
DIRECTIONS TO THE FIELD: This is a mown agricultural, rough but fairly flat field with natural boundaries.

Enter the '4949' address into Google Maps or your GPS device. Alternatively: -


From Vancouver: take Highway 1 East to Exit #135 (Highway 9 North to Agassiz). Follow signs to Agassiz. Pass through Agassiz following signs to Harrison Hot Springs, Mission, Vancouver. Turn right at the second traffic light. Go over the railway crossing bearing left (West). At the Junction of Highway 9 and 7 turn left onto the Lougheed Highway to Mission (Vancouver). After 1 mile turn right (north) on Cameron Road at the disused Gas Station. Humphrey Rd. is first on left. The field is at the north-west corner of the intersection.

COURSE PLANS: The inner run is 300 yd, the outer run is 600 yd.

Fax or Credit/Debit card entries CANNOT be accepted.

The Chase Ability Program provides purebred and mixed-breed dogs with the opportunity to compete and earn a title in a field event that all dogs are capable of performing. Dogs shall run as SINGLES only [the dog runs only once and by itself] and are required to complete their course with enthusiasm and without interruption.

The Chase Ability Program is a pass/fail event. The Judge's decision is final.

ELIGIBLE DOGS; purebred or mixed-breed dogs must be at least 12 months of age, that are :

- (a) Individually registered with the CKC; [or]
- (b) Have an Event Registration Number (ERN); [or]
- (c) Have a Performance Event Number (PEN); [or]
- (d) Eligible for registration with the CKC; [or]
- (e) Have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed: [or]
- (f) Have a Canine Companion number (CCN), if it is mixed breed.

Females in season may not enter [on this occasion].

300 YARD COURSE: for dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers or brachycephalic (flat-faced) dogs.

600 YARD COURSE: for all dogs not eligible to run the shorter distance.

Dogs may wear a catch collar that is free of any item which may become entangled in the line. Prong or electronic collars are not permitted. The collar should be snug to minimise the chance of getting hung-up on the line during the run. A dog may wear a muzzle. Handlers may use a slip leash, but NOT a retractable (Flexi type) leash.

AWARDS

A gold ribbon stating "Chase Ability Qualifier" will be awarded to dogs that pass the course.

Three CKC titles will be awarded for dogs that pass the Chase Ability Program event the required number of times. For purebred dogs, these are suffix titles that will appear on a dog's pedigree with a higher level title superseding a lower level title.

- (a) Chase Ability (CA) awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability event three times under at least two different judges.
- (b) Chase Ability Excellent (CAX) Dog passes the Chase Ability event a total of ten times.
- (c) Chase Ability Excellent 2 (CAX2) Dog passes the Chase Ability event a total of 20 times.
- A higher numbered title will be awarded for every additional ten passes.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

The Club requests all competitors and/or spectators NOT to bring a bitch in season onto the grounds.

- Bitches in season and lame dogs will have their entry refunded provided notice is given at or before Roll Call.
- Dogs will be inspected before running. Any dog found lame, unfit to compete or in season shall not be allowed to compete and the entry fees will be refunded.
- Dogs not present at Roll Call will be scratched and entry fee not refunded.
- A valid rabies certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada.
- U.S. cheques cannot be discounted. To take advantage of the exchange, please pay with a Canadian money order.
- Entry forms should be the same size and format as the official entry, else they will be rejected.
- Please bring your own shade / rain cover and please do not park on the main (racing) field,
- It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any
 participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Field Trial Committee
 shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation and the Discipline Committee shall have the
 authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.
- Unless coursing, all dogs must be leashed at all times, A \$10.00 fine will be levied against the owner of any dog loose on the site property.
- For your comfort, please wear appropriate footwear.
- Anyone exhibiting unsportsmanlike conduct will be asked to leave the CAP site.
- A valid rabies certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada.
- A port-a-potty will be available at the field.
- Please pick-up after your dogs and properly dispose of trash (e.g. cig butts), as this is an agricultural field.
- The Club will be using a battery powered drag line lure machine with white plastic streamers. After each run the line will be reset on the pulleys by a rider on an ATV. Your patience is requested. This is a safer process than the closed loop method, but more tedious.
- A 50-50 PLUS draw will be held at the end of the day, Sat. 9th Sept.
- Brachycephalic Breeds: Afenpinscher, Boston Terrier, Boxer, Brussels Griffon, Bulldog, Bullmastiff, Cane Corso, Cavalier King Charles Spaniel, Chihuahua (apple-headed), Dogue de Bordeaux, English Mastiff, French Bulldog, Griffon Bruxellois, Japanese Chin, King Charles Spaniel, Neapolitan Mastiff, Pekingese, Pug, Rottweiler, Shih Tzu, Tibetan Spaniel, Valley Bulldog (or Bull-Boxer).
