ALL Entries **MUST** be received by closing date: WEDNESDAY, March 18th, 2020 @ 9:00pm Pacific Time

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTHS – This class shall be for any dog 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co- owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS (Brindle) - This class shall be for all dogs Brindle in colour.

OPEN CLASS (Fawn) – This class shall be for all dogs Fawn in colour.

VETERANS CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered. This class will be divided into 7 years and under 10 years, 10 years and under 12 years, 12 years and older.

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED. Listing Fees WILL NOT be refunded

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

BABY PUPPY – This class is for dogs 3 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show.

RALLY OBEDIENCE CLASSIFICATIONS

NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH NOVICE "A" & NOVICE "B" AT SAME TRIAL.
NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH ADVANCED "A" & ADVANCED "B" AT SAME TRIAL
NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH EXCELLENT "A" & EXCELLENT "B" AT THE SAME TRIAL

<u>RALLY NOVICE A</u>: Dogs competing in this class may not have earned a CKC Rally Novice (RN) title or any CKC Obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has earned the title.

RALLY NOVICE B: Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class

<u>RALLY INTERMEDIATE CLASS</u>: This is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Rally Advanced Classes. This class shall be for dogs that have earned the (RN) title. A dog completing the RI or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

<u>RALLY ADVANCED A:</u> This class shall be for dogs that have earned the Rally Novice (RN) title but have not earned the Rally Advanced (RA) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has earned the title.

RALLY ADVANCED B: This class will be for dogs that have earned the Rally Novice (RN) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (RA) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

RALLY EXCELLENT A: This class shall be for dogs that have earned the Rally Advanced (RA) title, but have not earned the Rally Excellent (RE) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title other than PCD. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has earned the title.

RALLY EXCELLENT B: This class will be for dogs that have earned the Rally Advanced (RA) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (RE) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

<u>RALLY MASTER:</u> This class with be for dogs that have earned the RE title. A dog completing the RM title may continue in the class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

RALLY OBEDIENCE UNOFFICIAL CLASSIFICATIONS

<u>RALLY BRACE CLASS</u>: Brace class shall be the same as those listed for the Obedience Brace Class, except that they are open to any 2 dogs that have earned a title of RN or higher. Class levels offered: Rally Novice, Rally Advanced, and Rally Excellent. It is not necessary that the same person owns both dogs, nor that they be the same breed **EXCEPT when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial**.

<u>RALLY TEAM CLASS</u>: Eligibility for Team Classes shall be the same as listed for the Obedience Team Class, except that the class is open to any 4 dogs that have earned a title of RN or higher. Class levels offered: Rally Novice, Rally Advanced and Rally Excellent.

TRANSITION OBEDIENCE CLASSIFICATIONS

<u>PRE-NOVICE</u> – This class shall be for all purebred dogs and those breeds as designated on the list of miscellaneous breeds and of either sex, which have not earned the title of PCD (Pre-Companion Dog) in Canada. Dogs being entered in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class and must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together on the Group exercise. A dog may be entered in the Pre-Novice that has not earned the title of CD in Canada or a comparable title in any other country. The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to the Novice Classes.

NOVICE "C" – This class is open to any dog of either sex that has gained the title Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any other advanced Obedience title in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than one dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit and the Long Down Exercises when they are judged in the same group. The Novice 'C' exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice Class except that exhibitors may compete in the Novice 'C' Class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice 'C' Class are not eligible for High in Trial. The PCD and CDI and Novice 'C' are elective classes which are offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience and acclimation to the trial situation or would like to earn additional titles. Dogs may be entered in the Novice – Intermediate (CDI) and/or Novice 'C' class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial Classes.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE CLASS – This class shall be for all purebred dogs and those breeds as designated on the list of miscellaneous breeds and of either sex, which have earned the title of (CD) Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any other advanced Obedience title in Canada. A dog eligible for entry in the Open A or B Class at any obedience trial held under these rules is also eligible for entry in the Novice 'C' and Novice Intermediate Class at the same trial. The Novice Intermediate class (CDI) is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to a Companion Dog Excellent title. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs are eligible to compete in this class indefinitely. Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class

OBEDIENCE CLASSIFICATIONS

NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH NOVICE "A" & "B" AT SAME TRIAL NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH OPEN "A" & "B" AT SAME TRIAL NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH UTILITY "A" & "B" AT SAME TRIAL

A CKC, ERN, or a PEN Registration Number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete any of these classes.

