- 1. All entries must be received by the closing date and time, accompanied by the proper entry fees and submitted on an official CKC entry form. **Please type or print clearly.**
- INCOMPLETE ENTRIES WILL BE RETURNED. Agents and handlers please note that full name and address of owners <u>MUST</u> be filled in and to whom ID's are to be returned. (Section 13.1.2, Dog Show Rules)
- 3. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom entries were made.
- 4. To comply with CKC regulations, we will be unable to accept or substitute any entry reaching the Show Secretary after the date and time.

5. Only dogs entered may enter these shows. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.

All entries paid by credit card or debit card or etransfer MUST be done via The Entry Line.

REFUND POLICY - COVID & OTHERWISE If, due to Covid, these trials are not able to be held: refunds will be issued to exhibitors - Minus any costs incurred by HKC. Entry line WILL NOT REFUND SERVICE FEES. If because of an act of God, riot or civil disobedience, extreme weather event, governmental orders, regulations or decree (other than Covid related), or other acts or circumstances beyond the control of the HKC, it is impossible to open or complete the Trials, no refund of entry fees will be made.

NO POST DATED CHEQUES accepted. ALL NSF cheques are subject to a charge of \$20.00.

N.S.F. Cheques are considered Non-Payment of entry fees and are punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. All fees must be paid before the show.

Attention Foreign exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor.

Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At **Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank** drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you



ATTENTION ALL CANADIANS WHO ARE NOT CKC MEMBERS

Effective January 1, 2011, the CKC has instituted an annual Non-Member Participation Fee for awards and titles for a CANADIAN non-member of the CKC. These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by a non-CKC member and are not applicable to CKC members. Non CKC member participants must either purchase a CKC membership or pay the non-member participation fee within 30 days of notification or the CKC will cancel any awards and titles. Temporary Competition Number (TCN) - Effective March 2, 2020

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN).

There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN.

TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number. If your dog does not have a registration number or ERN and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, scores or awards, before applying for a TCN online, exhibitors are encouraged to check their dog's profiles to determine if the CKC has already created a TCN for that dog. There will be a tab called TCN Dogs in the owner's Portal account.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Novice A & B, Open A (H & 18) & B (H & 18), Utility A & B, (Pre-Novice, Novice C and Novice Intermediate) Separate entries are required for each class entered and jump heights must be stated.

RALLY OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Novice A & B, Intermediate, Advanced A & B, Excellent A & B, Master Rally Ring Size is 40x60.

Separate entries are required for each class entered and jump heights must be stated.

Mixed-breed and unrecognized – breed dogs (purebred from CKC recognized registries may compete in Obedience and Rally Obedience Trials. To compete, the dogs must have a Canine Companion Number.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Events Registration Number (ERN)

To obtain an ERN number simply do the following:

- 1. Send a photocopy of the dog's registration certificate reflecting current ownership, for example AKC Registration Certificate with a written request for an ERN number.
- 2. Include with the above a cheque or money order in the amount currently required payable to the Canadian Kennel Club.
- 3. Ensure that you provide us with your full return address to enable the ERN number to be sent to you.
- 4. Faxed requests will be accepted. Please indicate your Visa/MasterCard number expiry date, cardholders name and signature.

This Event Registration Number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Dogs may be entered as "LISTED", however, failure to apply for an ERN number within 30 days will result in cancellation of any wins, awards or scores. Please forward your request to:

A class dog awarded Best in Show at an All Breed Championship Show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points won at the Breed or Group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five points at a single show.

Grand Champions and GCH Points Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. **15.2.2** Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. **Section 15.2.3** To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

Best of Breed at a Specialty Show (other than National)

c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GRAND CHAMPION EXCELLENT AND GCHEX POINTS The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).

b)three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.

c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

All exhibitors are responsible for their dog's cleanup anywhere on the show site and area.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. The Halifax Kennel Club will use all due care and diligence for the safety and welfare of the dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible in the event of an accident to dogs or exhibitors.
- 2. The Superintendent will be in complete charge of these Shows.
- 3. It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. (Section 19.7 Dog Show Rules)
- 4. No person may approach a judge directly or otherwise, orally or in writing to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act. (Section 4.1.6, Dog Show Rules)
- 5. The Halifax Kennel Club will not be responsible for any equipment left on the show premises.
- 6. No Public Catalogue will be available. Know your numbers when picking up armbands.
- 7. Do Not leave personal belongings at ringside.
- 8. Do Not leave masks, gloves, water bottles, litter, etc behind. Dispose of these items in the garbage bins provided.
- 9. Avoid common use of pens/pencils.
- 10. Clean Up after your dogs.
- 11. No same day entries will be offered for Rally and Obedience.

COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOL FOR HALIFAX KC 2021 SHOWS

- If you cannot comply with these rules Please Do Not Enter or Attend!
- THERE WILL BE A ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY ON COVID-19 VIOLATIONS INCLUDING NOT WEARING A MASK OR NOT SOCIAL DISTANCING WHEN IT IS POSSIBLE until such time as Provincial Government of Nova Scotia lifts such restrictions.
- Show Site Access: Waiver must be completed by all who are attending the show. These will be collected as you arrive at the show site. An attendance wristband will be provided at this time only.
- The Dog Show is **NOT OPEN** to the General Public.
- MANDATORY: MASKS MUST BE WORN correctly over mouth and nose by Exhibitors, Judges and Stewards in the rings during judging and in the ring ready area.
- MANDATORY MASKS MUST ALSO BE WORN in all indoor areas such as Washrooms and indoor rings.
- MANDATORY SOCIAL DISTANCING will be required in the rings, adjacent ring areas, at the Show Secretary Table and at the Photographer's Set-up.
- There will be:
- Mandatory Designated RV Parking vehicles must be parked 2 metres (6 feet) apart
- Mandatory Designated Vehicle Day Parking vehicles must be parked 2 metres (6 feet) apart
- The Club will provide hand sanitizing stations at the building entrance/exit and at all rings. There will be a Limited supply of masks in case someone needs one.
- Grooming tables and ramps used in the rings will be cleaned frequently.
- Equipment used to measure or weigh dogs will be sanitized after each use.
- Grooming will be outside at your parking space.
- Handlers may have a maximum of two assistants.
- Exhibitors entering the building to show their own dogs are limited to the individual showing the dog NO assistants.
- The use of ALL forced air dryers or fans is PROHIBITED on site.
- Exhibitors will be granted access to the site one hour prior to their ring time. When an exhibitor is finished showing for the day, they must leave the site, WITH ALL THEIR EQUIPMENT.
- Each ring will have an Entrance, an Exit and Social Distancing markers. Exhibitors will pick up their placement ribbons as they exit the ring and there will be NO RECYCLING of ribbons.
- Exhibitors are encouraged to return to their set up immediately after they have exhibited their dog.
- There is to be no switching of dogs, exchanging of armbands at ringside. The original handler must stay on the dog through breed judging with the exception of handlers with breed dogs and their "assistants".
- Frequent Hand Washing is encouraged. All exhibitors are encouraged to bring sanitizer with them. There will be hand sanitizer at ring side.
- Note that these protocols are subject to change depending on Nova Scotia Public Health restrictions at the time of the Shows. https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/restrictions-and-guidance
