the Novice classes, except that one minute after giving the order to "Leave your dogs," the judge will order "Walk around your dogs." The handlers will then promptly walk back to their dogs, walking around behind their own dog and passing through heel position, without pausing or giving another signal or command, then continue across the ring again, and turn to face their dog. Three minutes after giving the order "Leave your dogs," the judge will order the handlers to return.

12.14.4 No dog shall qualify if the handler gives an additional command or signal at any time after leaving the dog and before the exercise is finished

12.14.5 A substantial or minor deduction, depending on the circumstances, shall be given to a handler that hesitates or pauses at any time while walking around his dog.

Please refer to the 2018 Rule Book for more information including changes to 18B routines on page 47 & 48.

Rally Master Class Notes

Class Description Page 9

8.1.2 Judging Standard.

- 8.1.2 Scoring is not as rigorous as in traditional obedience except in the Master class, where the scoring will be as in traditional obedience.
- 8.1.3 While except for the Master class, rally is not judged with the same precision as formal obedience, rally judges must make decisions based on a mental picture of the theoretically perfect performance within the framework of the rally regulations.
- 8.4.1 To qualify, a dog-and-handler team must receive at least 70 points out of a maximum score of 100 and in the Master class must receive at least 85 points out of a maximum score of 100 and meet all other requirements for qualifying as specified in the rules.
- 8.4.3 There shall be no 1/2-point penalties in rally, except in the Master class where 1/2-point penalties may also be used.

8.11 Scoring changes

- dog moving feet in the Stand Stay
- patting legs, clapping hands or snapping fingers
- in the Master class, additional commands and/or signals on any exercise

Substantial deduction (10 points) for each of the following:

incorrectly performed station

in Master class, a verbal command given where a signal only is required

- 8.12.3 A team that exceeds 4.00 minutes on any course must be excused by the judge at that time.
- 8.14.1 Unlimited communication from the handler to the dog is to be encouraged and not penalized. Unless otherwise specified in these regulations, handlers may encourage their dogs with verbal praise and petting except in the Master class where it is only allowed immediately following the completion of a station.
- 8.15.1 While praise, encouragement and petting are allowed throughout a course, dogs should remain under control. In the Master class, praise, encouragement and petting are only allowed immediately following the completion of a station.

13.2 Scoring

13.2 Three (3) qualifying scores of 85 points or more must be earned under at least two (2) different judges to earn title.

13.3 Stand Stay Exercise

- 13.3.1 A Stand Stay exercise must be included in the Rally Master class.
- 13.3.2 The Stand Stay will be conducted the same as the Sit Stay exercise except the dog will be required to stand.

13.4 Send to Jump

13.4.1 The sign for this station (Sign #312) will be placed at least 3.05 m (10 ft) before the jump. The sign for this station and the one after it will be set so that the handler maintains at least a three-foot path away from the jump while the dog performs the jump and returns to the handler.

Note: After sending the dog to the jump, the handler may pause as needed, but must not pass the jump until the dog has returned to the heel position.

Additional

In the Master class, if both command and signal are given, they must be given at the same time.

In the Master class, only one command and/or signal should be used any time a command is required (i.e., change of position, direction or action within a station) or just one signal where signal only is allowed. Brief praise after the completion of each station is allowed, but the dog must remain under control.

The Master class is performed off leash using exercises 1-398. It consists of 16-20 exercises (not including Start, Finish, Call or Stand Stay), a minimum of six and a maximum of nine stationary exercises and requires two jumps (not consecutive).

One retry per station is allowed in Novice; one retry per course in Intermediate and Advanced; no retries are allowed in Excellent and Master.

9.1 Pre Novice

- 9.1.1 The Pre-Novice Class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice Classes.
- 9.1.2 The Pre-Novice Class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of P.C.D.
- 9.1.3 Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.
- 9.1.4 A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
- 9.1.5 The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercise.
- 9.1.6 Only dogs that have not earned the title of C.D. may enter the Pre-Novice class.

10.1 Novice A

- 10.1.1 The Novice A Class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of C.D.
- 10.1.2. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises.
- 10.1.3. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families, and must be eligible to handle under section 10.1.4.
- 10.1.4. No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a C.D.X. title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.
- 10.1.5 When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.

10.2 Novice B

10.2.1 The Novice B Class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of C.D.

10.2.2. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.

10.2.3 A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

Obedience

Official

10.2.4 The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises

10.2.5 No dog may be entered in both the Novice A and Novice B Class at any one trial.

Novice

10.3 Novice C

- 10.3.1 The Novice C Class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title C.D. or any higher obedience titles.
- 10.3.2 Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.

Classes

- 10.3.3 A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
- 10.3.4 The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises.
- 10.3.5 Dogs may compete in the Novice C class indefinitely.
- 10.3.6 Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice C Class are not eligible for High In Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title.

11.1 Novice Intermediate

- 11.1.1 The Novice Intermediate Class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter the Open Classes.
- 11.1.2 The Novice Intermediate Class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a C.D. or any higher obedience trial titles.
- 11.1.3 Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.
- 11.1.4 A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
- 11.1.5 The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises.
- 11.1.6 Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely.
- 11.1.7 Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial.
- 11.1.8 Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate Class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

- 13.2.3 Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.
- 13.2.4 No dog may be entered in both the Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial.

Classes

13.2.5 Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

Entries close Midnight Monday May 7 2018

16.1 Unofficial Classes

16.1.1 All dogs entered in the Unofficial Classes must be entered in one of the Official Classes or Exhibition Only.

16.2 Graduate Novice Class

- 16.2.1 The Graduate Novice Class is open to any dog that has not earned a qualifying score toward the C.D.X. title, but has obtained the title of C.D prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered.
- 16.2.2 The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class.
- 16.2.3 A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
- 16.2.4 The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises.
- 16.2.5 The Graduate Novice Heel on Leash and Stand for Examination Exercises shall be performed and judged as in the official Novice Class. All other exercises shall be performed and judged as in the official Open Class.

16.3 Graduate Open Class

- 16.3.1 The Graduate Open Class is open to any dog that has not earned a qualifying score toward the U.D. title, but which has obtained the title of C.D.X. prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered.
- 16.3.2 The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class.
- 16.3.3 A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
- 16.3.4 The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Long Sit.

16.5 Wild Card Classes

16.5.1. No title is required for entry in any Wild Card class, but any dog entered must be capable of performing the exercises required at the class level in which it is entered.

Unofficial

- 16.5.2 The owner or any other person may handle dogs in these classes.
- 16.5.3 A person may enter more than one dog in any of these classes.
- 16.5.4 Handlers may use verbal encouragement and praise during exercises in these classes without penalty. Handlers may also use additional commands, but will be penalized accordingly.

Obedience

Classes

16.5.5 The Wild Card option: A handler may choose to perform all exercises in a class, in which case all will be scored, or a handler may choose to skip one exercise and receive full credit for that exercise. The handler must inform the judge which exercise will be skipped before beginning the exercises. If an exercise is chosen to be skipped, it may not be performed. (E.g., a handler may choose to omit the Stand for Examination in Novice, the Long Down in Open, or the Directed Jumping in Utility, and receive a perfect score for the exercise.)

- 16.5.6 Wild Card Novice Class. Any dog that is capable of performing the Novice class exercises may be entered in the Wild Card Open class, which will be performed and judged as the regular Open A class.
- 16.5.7 Wild Card Open Class. Any dog that is capable of performing the Open Class exercises may be entered in the Wild Card Open Class, which will be performed and judged as the regular Open A Class.
- 16.5.8 Wild Card Utility Class. Any dog that is capable of performing the Utility Class exercises may be entered in the Wild Card Utility Class, which will be performed and judged as the regular Utility A Class. Handlers are permitted to encourage and praise their dogs verbally during the performance of all Utility exercises except the signal exercise.

16.8 Veterans Class

- 16.8.1 The Veterans Class shall be for any dog that has earned the title of C.D. or higher and is 7 years old or older on the day of the trial.
- 16.8.2 The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice Classes.
- 16.8.3 The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class.
- 16.8.4 A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
- 16.8.5 The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises.

Additional Note: For Veterans at this trial, 1 point is awarded for each year over 7 years of age in class.

9.1 Rally Novice A

- 9.1.1 Dogs competing in this class may not have earned the R. N. title or any Obedience title other than P.C.D.. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
- 9.1.2 No dog may be entered in both Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

9.2 Rally Novice B

9.2.1 Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

10.1 Rally Intermediate

- 10.1.1 The Rally Intermediate Class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Rally Advanced Classes.
- 10.1.2 This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.I. or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

11.1 Rally Advanced A

- 11.1.1 This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R. N. title but have not earned the R. A. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D.. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
- 11.1.2 No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

11.2 Rally Advanced B

11.2.1 This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.A. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

12.1 Rally Excellent A

12.2 Rally Excellent B

12.1.1 This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R. A. title, but have not earned the R. E. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D.. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

12.1.2 No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial.

Classes

Official

Rally

12.2.1 This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.A. title. A dog completing the R.E. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

13.1 Rally Master

131. This class will be for dogs that have earned the RE title. A dog completing the RM title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

14 Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE)

- 14.1 Upon completion of the Rally Excellent title, qualifying scores may be accumulated from the Rally Advanced B Class and the Rally Excellent B Class to earn the Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE) title.
- 14.2 In order to receive the RAE title, a dog must qualify 10 times in both the Rally Advanced B Class and the Rally Excellent B Class at the same trial. The RAE title will appear at the end of the dog's name and a numeric designation will indicate the number of times the dog has met RAE requirements, i.e. RAE2, RAE3, etc.

