Eventually I relocated to Calgary where, in partnership with Raymond Yurick, I handled many breeds. One of the dogs we showed was Am. Can.Ch. Clarion Camelot Communique, Canada's top Non-Sporting dog and #10 All breeds in 2008.

In 2007 I purchased the iconic Terrier Type magazine I was the Editor/Owner from 2007-2010, a unique magazine that chronicled the history and achievements of the Terrier since 1961.

I currently reside in Vancouver, BC where I currently work for Kao Canada in Sales and Marketing. My career aspirations have me pursuing my Marketing Sales Management Diploma at BCIT.

I started judging in 2012, since I have completed the Toy, Non-Sporting, and ½ of Hound Group. This past spring I have recently moved on to permit status for the balance of the Hound Group. Judging to me has been a natural evolution to add to my experiences in the dog world. It also allows me to remain current with issues of importance to breeders and exhibitors and offers me a means to be involved with CKC.

Helen Spacek Memorial Trophy awarded to Best in Specialty

In honor of a dear kind lady who was always generous with her help & knowledge and very patient with many of us as beginners. Helen was not new to raising dogs but new to Cairns in 1971. She was totally won over in no time & very convinced that all the Cairns really were "the best little pals in the world!" The picture of the Cairn on the trophy was Can.Am.Ch. MacSpacek Wee Bonnie O'North, out of Helen's first litter (Ch. Cannycairns Fair Lady x Can.Am.Ch. Tyca's Ready-Or-Not). There were two in the litter & both became champions.

Barbara Hollings Memorial Trophy awarded to Best Puppy

Barbara was a second-generation Cairn breeder, becoming involved in Cairns, in her teenage years. She was an active member of The Cairn Terrier Club while living in England. She moved to Canada in 1965 bringing Oona of Highhedges with her to continue with her love of Cairns. She was one of the founding members of the CTCC. Many of the breeders today started with foundation stock from Barbara's line.

Edna Perks Memorial Trophy awarded to Best of Winners

Edna purchased her first Cairn from Helen Spacek, McSpacek Wee Bonnie O'North. She chose Cairn north for her kennel name and later, Crofter together with Joan McMurphy, Edna joined the CTCC in 1975 and helped form the Alberta Clan in 1987, with the result of the first Alberta Regional Specialty in 1988. She became a life member of the CTCC in 2000. It was no surprise that Edna became a licensed permit judge in 1990 and an All-Breed judge in 2004. Edna came full circle when 20 years after forming the Alberta Clan, she judged the 2008 CTCC Prairie Regional Specialty.

These Perpetual Trophies remain the property of the CTCC-Prairie Region and can never be won outright.

A prize and/or rosette will be offered to the Cairn Terrier achieving the highest qualifying score at the Alberta Kennel Club All-breed Rally-Obedience Trials. In the event of a tie, the award will be given to the class of higher difficulty.

The Cairn Terrier Club of Canada – AKC Agility Trials – Saturday, August 2, 2025

A prize and rosette will be offered to the Labrador Retriever achieving the highest qualifying score in a Standard round at the Alberta Kennel Club All-breed Agility Trials. In the event of a tie, the award will be given to the class of higher difficulty.

TRACKING SHEET FOR AGILITY PRIZES

In order to streamline the prizes this year, and to ensure that everyone gets their prize in a timely manner, AKC will have prize tracking sheets for Agility supported entries. To be eligible for these prizes, competitors must obtain a tracking sheet from the Trial Secretary to record the dog's qualifying runs. This form must be completed by the competitor and submitted to the Trial Secretary's desk within 1 hour of the completion of the Jumpers with Weaves Trial 4 on Sat Aug 3, 2024

Agility Supported Entry Prizes will be available for pick up at the Agility Field after Noon on Sunday.

Any supported entry prizes not picked up by the end of the day on Monday will be considered a donation to AKC.

The points will be awarded as follows for each Qualifying run earned over the two (Friday and Saturday) days:
