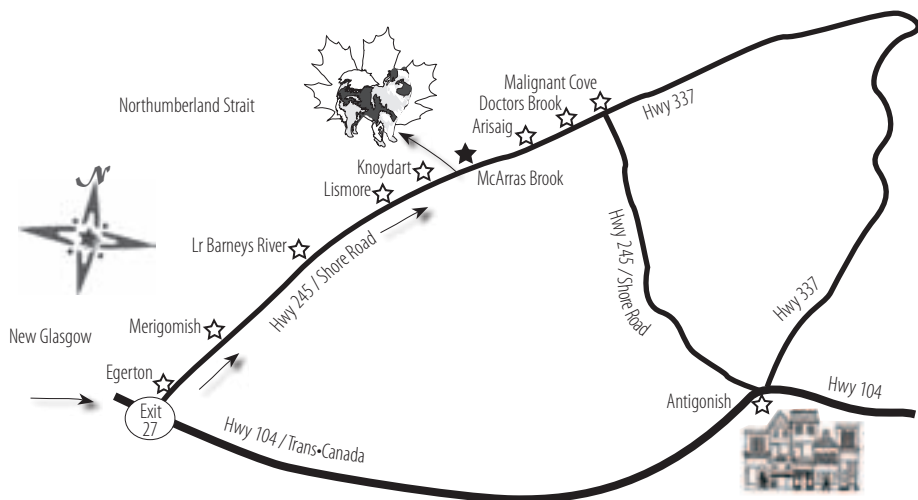


DIRECTIONS:

- From Halifax, take Highway 118 to Highway 102 North.
- Continue on Highway 102 North to Highway 104 East (Trans Canada Highway), right by Truro. *The remaining directions also work when coming from Truro and points west.*
- From Truro, go eastbound on Highway 104 for approximately 62 kilometres to Exit #27 (Highway 245). This exit is marked with a sign saying 'Egerton and Merigomish'.
- Turn left off Highway 104 onto Highway 245 (also called 'Shore Rd.').
- Continue eastbound on Highway 245 for approximately 25 kilometres, until you see a small green sign saying 'McArras Brook'.
- Once past that sign watch on the left for a house in the distance with a bright red roof and a barn with a blue roof, and a road marker indicating 6650. This is your destination.
- Turn left into the driveway.

JUDGES' BIO'S**Mike Lanctot**

Mike, along with his wife Pat, has been breeding Labrador Retrievers under the Ebonylane kennel name since 1974. They have over 100 champions, including the #1 Lab in both Canada and the US in 1984, and until 2005 held the record for the most "Best in Show" wins by a Labrador Retriever. Many Ebonylane Labrador Retrievers are in hunting homes and in the top ranks of obedience trial competition. Additionally, many more are seeing eye, drug detection as well as search and rescue dogs, and valued family companions.

Beyond breeding dogs which reflect their goals of type, temperament and trainability, Mike and Pat have been members of the Canadian Kennel Club since 1974. Additionally they were founding members of the Labrador Retriever Club of Canada and the Atlantic Labrador Retriever Club, and are associated with numerous other dog-oriented groups.

Mike has judged in Canada, the United States, Argentina, Holland, Australia and New Zealand.

Gisela Madaus

Gisela bred her first Eurasier litter in 1987 under the vom Traventhal kennel name. Her lines have had a significant impact in this relatively new breed. 21 litters resulting in 134 puppies in a breeding program focussing on temperament and health, have also yielded a nice list of European show champions. Closer to home a Canadian Eurasier, Ch. Starlette-Tatum vom Traventhal, won 10 Best of Breed and two each of Group first, third and fourth. For this rare breed, it is always a celebration to see one do so well in the Canadian Group ring.

In 1992 Gisela began the rigorous training program to become a Eurasier breed steward, receiving her certification in 1994. Further training and experience qualified her as a breed judge in 2000, and in 2007, she was authorized to conduct Eurasier breeding assessments for the breed club. She was in Canada in 2008 to help us evaluate our Eurasiers. In 2009 she also accepted responsibility to train and mentor new Eurasier judges.

