It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue. (19.7)

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an obedience or rally trial held under these regulations is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Trial Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue. (20.7)

No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

REFUND POLICY

If, because of riot or civil disturbance or any other acts beyond the control of the ALRC and their Show Committee, it is impossible to open or close the shows, no refund of entries will be made.

To comply with CKC regulations, we will be unable to accept or substitute any entry reaching the show & trial secretaries after the closing time and date.

All entry fees should be forwarded to our Show Secretary prior to closing date. Personal cheques and money orders for full value only will be accepted, and must be made payable to:

No post dated cheques accepted. A post dated cheque is one that is dated after the receipt of the entry. All NSF cheques will be Subject to a charge of \$20.00. N.S.F. cheques are considered non-payment of entry fees and are punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. All fees must be paid before the show.

Important Note Regarding Emails & Faxes – it will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that any electronic submission, either email, facsimile, or any document transmitted electronically, reaches the proper authority or recipient, within the times and limits as regulated for each document in the CKC Rules & Regulations. Sent fax receipts, and/or, copies of sent emails will not be taken as evidence of receipt by recipients.

Attention USA exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) - * Effective March 2, 2020

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN).

There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN.

TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number.

A copy of the Rules pertaining to Dog Shows & Obedience Trials is available from the Canadian Kennel Club. Each exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the rules of the Canadian Kennel Club regarding their events.

SPECIALTY CONFORMATION SHOW FOR LABRADOR RETRIEVERS

REGULAR CLASSES

The following CKC Regular Classes will be provided for both sexes:

Junior Puppy	Senior Puppy	12 to 18 Months
Bred by Exhibitor	Canadian Bred	Open
Veterans	Field Dog	Specials Only
Exhibition Only		

Veterans class will be divided into three classes: 7-9 years, 9-11 years, & 11 years & up

Note: Awards of Merit will be made (at the judge's discretion) at the maximum rate of one for every ten dogs competing for Best of Breed. This award will be made after the judging of Best of Breed.

Field Dog - shall be for any dog that has earned a title at WC Test, Hunt Tests or a placement at a Field Trial. **NOTE** This is now an official class. The dog does not compete for points but proceeds directly to Best of Breed. This class is to be judged prior to Best of Breed judging with winners of each sex competing for Best of Breed. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

Dogs entered in Non-Regular Classes must be entered in one of the CKC Regular Classes, Specials Only, or Exhibition Only.

Baby Puppy - shall be for puppies 4-6 months of age.

Stud Dog Class - shall be for Stud Dog and two of his Get only.

Brood Bitch Class - shall be for Brood Bitch and two of her Progeny only.

Altered Male Class - All sexually altered males, regardless of age will be judged together.

Altered Female Class - All sexually altered females, regardless of age will be judged together.

The winner of each of these two divisions competes for **Best Altered**

Generation Class – Sire or Dam with two generations of get.

Competition for Sexually Altered Dogs These classes will be offered to all spayed and neutered dogs over six months of age, to compete for Winners Male, Winners Female and Best Altered in Breed. Judging will take place after Best Puppy in Breed in the regular classes.

Note: All Non-Regular Classes will follow immediately after Best of Breed. Please be sure to mark non-regular classes entered on your regular entry form.

PUPPY SWEEPSTAKES

Puppy Sweeps shall be for any dog 4 months up to but not including 18 months of age. To enter this class the dog must be entered in one of the CKC regular classes or in Specials only.

There will be three classes in all, divided by sex.

Baby Puppy Class for Labradors at least 4 months of age up to but not including 6 months.
Junior Class for Labradors at least 6 months of age up to but not including 9 months.
Senior Class for Labradors at least 9 months of age up to but not including 12 months.
12-18 Open for Labradors at least 12 months of age up to but not including 18 months.

The winners of all classes will compete for Best in Sweepstakes. A rosette will be awarded to first, second, third and fourth places in each class as well as to Best in Sweeps and Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps.

VETERANS SWEEPSTAKES

Veterans Sweeps shall be for any dog 7 years of age and up. To enter this class, the dog must be entered in one of the CKC regular classes, Specials or Exhibition Only. There will be six classes in all, divided by sex.

