GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Muskoka District Kennel Club will use care and diligence for the welfare of all dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liabilities in the event of an accident or other mishap, however caused, to either dog or exhibitor. A dog shall not be touched without the permission of the owner or agent.
- 2. Only dogs entered in Trials will be permitted in the Trial Building.
- 3. Trial start times will be indicated on the judging schedule.
- 4. Trial Precincts shall be the MDKC Building and the area behind the building.
- 5. There will be no warm up boxes provided.

STATEMENT ON BULLYING

The MDKC has a zero-tolerance policy regarding bullying. Any individual utilizing bullying tactics at the trial grounds will be required to leave the premises immediately and for the remainder of the event. No refunds will be given in this case. A report will be filed with the CKC and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such actions as it deems fit.

What is Bullying? The term bullying refers to treating individuals in a mean, insulting or abusive way, regardless if it is initiated deliberately or unconsciously. Bullying may cause the affected person to feel upset, afraid, isolated or humiliated.

Examples include but are not limited to:

- Insulting a person's skills, looks, or habits
- Spreading false or malicious rumours, gossip, or innuendo
- Berating/belittling an individual
- Unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others
- Using insulting nicknames
- Engaging in humiliating practical jokes
- Physical gestures that intimidate, offend, degrade or humiliate
- Mocking a person's accent, abilities or mannerisms
- Yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces or belittles

NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE - Effective January 1, 2011:

- a) A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC.
- b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

SCENT DETECTION TRIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Scent Detection Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club

It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Event Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

- 6.5.1 **Bitches in Season** are permitted to compete. They must be run at the end of the run order for each class and must wear clean, properly fitted panties.
- 6.5.2 When a bitch comes into season after entries have closed, the owner of the dog must inform the host club so that the bitch in season will be moved to the end of all run orders for any class they are entered in.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

Effective Jan. 1/92, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Please contact CKC for further info.

TEMPORARY COMPETITION NUMBER

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN. Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

PERFORMANCE EVENT NUMBER

A Performance Event Number (PEN) allows an unregistered dog of a CKC recognized or listed breed to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed.

CANINE COMPANION NUMBER

In order to compete, mixed and unrecognized breed dogs must have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) from the Canadian Kennel Club. A dog eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a listed dog with a TCN.

HEALTH

- 6.6.1 No dog may be entered at a trial if it has any communicable disease.
- 6.6.2 Dogs entered in a test must have current immunization status.
- 6.6.3 No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of a trial if it:
- (a) Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease, or
- (b) Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable within the last 30 days.
- (c) Has been housed within 30 days prior to the trial on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.
- 6.6.4 Where it is found that these rules have been contravened, the dog in question shall be removed from the premises and the exhibitor/handler will be subject to disciplinary action.

Handlers may only enter one dog at each level.

ENTRIES CLOSE at 9 p.m. on Sunday, April 27th, 2025 or when Judges' Assignment has reached 6 hours of judging, whichever comes first.
