## JUDGES AND ASSIGNMENTS

### Regional:

#### Sandy Alexander.....Manitoba



I have bred, owned and exhibited Dachshunds (MS, ML, MW, SS) beginning in 1974 first under the Longjohn prefix and then under Thomashenry. Our Dachshunds have placed number one in their breed as well as many times in the top five. They have been multi BISS, BIS winners. I also pursue earthdog titles on my Dachshunds.

Our German Shorthaired Pointers won over 25 BIS, achieving number one status over several years, placing many times in the top ten Sporting dogs. They have been #1 obedience GSP, won multiple BISS Canadian and American including Best of winners at the American National. The top winning GSP, #1 Sporting dog in South America 1992 and only GSP to win the Sporting Group at the world dog show was Thomashenry bred. Thomashenry has champions GSP in six countries.

Our current breed, Labrador Retrievers have attained number one Labrador in 2016 as well as multiple BIS, American and Canadian BISS, number one puppy, as well as WC and field titles.

I have also owned and/or bred BIS, BISS top ranked Siberians; BIS, BISS top five Pembroke Welsh Corgi's and top five BIS Miniature Poodle and Shetland Sheepdogs.

I have served CKC on the conformation council for the last twelve years. I am actively involved in several Labrador Retriever and Dachshund clubs. I have judged National and Regional specialties, and all breed shows in Canada, USA, Japan, Spain, China, New Zealand and Australia. I am licensed to judge all breeds.

### National:

#### Shawn Nichols.....BC



My involvement in purebred dogs started in 1982 when I attended my first show. I quickly developed a keen interest in the sport of dogs. In the summer of 1985 I went to work for professional handlers Mark and Sally George, in Northern California. I soon realized that the sport would become a life commitment and passion. I continued to work for professional handlers Tim Brazier, Mark Shanoff and Carol Graham, all of whom offered me the privilege of working with some truly amazing dogs and helped cultivate who I've become over the past several decades. Eventually I relocated to Calgary where, in partnership with Raymond Yurick we professionally handled all breeds. In addition to showing for others we also bred and showed Wire Fox Terriers, Whippets, Scottish Terriers but primarily Toy & Miniature Poodles under the Typecast prefix, Whippets under Brushwood.

I have sat on the board of several clubs holding almost every possible executive position including being a charter member of the Non Sporting Fanciers of Alberta. I currently serve Evelyn Kenny Kennel and Obedience Club as its Show Chairmen. I have also been the Show Secretary for several clubs in the West as well. In 2007 I had the honour of purchasing and assuming the responsibility of Terrier Type, a unique magazine that chronicled the history and

achievements of the Terrier since 1961. I also worked in collaboration with Raymond and his sister Yvonne Norton on the inception of Canadian Dog Digest. In 2010 I returned to Vancouver and transitioned from being the owner operator of my own salon to a cooperate position with Kao a Japanese owned with German roots. I quickly realized that if I was going to succeed in my role I would have to pursue a better understanding of modern business. During my seven years with Kao I completed my Marketing Sales Management program at BC accelerating my understating in social media. In 2017 I was head hunted by L'Oreal Professionnel for a position in Business Development which would have me return to Calgary. Creating strategic relationships and growth are at the heart of what I do.

In 2012, I started to judge, I completes my All Breed status in 2022. Judging to me was a natural evolution to add to my experiences in the dog world. It also allows me to remain current with issues of importance to breeders and exhibitors and offers me a means to be involved with CKC. In addition to judging in Canada and the US it has afforded me the luxury of judging in Mexico, Korea and Australia. I had the great priviledge of judging at Westminster Kennel Club in 2022 and Miniatures at Poodle Club of America in 2023. I have also had the great opportunity to present to the Canadian Dog Judges Association twice, once with Poodles and more recently Ethical Social Media for Dog Judges.

Lisa Maki has been showing and breeding purebred dogs since 2009, but has been actively involved in both the dog and equestrian worlds since childhood. 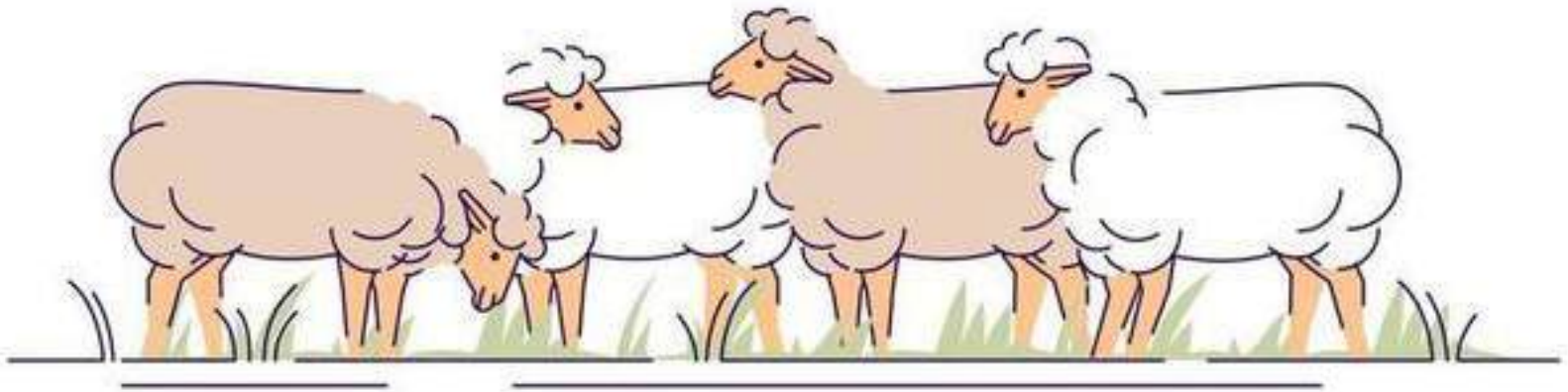

## IN MEMORY OF LYNN LEACH

The herding community suffered a devastating loss on December 10, 2024 with the sudden passing of Janet Lynn Leach ("Lynn").

