The Northern Alberta Pointing Dog Club will hold a licensed field trial for **all pointing breeds** near Buck Lake, Alberta on August 26-27, 2023. This trial will be held under the rules of the Canadian Kennel Club, 5397 Eglinton Ave W, Suite 101, Etobicoke, ON, M9C 5K6.

STAKES:

All stakes will be foot handled. Judges will be mounted on horseback. Chukars will be released in all stakes except puppy. Native partridge and grouse may be present.

This schedule below is tentative and will be amended if necessary, after entries are closed.

LOCATION:

The NAPDC is grateful to have received permission from the Government of Alberta and the Buck Mountain Provincial Grazing Reserve to use these grounds. A map with directions to the grounds will be provided to participants when the running order is distributed. Your cooperation in keeping the grounds free of litter is essential. Pick up after your dogs.

Parking will only be in the camping area. No smoking will be allowed on the trial grounds outside your parked vehicle or RV.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. **All persons who enter the grounds will be required to sign a waiver prior to entering or engaging in any activities on these grounds. We need to have the waivers prior to the start of the trial. Please return the signed waiver to jbatrack@gmail.com after completing your entry on www.DogShow.ca.**
2. **Entries will open at 6:00 p.m. Tuesday August 15, 2023, and close sharp at 6:00 p.m. Tuesday August 22, 2023 or when event is full, whichever comes first.** Online entries through www.DogShow.ca are preferred.
3. Total entries: Limited to the number of dogs that can be run in the available daylight hours. Owners are advised to submit their entries as early as possible. In the event of high demand, the Field Trial Secretary reserves the right to request owners limit their entries.
4. Running and handling: All stakes are walking only. There will be no horseback handling. Members of the gallery may be on foot or mounted, but must follow the judges.
5. Length of stakes: Senior stakes will be 30 minutes in length. Derby will be a maximum of 30 minutes. Puppy will be a maximum of 20 minutes. In the event of unforeseen circumstances, Derby may be shortened to 20 minutes and/or Puppy may be shortened to 15 minutes.
6. Scouts: If used, must be on foot. A scout may only leave the gallery with permission of the judges and solely for the purpose of finding a dog on point. A scout is not permitted to act as a second handler.
7. Blank pistols: .22 caliber or larger must be fired over all dogs with bird work in derby and senior stakes. Blank pistols will not be fired in the puppy stake.
8. Tracking collars: Electronic tracking collars that meet the CKC guidelines and are lawful for use in Canada are allowed. Participants must declare to the judge that they are using the tracking collar. The receiver must be turned off and at the discretion of the judge, will be carried by the judge.
NOTE: Under Rule 11.4.10, with the exception of tracking collars, collars worn in competitive stakes must be a type solely used for purposes of identification. That is, the normal dog collar with name plate attached **or** coloured collars used to distinguish between dogs in a brace. Rule 11.6.6 states that no more than two collars may be worn by a dog.
9. Collaring a dog away after game contact is allowed.
10. Bitches in season: Allowed to run only in the last brace(s) of the Amateur Shooting Dog. Please advise the Field Trial Secretary prior to running if your dog is in season.
11. Backing tests: If a dog has placed in a senior stake and needs only to demonstrate a back to become a Field Trial Champion, the handler may request a backing test. The test will depend on the availability of birds. The cost will be \$15.00.
12. **Reminder:** There will be no exercising or training of any dogs on the grounds before or during the Trial. All participants must be familiar with CKC Rules and also the rules & provisions of this Premium List. CKC Field Trial rulebooks are available from the CKC or on-line at the CKC website for CKC members.
13. There may be water on course depending on weather conditions, but please bring water for your dogs and horses.
14. Open fires are prohibited. No smoking will be allowed on the trial grounds outside your parked vehicle or RV.

It is the duty and obligation of the trial hosting club to see that no judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under CKC rules, is subject to indignities of any kind.

LUNCH:

Lunch will be provided for judges and volunteers. It will be available to others and a donation jar will be present and will be gratefully accepted by the NAPDC.

ACCOMMODATION:

Dry camping will be available on-site Friday and Saturday night.

PRIZES:

Standard CKC rosettes will be awarded to the placing dogs in all stakes.

IMPORTANT - TCN Number (Previously Listing fees):

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) has been established by The Canadian Kennel Club and MUST ACCOMPANY the entry of a dog for which a Canadian Kennel Club individual registration number or Event Registration Number (ERN) is not shown on the entry form. This fee is \$10.50 (incl GST) per dog per each event entered during the field test and is in addition to the entry fee(s). Exhibitors should be aware that the CKC does not confer a title on any dog until it is registered individually in their records. Please visit www.CKC.ca to obtain your TCN.

ENTRIES:

Entries will open at 6:00 p.m. Tuesday August 15, 2023, and close sharp at 6:00 p.m. Tuesday August 22, 2023 or when event is full, whichever comes first. Draw will follow shortly after closing at the home of the Field Trial Secretary. Those wishing to attend may contact Joanne Archibald at jbatrack@gmail.com for further instructions.

Online entries through our event partner www.DogShow.ca are preferred. For those who choose not to enter online, the entry must be sent to the Field Trial Secretary who may be contacted at jbatrack@gmail.com for further instructions. Payment in full must accompany all entries.