<u>NOVICE A</u> - This class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. One dog <u>ONLY</u> may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The exhibitor <u>MUST BE THE OWNER</u> or <u>A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY</u> and <u>MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES</u>. No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its CDX title in Canada or elsewhere shall be allowed to compete in this class, but **MUST COMPETE IN NOVICE B CLASS**. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score will be cancelled.

NOVICE B - This class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD, and may be shown by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class, but must handle each dog in all 6 exerices unless they have 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, they must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises.

<u>OPEN HA & OPEN18A</u> - The Open A classes shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed that has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. One dog <u>ONLY</u> may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The exhibitor <u>MUST BE THE OWNER</u> or <u>A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY</u> and <u>MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES</u>. No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its UD title in Canada but <u>MUST COMPETE IN THE OPEN B CLASS</u>. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score will be cancelled. Open 18A has the same requirements and rules as Open HA except the Long Sit is replaced with Change of Positions Exercises and the Long Down is replaced with a Group Sit-Walk around.

<u>OPEN HB & 18B</u> – The Open B classes shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD or CDX or higher, and may be shown by the owner or any other person. This dog *MAY ALSO COMPETE IN THE UTILITY CLASS*. A person may enter more than one dog in this class, but must handle each dog in all 7 exerices unless they have 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, they must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed for Open HB and Open 18B and which sequence of positions is to be performed in the Change of Positions exercise in the Open 18B class. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class.

<u>UTILITY CLASS A</u> - This class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of UD. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. This dog must be shown by the owner or a member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score will be cancelled.

<u>UTILITY CLASS B</u> - This class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX or UD dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class.

NON-REGULAR/UNOFFICIAL OBEDIENCE CLASSES

ALL DOGS ENTERED IN A NON-REGULAR CLASS MUST ALSO BE ENTERED IN A REGULAR CLASS OR FOR EXHIBITION ONLY ON THE SAME DAY.

<u>BRACE CLASS</u> -This class is open to any two dogs that have earned the title of CD or higher. It is not necessary that the same person owns both dogs, nor that they be the same breed, **EXCEPT when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial...** Same person need not own both dogs. <u>TEAM CLASS</u> -This class is open to any four dogs that have earned the title of CD or higher. It is not necessary that the same person owns both dogs, nor that they be the same breed, **EXCEPT when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial**. Same person need not own both dogs. <u>VETERANS CLASS</u>- This class shall be for all dogs that have an obedience title and are 7 years old prior to the closing of entries. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the "Novice Class". DOGS ENTERED IN THE VETERANS CLASS <u>MAY ALSO BE</u> ENTERED IN ANY REGULAR CLASS OR FOR EXHIBITION ONLY

<u>GRADUATE NOVICE CLASS</u> - is open to any dog that has not earned a qualifying score toward the CDX title, but which has obtained the title of CD prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises.

<u>GRADUATE OPEN CLASS</u> - is open to any dog that has not earned a qualifying score toward the UD title, but which has obtained the title of CDX prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises.

<u>VERSATILITY CLASS</u> is open to any dog that has attained the title of CDX and at least 1 qualifying score towards the Utility title, prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. More than one dog may be entered in this class. <u>WILD CARD CLASSES</u>: No title is required for entry in any Wild Card class, but any dog entered must be capable of performing the exercises required at the class level in which it is entered. The owner or any other person my handle dogs in these classes. A person may enter more than one dog in any of these classes.