Lynn was instrumental in starting the CKC herding program. In 2021, Lynn was awarded the inaugural CKC Heritage Award for her outstanding contribution and dedication to herding.

Lynn also bred Australian Cattle Dogs under the Downriver kennel name. One of only a couple of breeders in Canada, whose main focus was on working stockdogs that could also show, she earned Herding Championships and Conformation Championships on many of her dogs. Lynn was an active member of the board of the Australian Cattle Dog Club of Canada for many years, and contributed by hosting events, publishing articles and participating in ACD health research projects.

In the 1990s Lynn gave up her job as a realtor and started giving herding lessons and teaching clinics. Working stockdogs was her passion and she made it into a career, dedicating her life to teaching and mentoring others in utilizing their dogs on both the farm and competing in herding trials.

During her journey, Lynn traveled across North America, Australia, and Europe to give herding clinics, seminars and judge herding trials. She was an invaluable mentor, teacher and role model for hundreds of people from all around the world that were interested in herding with their dogs. She made many friends and helped so many people over the years.

In the early 2000s she started the training program at the Vancouver Airport to utilize dogs to clear birds off the runways and flight paths. Her program was a huge success and the dogs and handlers she trained are still making it safe for the millions of travelers who fly in and out of the airport today.



Thanks to Lynn, and her dedication to all breed herding, she has mentored and assisted people to set up their own training facilities to encourage more and more people to get out and work their dogs on stock. The impact that Lynn has had on the sport is immeasurable. All-breed herding would not be what it is today if it wasn't for commitment and sacrifices, that Lynn made to promote and preserve the heritage of so many breeds.

Lynn's legacy will continue through all those that she mentored. Our condolences to her family members, her "herding family" and the herding community. It was an excellent run Lynn, one that we all will remember whenever we open that take pen gate.

4.1.5 No person may approach a judge wither directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

## **CONFORMATION CLASSES**

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

**JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS** - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

**SENIOR PUPPY CLASS** - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

**12 to 18 MONTH CLASS**- This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show

**CANADIAN BRED CLASS** - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

**BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS** - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler **MUST** be the owner/co- owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

**OPEN CLASS** - This class shall be for all dogs.

**FIELD CLASS** - Dogs in this class must have attained a title or placement in a field trial or test (Herding). This class is judged prior to Best of Breed judging with the winners of each sex competing for Best of Breed. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

**VETERANS CLASS** - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

**SPECIALS ONLY CLASS** - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A TCN dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class **MUST** be received by the Show Secretary **ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE BREED JUDGING ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED.**

## **NON-REGULAR CLASSES**

**BABY PUPPY CLASS** - This class shall be for any dog 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male, Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group

**STUD DOG & GET** -shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership in this class need not be identical. The stud dog may be spayed/neutered and must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class.

**BROOD BITCH & PROGENY**- This class shall have the same requirements as Stud dog and get

**EXHIBITION ONLY** - Dogs entered in this class may not compete in the regular breed classes.

**SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASS** - This class is for dogs which have been spayed or neutered

12 months of age up to but not including 18 months.

## GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available online at [www.ckc.ca](http://www.ckc.ca)

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC TIME.
7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.

9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.

10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.

11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.

12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

### **HERITAGE PARK FIRE SAFETY RULES:**

Extension cord may not be stretched across fire lanes.

Tape of any kind is not to be used on the floors.

All power cords must be unplugged at night.

Aisles must be kept open at all times to allow everyone easy and speedy exit in case of emergency.

All designated FIRE LANES must be kept clear at all times or vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

### **ADDITIONAL CLUB RULES:**

Only dogs entered will be allowed in the building.

Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Crates will be allowed at ringside during the judging of your specific breed only and must be removed immediately after. No Exceptions.

Dogs are not allowed in washrooms.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the days of these shows.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or vendors/concessions.

The Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

Delays waiting for dogs are not possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their dogs "conflict".

The club reserves the right of restricting exhibitors grooming space.

Plastic sheeting must be under all ex-pens.

Any tape used in the building has to be easily removable and must be removed after the show is completed. Coloured tape/duct tape and/or Gorilla Tape is not allowed. You must leave your setup in the same clean condition you found it in when you first arrived at the show.

Unless permission is granted in writing by the Mount Cheam Canine Association, there will not be any handling classes operated or offered by anyone in any part of the Heritage Park facility at any time.

Power bars are not permitted as they will blow fuses.

No paper from under the ex-pens or crates or liquid waste are to be disposed of in garbage cans. They must go in the bins provided outside the building. Anyone putting any dog papers or waste into garbage containers on floor one will not be permitted to enter future shows as Heritage Park may refuse to have dog events if this continues.

## CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (\*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

### 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