**ENTERING
CANADA**

US exhibitors should note that passports are required to enter Canada, as well as a current rabies vaccination certificate for the dog(s), dated at least 30 days prior.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of this event, which will be governed by CKC Rules.
2. Identification cards and judging schedules will be mailed as soon as possible after the Closing Date.
3. The Eurasier Club of Canada will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortunes, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entry will be made.
5. Judging schedules are based on 20 - 25 dogs per hour in conformation judging. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to have the dog at ringside when the dog's class is scheduled for judging. Waiting for dogs will not be possible.
6. All exhibitors will be responsible for cleanup on the grounds and surrounding areas for their own dogs.
7. The precincts of the show will extend 10 feet beyond the ring & any space reserved for the judge & stewards.
8. It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. *(Dog Show Rules Sec. 4.7.1 & 19.7)*
9. No person may approach a judge, either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act. *(Dog Show Rules Sec. 4.1.5)*

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

A dog awarded WINNERS at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder. *(Dog Show Rules Sec. 15.1.1)*

The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: *(Dog Show Rules Sec. 15.1.2)*

Dogs competing*	1	2	3 - 5	6 - 9	10 - 12	13 +
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*includes the dog awarded Winners.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER (ERN)

Effective Jan. 1/92, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). The ERN number must be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Fee is \$59.50 per dog. For further information contact: The Canadian Kennel Club. US EXHIBITORS

Bank drafts or money orders in Canadian funds, or personal cheques payable in US funds, for the full amount of the entry fees, will be accepted. Personally discounted cheques will not be honoured. Please do not mark personal cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as such items are not cleared through the banks. Your cooperation is appreciated.

CATALOGUES

Catalogues are available on a pre-order basis at a price of \$3.00 by indicating this on the entry form. Your catalogue will be waiting for you at the show. There will be a limited number of catalogues available for sale at the show for a price of \$5.00.

**ENTRY
INFORMATION**

No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry are completed in full. Incomplete entries will be returned. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by a cheque, draft or money order for the entry fees. Telephone, fax or online entries cannot be accepted by the Club, nor can the Club accept credit card or Interac Email Money Transfers. These options are available by using The Entry Line, a show entry service provider. Please note that The Entry Line charges a fee for processing.

Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.

Alterations, substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited, except moving Class dogs to Specials. Only dogs which are already registered in the Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, or are eligible for such registration, can be entered. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, subject to CKC Rules.

ENTRIES POSITIVELY CLOSE AT 10:00 PM (AST) FRIDAY, JULY 9, 2010 and must be in the hands of the Show Secretary by that date. Identification cards and judging schedules will be mailed as soon as possible after the entries close.

Tendering NSF cheques in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. Any NSF cheques will be subject to a \$20.00 service charge.

**DOG SHOW
CLASSES**

REGULAR CLASSES: (choose only 1 regular class per dog)

JUNIOR PUPPY: a dog between 6 months & under 9 months of age on day of show.

SENIOR PUPPY: a dog between 9 months & under 12 months of age on day of show.

12 - 15 MONTHS: a dog between 12 months and under 15 months of age on day of show.

15 - 18 MONTHS: a dog between 15 months and under 18 months of age on day of show.

CANADIAN BRED: a dog born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR: a dog owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner and breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS: for all [intact] dogs.

VETERANS CLASSES: dogs over 7 but under 9, and dogs 9 or more. Dogs entered in these 2 classes may be spayed or neutered. Both classes are divided by gender.

SPECIALS ONLY: dogs who are already Canadian champions.

ALTERED CLASS: this class is for all surgically spayed/neutered dogs over the age of 6 mths. The class will be judged immediately following the regular classes. This class is divided by gender.

NOTE: DOGS ENTERED IN NON-REGULAR CLASSES MUST ALSO BE ENTERED IN ONE OF THE REGULAR CLASSES, OR IN EXHIBITION ONLY.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES:

BRACE: two dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex) and identical ownership. Must be handled by one person on one lead.

STUD DOG & GET: a stud dog & 2 or more of his get. The stud may be neutered, and can be on exhibition only, but the get must be entered in one of the official classes. Dogs do not need to be owned by the same person. Prize goes to owner of stud.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY: a brood bitch & 2 or more of her progeny. The brood bitch may be spayed, and can be on exhibition only, but the progeny must be entered in one of the Official classes. Dogs do not need to be owned by the same person. Prize goes to owner of brood bitch.

EXHIBITION ONLY: all dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competitions. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes.

PARADES

Dogs entered in Parades must also have entered a Regular class, or Exhibition Only. Spayed and neutered dogs or dogs in unorthodox trim may be entered in a Parade.

PARADE OF CHAMPIONS

All dogs entered in this parade must have completed all the requirements for a CKC championship.

PARADE OF VETERANS

All dogs seven years of age or older may be entered.
