Limited Entry	OBEDIENCE: Entry in each obedience trial will be limited to the capacity of the judge to judge at the rate of 9 Pre-Novice, 8 Novice and Novice Intermediate, 7 Open, and 6 Utility dogs per hour. A judge may not be assigned more than 7 hours of judging.		
	RALLY: Entry in each rally obedience trial will be limited to the capacity of the judge to judge at the rate of 15 dogs per hour less time for walk-throughs. A judge may not be assigned more than 7 hours of judging.		
	Once a judge has reached his/her capacity, entries for that trial will be closed even if the closing date has not been reached. In the case of the entry limit having been reached, remaining entries will be assigned a position (by class) on a reserve list. Exhibitors will be notified of their position on the reserve list. If the entry of a bitch in season is pulled after entries are closed, it may be substituted with one from the reserve list up to and including the day of the trial. If the entry of another dog is pulled prior to the trial, it may be substituted with one from the reserve list up to 24 hours prior to the trial.		
Bitches in Season	Bitches in season are not permitted to compete. When a bitch comes into season after entries close, a Veterinarian's Certificate, certifying that the bitch was in season within ten (10) days of the trial, must reach the Trial Secretary on or before the day of the trial, prior to the judging of the class, and the club will refund the entry fees.		
	It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at an Obedience Trial held under these regulations is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Obedience Trial Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Moving Up	6.9.1 A dog that is registered in the records of the CKC with an eligibl number according to these rules and has fulfilled the requirement for a title in accordance with these rules may be moved to the new level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be o the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the trial secretary b the owner or handler at least 30 minutes before the start of the trial.
	6.9.3 The Trial Secretary shall amend the judge's book and the marke catalogue, which is to be sent to the CKC with the requests attache to the appropriate entry forms.
	6.9.5 In order for a dog to be eligible to move up, the dog must b individually registered with the CKC, have a Performance Ever Number (PEN), or an Event Registration Number (ERN) before entrie close. The addition of a CKC number after close of entries does no make the dog eligible and will result in referral to the Disciplin

Refund Policy	If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or to complete the trials, no refund of entry will be made.
Temporary Competition Number (TCN)	A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.
	A TCN cannot be used for dogs that require a PEN or a CCN number.
	Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.
Event Registration Number (ERN)	All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events, and do not have a CKC registra- tion number, will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).
	The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.
Performance Event Number (PEN)	A Performance Event Number (PEN) allows a non-registrable dog of a CKC-RECOGNIZED BREED to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed. To be eligible to receive a PEN, all of the following must be met:
	 The dog must be of a breed recognized by the CKC (<i>not</i> on the CKC Miscellaneous Class List). The dog must not be eligible for CKC registration. The dog must be spayed or neutered.
	 The dog must be properly identified with a CKC-approved microchip.
	A dog that is eligible for a PEN may not be entered as a 'listed' dog.
Canine Companion Number (CCN)	A Canine Companion Number (CCN) allows UNRECOGNIZED BREEDS to compete in CKC performance events. To be eligible to receive a CCN, all the following must be met:
Unrecognized Breeds	 The dog must be either an Unrecognized Breed. Unrecognized Breeds are not required to be spayed or neutered. The dog must be properly identified with a CKC microchip.
	A dog that is eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a 'listed' dog.
	 All the above 'registration' numbers can be obtained: Online through CKC's Portal (Note: Individuals who have not yet used the online Portal will be required to create a Portal account before they can submit an application online); or By submitting a completed paper application by mail to CKC.

If the dog you are entering has earned any CKC obedience title other than a PCD (e.g., CD, CDX, OTCH), the dog CANNOT be entered in any Rally "A" class.

Handlers who have exhibited any dog to a CKC CDX title CANNOT enter the "A" classes.

Entering the wrong class will result in the cancellation of legs and titles.

It is indicated by a Goldunn sign and number. Proceed on this driveway turning left and following it to the building. It is also easy to find from a driveway on the north side of the Baseline Rd., at the east side of the Baseline Bridge, do not go over the bridge. When you proceed on this drive way you will notice a brick building identified by the "Goldunn Training Centre Sign". Take this drive way to the end turn left and proceed to the brick building on your right. FROM CHATHAM ON 40 HIGHWAY: The first light you arrive at is the Baseline Road. Turn left on the Baseline Road passing Gillard Street on your right. Take the second driveway on your right just before the approach to the Baseline Bridge. Follow this driveway to the first red brick building on the right. **FROM DRESDEN:** Proceed west on the Baseline Road through the traffic light at Murray Street. Take the second driveway on your right just before the approach to the Baseline Bridge. Follow this driveway to the first red brick building on the right. FROM SARNIA, FROM THE KIMBALL ROAD: Turn right at the end of Kimball Road entering Wallaceburg on Margaret Ave. At the first traffic light turn left, going over the Murray Street Bridge. Proceed south on Murray Street to the second traffic light and turn right at the Baseline Road. Take the second driveway on your right just before the approach to the Baseline Bridge. Follow this driveway to the first red brick building on the right. FROM SARNIA BY WAY OF THE NEW 40 HIGHWAY: Turn left at the end of 40 Highway on to Dufferin Avenue, to Wallaceburg. Proceed east of Dufferin Avenue, to the second traffic light at Arnold Street turn right. Proceed to the end of Arnold Street turning left on to Mason Street. At the end of Mason Street turn right on Old Glass Road. At the next intersection which is the Baseline Road turn left. Go over the Baseline Bridge and just at the foot of the Baseline Bridge take the
