Directions to the Test Site:

From Highway 2 [Macleod Trail South] in Calgary

Take Macleod Trail to Highway 22X [Spruce Meadows Trail] West

Highway 22X becomes Highway 22 [Total distance 36.5 km]

Turn LEFT onto Highway 762 [6.1 km]. You are now in Foothills.

Turn RIGHT onto Aspen Creek Drive (this is past the Burby Bridge and just past a lake on your left)

Take that to the stop sign - it is a residential area, so go slow:)

Turn right at the stop sign then take your first right. The skinny gravel driveway on the left is the roadway to the recreation grounds. 101 A Aspen Creek Drive, Foothills, AB. (to the right is a private driveway)

The recreation grounds are a private recreational facility for the use of residents in the West Foothills County. There are currently private community garden boxes that are not to be disturbed, and unassociated portions of the grounds will be utilized for the draft tests. There is ample parking and if required, day tents may be erected near your vehicle for shade, should the weather dictate their usage. Parking is adjacent and very accessible. There is an outhouse on the property, but no running potable water, nor any cell coverage at this site. There is a shelter for inclement weather, with a fireplace, even! This test site is very "natural" - no mowed lawns or clear pathways. It is quite hilly in parts and very overgrown. As with all outdoor events in Southern Alberta, come prepared for wet courses!