7 up to 9 years for Labradors at least 7 years of age up to but not including 9 years
9 up to 11 years for Labradors at least 9 years of age up to but not including 11 years
11 years of age plus for Labradors 11 years of age and older

For Puppy and Veterans Sweepstakes the class winners will compete for Best in Sweepstakes with the prize money distributed as follows:

50% remaining of the entry fees will be awarded to the class winner.
15% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best in Sweeps
10% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps
25% will be retained for administrative purposes

19.3 Rally Team Classes

- 19.3.1 Eligibility for Team classes shall be the same as that listed for the obedience Team class, except that the class is open to any four dogs that have earned a title of RN or higher.
- 19.3.2 Clubs may offer any of these classes: Rally Novice, Rally Intermediate, Rally Advanced, Rally Excellent and/or Rally Master.
- 19.3.3 Each team member will run the course individually, with the team time running continuously. The judge will give the first member of the team the "Forward" command from the Start sign. Each subsequent dog and handler will start when the previous dog and handler pass the Finish sign, without any additional command of "Forward" by the judge. Timing for each team will begin when the judge commands "Forward" to the first handler in the team and will stop when the fourth handler and dog pass the finish line.
- 19.3.4 If jumps are required, the height will be based on the height of the smallest dog on each competing team.
- 19.3.5 There will be no Sit Stay (Sign #298) or Stand Stay (Sign #398) included if the class is offered at the Excellent or Master level.
- 19.3.6 Scores will be based on a possible score of 400 points for each team, with ties being broken by time. Each dog and handler will be scored as in official classes. A qualifying score is 280 points or more except in the Master class, where 320 or more points is required.
- 19.3.7 Suggested judging rate is four teams per hour.

SPECIALTY CATALOGUE

Catalogues will be available from the Show Secretary on a preorder basis only for \$ 6.00. Catalogues will not be mailed to absent exhibitors and no public catalogue will be available.

NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE

A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is not a member of the Canadian Kennel Club. The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in all awards, legs, points, titles being cancelled. The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- Children, accompanied by an adult, are welcome at our show, however, please do not allow them to disturb dogs without permission of owner/handler .
- All exhibitors will be held responsible for clean up on the show premises and surrounding areas for their own dogs or dogs they are handling and must use the designated areas.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have their dog at ringside when it is scheduled.
- The ALRC and property owners will not be held responsible for any equipment left on the grounds overnight.
- The ALRC and the Show Committee will use care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume and liability in the event of an accident, or other misfortune to either the dogs or exhibitors or patrons.
- Only dogs entered in the Show will be permitted on the show premises.
- The precincts of the show shall be the fenced area of the rings and 3 feet surrounding the rings.

Baby Puppy	A dog 4 months up to 6 months on the day of the show
Junior Puppy	A dog 6 months up to 9 months on the day of the show
Senior Puppy	A dog between 9 months and up to 12 months on the day of the show
12-18 Months	A dog between 12 months and up to 18 months on the day of the show
Canadian Bred	A dog which was born in Canada
Bred by Exhibitor	A dog owned and handled by the breeder
Open Class	A dog 6 months of age or older
Specials Only	Dogs who are Canadian Champions
Exhibition Only	Dogs 6 months and over, not in competition.
Veteran Class Dogs	Must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.
Altered class	For sexually altered dogs only

NOTE: 4–6-month Exhibition only puppy~ if the puppy does not yet have a CKC Registration Number the Listing Fee is waived.

CHAMPIONS & CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 1: A dog awarded WINNERS at a championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder.

SECTION 2: The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing:	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded WINNERS

To determine the numbers of championship points earned by a dog awarded WINNERS total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. The new system provides for additional points (provided that the dog has defeated another as listed hereunder):

A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five (5) points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at any single show.

Grand Champions and GCH Points

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch).

The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

b) The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at group level for all levels of GCh :

c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GRAND CHAMPION EXCELLENT AND GCHEX POINTS The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

a) One (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed). b) Three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.

c) A CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1,2022.