15 Rally Master Excellent (RMX)

- 15.1 Upon completion of the Rally Master title, qualifying scores may be accumulated from the Rally Excellent B Class and the Rally Master Class to earn the Rally Master Excellent (RMX) title.
- 15 In order to receive the RMX title, a dog must qualify 10 times in both the Rally Excellent B Class and the Rally Master Class at the same trial with scores of 90 or higher in Excellent and 85 or higher in Master. Double qualifying score must be earned under at least five different judges. The RMX title will appear at the end of the dog's name and a numeric designation will indicate the number of times the dog has met RMX requirements i.e., RMX2, RMX3, etc.

3.6 Indignities to a Judge

3.6.1 A judge officiating at a trial held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the trial. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the trial to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

4.4 Limited Entries

- 4.4. If indications point to a probable entry in any or all classes in excess of the club's capabilities, it may limit entries in any or all classes by prominent announcement on the title cover page of its premium list, or immediately under the obedience and/or rally heading in the premium list of a combined conformation show and obedience and/or rally trial, that entries in such class, classes or trial, will close automatically when a certain limit has been reached, even if the official closing date for entries has not arrived.
- 4.4.2 When the advertised limit (if applicable) has been reached, all remaining entries may be assigned a position (by class) on the reserve list. The person making the entry shall be notified of his position on the list. In the event that the entry of a bitch in season is withdrawn after the closing date, it may be substituted with one from the reserve list up to and including the day of the trial. At the club's discretion, if the club is notified in writing after the closing date that an entry other than a bitch in season will be absent from a trial, the entry may be substituted with one from the reserve list up to 24 hours prior to the trial. Fees will not be refunded for any reason other than a bitch being in season and to those on the reserve list who did not participate in the trial. Entry fees will be refunded within 10 days following the trial for those on the reserve list who did not participate in the trial.

6.1 Entry Requirements

- 6.1.1 Every dog entered in an approved trial or sanctioned match must be one of the following:
- (a) Registered with the CKC
- (b) Have an Event Registration Number (ERN)
- (c) Have a Performance Event Number (PEN)
- (d) Eligible for registration with the CKC
- (e) Have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed
- (f) Have a Canine Companion Number (CCN)
- 6.1.3 If a dog is not registered individually in the records of the CKC, it may be entered at a trial held under these rules as a "listed" dog, provided that:
- (a) If born in Canada, it is eligible for individual CKC registration
- (b) If not born in Canada it is eligible for individual registration in the records of the CKC
- (c) If it is a foreign born and owned dog, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first trial entered
- (d) The entry of a listed dog at an obedience trial held under these rules (sanctioned matches excluded), must be accompanied by the appropriate listing fees. Breeds of dogs on the miscellaneous list may not be entered as a "listed dog," but must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN). Mixed breeds and unrecognized breeds also may not be entered as "listed" but must have a Canine Companion Number (CCN).

6.4 Dogs Must Compete

6.4.1 Any dog entered and received at a trial must compete in all exercises of all classes in which it is entered, unless excused by the judge, official veterinarian, superintendent, or the Trial Committee chair. If excused by the official veterinarian, the excuse must be in writing on the form provided and attached to the judge's book. If the dog is excused by either the superintendent or Trial Committee chair, a note to this effect must be written on the inside cover of the judge's book and the reason stated thereon.

6.5 Bitches In Season

- 6.5.1 Bitches in season are not permitted to compete. The judge of a trial must remove from competition any bitch in season, or any bitch which appears so attractive to males as to be a disturbing element.
- 6.5.2 When a bitch comes into season after entries have closed, the trial-giving club must refund the entry fee and listing fee providing the trial secretary receives, on or before the date of the trial, a veterinarian's certificate declaring that the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial.

6.1.6 Subject to the provisions stated in these rules, no dog may be entered in any class for which it is not eligible at the time entries for the trial close. The entry of a dog that is improperly entered in a class for which it is not eligible cannot be altered to another class after entries close except as provided in section 6.9.6.