Juvenile Sweepstakes is open to all dogs three months and under eighteen months of age regardless of place of birth. All dogs must be entered in a regular class in the regular show on the same day. Dogs will be judged in one of the following eight classes (divided by sex):

Baby Puppy - 3 months and under 6 months
Junior puppy - 6 months and under 9 months
Senior Puppy - 9 months and under 12 months
12 months to 18 months - 12 months and under 18 months

For final judging the first place puppy from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes and Best Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 50% of total fees collected Best Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes - rosette & 25% of total fees collected Flat ribbons for 1st thru 4th in each class 25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

Veteran Sweepstakes - following the Juvenile Sweepstakes

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all dogs 7 years of age and over and entered in a regular breed class or for exhibition only.

Spayed and neutered dogs may compete provided they are also entered in exhibition only.

Dogs to be judged in one of the following four classes (divided by sex):

7 years and under 10 years 10 years and over

For final judging the first place winner from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes and Best Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 50% of total fees collected Best Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes - rosette & 25% of total fees collected Flat ribbons for 1st thru 4th in each class 25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

JUNIOR HANDLING - Following Conformation Classes

Entries will be accepted at the show secretary's desk up to one hour prior.

The following classes will be provided:

Pee Wee (non-competitive) - 4 to 6 years Junior Novice - 7 to 10 years Junior Open - 7 to 10 years Intermediate Novice - 11 to 14 years Intermediate Open - 11 to 14 years Senior Novice - 15 to 18 years Senior Open - 15 to 18 years

Note: Pee Wees do not compete for best overall.

Competition is open to all Junior Handlers between the ages of 4 and up to 18 years of age (of the competition year). Dogs handled by the juniors must be entered in a Regular Conformation class or in Exhibition Only on Sunday. Dogs do not need to be owned by the junior.

Pee Wees - a participant ribbon and prize

Best Overall Handler - rosette and prize

First in each class - ribbon and prize

Please note that effective January 1, 2016, in accordance with Section 3.4.1 of the Junior Handling Rules & Regulations, Junior Handlers will be required to apply to CKC Head Office for a **Junior Handling Number**. Section 3.4.1 "Junior Handler with the exception of Pee Wees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number within 30 days of competing in their first Junior Handling event. This Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handling number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked."

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from: The CKC, 400 200 Ronson Dr., Etobicoke, ON M9W 5Z9 or online at www.ckc.ca

- 1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
- 3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
- 5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
- 6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are Pacific Time.
- 7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
- 8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 plus GST which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
- 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
- 10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
- 11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- 12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

FIRE SAFETY RULES:

Extension cords may not be laid across an aisle.

Power bars are not permitted.

Aisles must be kept open at all times to allow everyone easy and speedy exit in case of emergency.

All designated FIRE LANES must be kept clear at all times or vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

ADDITIONAL CLUB RULES:

Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Crates will be allowed at ringside during the judging of your specific breed only and must be removed immediately after. No Exceptions.

Dogs are not allowed in washrooms and must be on leash at all times on the show grounds or within the show building with the exception of the obedience rings.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the days of these shows.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or venders/concessions. The Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

The club reserves the right of restricting exhibitors grooming space.

Plastic sheeting must be under all exercise pens.

Dogs must be exercised in the grass areas to the West of Hall 1. Dogs may not relieve themselves on or near the building. Failure to observe this rule may result in dismissal.

Any tape used in the building has to be easily removable and must be removed after the show is completed. Colored tape is not allowed. You must leave your setup in the same clean condition you found it in when you first arrived at the show.

No liquid waste is to be disposed of in garbage cans. Exhibitors must use the garbage bins provided outside the building.

All RV units must have buckets underneath for their sink drains. Anyone found discharging water on the grounds will be removed by order of the Health Department and may be subject to a fine.

No catering of any kind is permitted.

Grooming in not allowed in the Obedience benching area.

Any videographer or photographer, other than the official videographer/photographer, that is going to take pictures/videos, for which they will be paid, will require written permission from the Renaissance Dog Assoc. Show Committee and the official show videographer/photographer.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.



A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN).

AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Renaissance Dog Association and the Boxer Club of Canada, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.


