CONFORMATION CLASSES

REGULAR CONFORMATION CLASSES (divided by sex):

<u>JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS</u> - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

<u>SENIOR PUPPY CLASS</u> - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 TO 18 MONTHS - Shall be for dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the Specialty.

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs and shall be divided as follows:

VETERANS CLASS: Shall be for all dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the Specialty. SPAYED OR NEUTERED DOGS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR COMPETITION IN THIS CLASS. Classes will be divided into 7 – 9 years of age on the day of the show and 9 years and older on the day of the show

<u>SPECIALS ONLY CLASS</u> - This class shall be for any dog which has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog MAY be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED. Listing Fees WILL NOT be refunded

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

NON-REGULAR CONFORMATION CLASSES:

Note: Any dog entered in a Non-Regular class MUST also be entered in a regular class or for Exhibition Only.

STUD DOG & GET: This class shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership in this class need not be identical. Stud must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular Class. Dogs entered in the Stud Dog and Get class may be spayed/neutered, and must be entered in a Regular class as outlined in these rules or for Exhibition Only.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY: This class shall have the same requirements as the Stud Dog and Get class. Dogs entered in the Brood Bitch and Progeny class may be spayed/neutered, and must be entered in a Regular class as outlined in these rules or for Exhibition Only.

BRACE CLASS: Shall be for two dogs (not necessarily the same sex), (Note: effective January 1, 2006 – identical ownership NO LONGER applies). Spayed or neutered dogs may compete in this class but must be entered in a REGULAR conformation class or for exhibition only

FIELD DOG CLASS – shall be for a dog of either sex which has received a placement, or Certificate of Merit or a judge's Award of Merit in an official class in an licensed Field Trial in Canada or the USA; or which has received a Field Test pass or title under the rules of the CKC or an AKC Hunt test pass or title. Winner does NOT complete for Best of Breed. PARADE OF TITLEHOLDERS/CHAMPIONS: is open to Irish Setters of either sex which have attained a Canadian Championship and/or a Canadian Performance Title. Dogs

entered in Parade of Titleholders must also be entered in a **REGULAR** Class or for **EXHIBITION ONLY**

<u>PARADE OF VETERANS</u>: is open to Irish Setters of either sex aged 7 years or older on October 6, 2012. Dogs entered in Parade of Veterans must also be entered in a **REGULAR** Class or for **EXHIBITION ONLY**

ALTERED CLASSES

Are open to Irish Setters of either sex, over 6 months of age on Oct 6, 2012 which have been sexually altered by veterinarian procedure. Altered dog Championship points will be awarded as per Section 15

OBEDIENCE CLASSES (For Irish Setters Only)

REGULAR OBEDIENCE CLASSES

NOVICE "A" - This class is open to all dogs, providing the dog has not earned the title of "CD" in ANY COUNTRY. One dog ONLY may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The exhibitor MUST BE THE OWNER or A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY and MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES. No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its "UD" title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete in this class, but MUST COMPETE IN THE NOVICE "B" CLASS

NOVICE "B" - This class is open to all dogs which have not earned the title of "CD", and may be shown by the owner or any other person. The dog may not necessarily be CKC or ERN Reg'd to compete in this class

<u>OPEN "A"</u> - This class is open to all dogs which have earned the title of "CD" IN CANADA, but have not earned the title of "CDX" in any country. One dog ONLY may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The exhibitor MUST BE THE OWNER or A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY and MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES. No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its "UD" title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete, but MUST COMPETE IN THE OPEN "B" CLASS. A CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

<u>OPEN "B"</u> - This class is open to all dogs which have earned the title of "CD" in CANADA, and may be shown by the owner or any other person. This dog MAY ALSO COMPETE IN THE UTILITY CLASS. A CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

<u>UTILITY CLASS A</u>-shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which shall have earned the title of CDX in Canada. Dogs in this class must be handled or exhibited by the owner or immediate family member. However, the same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person that has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may NOT handle in this class

<u>UTILITY CLASS B</u>-shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which shall have earned the title of CDX in Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. However, the same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

TRANSITION CLASSES

PRE-NOVICE CLASS shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which have not earned the title of P.C.D. (Pre-Companion Dog) in

Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class and must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercise. A dog may be entered in the Pre-Novice that has not earned the title of C.D. in Canada or a comparable title in

any other country. The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to the Novice Classes.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE CLASS shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex that have earned the title of (C.D.) Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog and any other advanced obedience title in Canada. A dog eligible for entry in the Open A or B Class at any obedience trial held under these rules is also eligible for entry in the Novice C and Novice Intermediate Class at the same trial. The Novice Intermediate class (C.D.I.) is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to a Companion Dog Excellent title. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs are eligible to compete in this class indefinitely. Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

NOVICE "C" is open to any dog of either sex that has gained the title Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any other advanced Obedience title in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than one dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit and the Long Down Exercises when they are judged in the same group. The Novice "C" exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice Class except that exhibitors may compete in the Novice "C" Class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice "C" Class are not eligible for High In Trial. The P.C.D and C.D.I and Novice "C" are elective classes which are offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience and acclimation to the trial situation or would like to earn additional titles. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate (C.D.I) and/or Novice "C" in addition to any one of the Official Classes or Unofficial Classes.

UNOFFICIAL CLASSES

GRADUATE NOVICE is open to any dog that has not earned a qualifying score toward the C.D.X. title, but has obtained the title of C.D prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered.