6.9 Moving Up

- 6.9.1 A dog that is registered in the records of the CKC with an eligible number according to these rules and has fulfilled the requirements for a title in accordance with these rules may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the Trial Secretary by the owner or handler at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.
- 6.9.2 When move ups are permitted, clubs are exempt from the requirements of Section 4.3.4 and 4.3.5.
- 6.9.3 The Trial Secretary shall amend the judge's book and the marked catalogue, which is to be sent to the CKC with the requests attached to the appropriate entry forms.
- 6.9.4 If it is established by the CKC that a dog moved up to the next level has not completed the requirements for the lower level before moving up, then all qualifying ribbons and/or awards earned by the dog incorrectly entered shall be forfeited and cancelled by the CKC and the owner may be subject to disciplinary action.

6.9.5 In order for a dog to be eligible to move up, the dog must be individually registered with the CKC, have a Performance Event Number (PEN), or an Event Registration Number (ERN) before entries close. The addition of a CKC number after close of entries does not make the dog eligible and will result in referral to the Discipline Committee.

- 6.9.8 Exhibitors incorrectly entered in the A class are permitted to move the dog to the corresponding B or C class up to one hour before the start of the trial. Exhibitors incorrectly entered in the Novice B class are permitted to move the dog to the Novice C class up to one hour before the start of the trial.
- 6.9.7 Exhibitors entered in the Open H classes are permitted to move to the Open 18 classes and vice versa up to one hour before the start of the trial.
- 6.9.8 Exhibitors incorrectly entered in the Novice B class are permitted to move the dog to the Novice C class up to one hour before the start of the trial.

The club reserves the right to remove any person(s) from the show and the show grounds. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of these shows and trials, which are governed by CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB (CKC) rules.

Any person excused by the Show Superintendent or Veterinarian for any reason shall not, compete in any class for any awards for the balance of the shows, trials and or events.

The Show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

Exhibitors may be asked by the show superintendent for proof of third party liability insurance. Failure to produce may result in dismissal from the show grounds.

Dogs must be on the grounds 1 hour prior to the judging of their class.

The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.

Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and equipment left at the show grounds.

All recreational units will have buckets underneath for their sink drains. Any one found discharging water on the grounds will be removed by order of the Health Department, and may be subject to fine.

If, because of civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the club, it is impossible to open or complete the show, there is no refund of entry.

Dogs must be on leash at all times on the show grounds.

All dogs must be exercised in the area to indicated by the club. Dogs may not relieve themselves on or near any structures. Failure to observe this rule may result in dismissal.

Exhibitors are expected to maintain a clean area. Please be considerate when utilizing the building facilities. No dogs are permitted in the washrooms.

The welfare of any children is deemed to be the responsibility of the guardian or parent. Please exercise control and restraint over your child's behaviour.

The club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or vendors/concessions. Check for lost property at the club table. The club reserves the right to refuse an individuals entries, for just cause.

The club reserves the right of restricting exhibitors space.

Fire lanes in all areas will be maintained.

All exhibitors must follow direction by City of Kelowna personnel.

The precincts of these shows will be the all areas reserved for the sole use of the club at Mission Recreation Park.

All handlers if judging times for their dogs conflict.

Camping Rules

- Exhibitors must park in the designated spot assigned to them by the parking attendant IF EXHIBITORS WANT TO PARK TOGETHER, THEY MUST
 ARRIVE TOGETHER, IN UNITS OF SIMILAR SIZE. CLASS A TYPE MOTORHOMES WILL BE PARKED ON PAVEMENT IN OVERFLOW AREA.
- Check in time will start on Friday May 18 @ 12:00PM PLEASE DO NOT SHOW UP EARLIER. Camping fees are to be paid in advance or at the gate before entering. Cash only at the gate.
- Only self-contained recreation vehicles will be permitted. No parking or driving on grass areas.
- In accordance with the fire code, all camping units must have a parking space between them no parking RV units side by side allowed
- All Generators and Gas Cans MUST be placed in a compliant spill container tray. All PORTABLE generators MUST be grounded with proper grounding stakes.
- IN ORDER TO LIMIT DAMAGE TO THE GROUNDS, THERE WILL BE NO DRIVING IN AND OUT OF THE CAMPING AREA DAILY between the hours of 8am and the conclusion of the show ONCE YOUR VEHICLE IS OUT, IT IS OUT FOR THE DURATION OF THE SHOW.
- Washrooms are available between the hours of 6:00AM and 10:00PM. Portable toilets will also be available with 24 hour access in designated spots within the camping area.
- Shower facilities/dressing rooms will be available during regular operating hours at the Kinsmen Fieldhouse between the hours of 6:00AM and 10:00PM
- ABSOLUTELY NO dumping of grey or black waste water on any of the overnight parking sites.