GRADUATE OPEN is open to any dog that has not earned a qualifying score toward the U.D. title, but which has obtained the title of C.D.X. prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered.

VETERAN OBEDIENCE shall be for any dog that has earned the title of C.D. or higher and is 7 years old or older on the day of the trial. **NOTE:** Dogs entered in the Veterans Class must also be entered in any Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

VERSATILITY CLASS is open to any dog of either sex that has attained the title of C.D.X. in Canada and at least 1 leg on the Utility title, or that has obtained the title of U.D. in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. Owners may enter more than 1 dog in this class. Six exercises will be performed, these to be selected from the individual exercises of the official Novice, Open and Utility Classes, 2 from each class. There will be no group exercises. These exercises will be performed and judged as specified for the Regular Classes.

BRACE CLASS is open to any 2 dogs of any breed and of either sex that has attained not less than a C.D. title in Canada. It is not necessary that the same person own both dogs, nor that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial. The Brace Class is performed and judged in the same manner as the Novice Class. The 2 dogs shall be hitched together with a brace chain or coupling and are judged on the performance of the 2 dogs as though they were one. Exhibitors may enter more than one brace in this class, but must have a separate handler for each brace in the Long Sit and Long Down Exercises when judged in the same group.

TEAM OBEDIENCE is open to any 4 dogs of any breed that have earned the title of C.D. or higher. It is not necessary that the same person own all dogs in the team or that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial.

© Dogs entered in NON-REGULAR/UNOFFICIAL CLASSES MUST be entered in a Regular/Official class or for "Exhibition Only".

A dog awarded WINNERS at a Championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5), and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder. SECTION #2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

DOGS COMPETING*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
POINTS AWARDED	0	1	2	3	4	5

^{*}includes the dog awarded Winners

To determine the number of points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all dogs in competition which were defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with 5 points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified or that is dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge, shall be included in the calculation for championship points (Absentees are not to be included). In order for a dog to be recognized as a Canadian Champion it must: (1) earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; (2) a two point win awarded either at the breed or group level; and (3) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN)

EXTRACTS FROM THE CONFORMATION SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

JUDGES - SECTION 4.1.3

A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see this rule is effectively carried out.

SHOW OFFICIALS - SECTION 5.1.5

A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent.

ENTRY FORMS - SECTION 8.2.3

Entry forms received by the CKC, which are incomplete and/or contain incorrect information may result in awards being cancelled.

ENTRY FORMS - SECTION 8.2.5

An error in an age-specified class, the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

ENTRIES - SECTION 8.3.1

Every dog entered in a conformation show must be one of the following:

- a. registered with the CKC
- b. have an Event Registration Number
- c. eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d. if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN)

REFUSAL OF ENTRIES - SECTION 8.6.2

A Club may refuse any entry form from an exhibitor known to have tendered a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card unless entries are accompanied by cash, money order or certified cheque.

DISQUALIFICATIONS - SECTION 14.1.4

Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by the dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.

RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

MADE.

- 1. THE CLUB RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REMOVE ANY PERSON FROM THE SHOW. THE SHOW SUPERINTENDENT SHALL HAVE FULL CONTROL OF THESE SHOWS AND TRIALS. WHICH WILL BE GOVERNED BY CKC RULES.
- 2. ANY DOG EXCUSED BY THE SHOW SUPERINTENDENT OR VETERINARIAN FOR ANY REASON SHALL NOT, COMPETE IN ANY CLASS FOR ANY AWARDS FOR THE BALANCE OF THE SHOW.
- 3. THE SHOW COMMITTEE WILL USE DUE CARE AND DILIGENCE FOR THE WELFARE OF DOGS AND EXHIBITORS, BUT WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR, OR ASSUME ANY LIABILITY IN THE EVENT OF ACCIDENT OR MISFORTUNE TO EITHER DOGS, EXHIBITORS, SPECTATORS OR VENDORS.
- 4. DOGS MUST BE ON THE GROUNDS 1 HOUR PRIOR TO THE JUDGING OF THEIR BREED. 5. THE OWNER OF A DOG ENTERED IN THESE SHOWS IS ENTIRELY RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY ERROR IN ENTERING HIS/HER DOG REGARDLESS OF HOW OR BY WHOM THE ENTRY WAS
- 6. EXHIBITORS AND HANDLERS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR DOGS AND EQUIPMENT LEFT AT THE SHOW GROUNDS.
- 7. DOGS ARE TO BE EXERCISED IN DESIGNATED AREAS ONLY, NOT IN VICINITY OF SHOW RINGS
- 8. ALL REACREATIONAL UNITS WILL HAVE BUCKETS UNDERNEATH FOR THEIR SINK DRAINS. ANYONE FOUND DISCHARGING WATER ON THE GROUNDS WILL BE REMOVED BY ORDER OF THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT, AND MAY BE SUBJECT TO A FINE.
- 9. IF, BECAUSE OF CIVIL DISTURBANCE OR OTHER ACTS BEYOND THE CONTROL OF THE CLUB, IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO OPEN OR COMPLETE THE SHOW, THERE IS NO REFUND OF ENTRY.
- 10. DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH AT ALL TIMES ON THE SHOW GROUNDS with the exception of the Obedience ring.

ALL EXHIBITORS. HANDLERS AND PATRONS ARE EXPECTED TO KNOW AND ABIDE BY THE CKC DOG SHOW RULES
