If you are unable to provide a CKC individual registration number, the TCN fee must accompany your entry. Entry fees include GST.

Please complete one entry per dog, per class Dogs entered in an unofficial class must also be entered in an official class or "Exhibition only"

NOTE! No entry will be accepted without entry fees. OVERPAYMENT of entry fees will not be refunded. To comply with CKC, entries will not be accepted, altered, cancelled, or substituted after the official closing date and time for entries (except as provided for in 8.9.1 of the Dog Show Rules). Telephone entries cannot be accepted except in the event of a postal strike. In that event please contact the Show Secretary (Kathy McLaughlin 780-814-3665)

FOREIGN EXHIBITORS: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank You

ERN NOTICE: All dogs that are foreign born and owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an ERN. An ERN must be obtained within 30 days of obtaining points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation. If factors beyond your control prohibit this or present a problem, please send a written request for a 30 day extension to the CKC. Temporary Competition Numbers

All dogs entered in CKC events that are not CKC registered must have a Temporary Competition Number (TCN) before entering into the event(s). This includes Baby Puppies in Conformation shows. Please note that Listed Breeds are not eligible for a TCN (effective July 6, 2021, this includes Baby Puppies). Listed Breeds must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) before entering into an event. The Conformation Show Rules will be updated in this regard.

REGULAR CLASSES

The following CKC classes (divided by sex; except Specials Only) will be provided:

JUNIOR PUPPY - Dogs between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show.

SENIOR PUPPY - Dogs between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show.

12 – 18 MONTHS - Dogs between 12 months and under 18 months on day of show.

CANADIAN BRED - Dogs born in Canada, Champions of any country are excluded.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR- Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder for this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS - For all dogs

VETERAN CLASS - For all dogs over 7 years of age on day of show. These dogs will compete for regular class placements and the winner of this class will go on to compete for BEST OF BREED (they do not compete for Winners). Dogs in this class may be spayed/neutered.

SPECIALS ONLY - Dogs who are Canadian Champions. A CKC Registration Number or ERN must be indicated on the entry form at time of closing.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

All dogs must be entered in the Regular Classes or for Exhibition Only to compete in the following Non-Regular classes. Dogs may be spayed or neutered.

EXHIBITION ONLY - Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades if provided for in this premium list.

EXHIBITION ONLY - (4-6 MONTHS)

Puppies 4-6 months of age may be entered in Exhibition only 4-6 Months, provided the owner(s) has entered a dog in a Regular Official Class. These Puppies may not participate in any regular, non-regular or unofficial classes or Parades. However, these puppies may compete in Sweepstakes if a 4-6 month class is offered.

BABY PUPPY CLASS – Dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed Best Baby Puppy in Group Best Baby Puppy in Show

STUD DOG & GET - Stud Dog and two or more of his get. Stud Dog and Get must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition only.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY - Brood Bitch and two or more of her Progeny. Same stipulations as for Stud Dog and Get.

**We are pleased to present a special memorial ribbon "In Memory of "
Siu Ling Han (1963–2016)
along with our Best in Specialty Show ribbon.**



Siu Ling Han was a wildlife biologist, devoted qimuksiᑭti (musher), and passionate advocate for the Canadian Inuit Dog, the historic Arctic working breed known as the Canadian Eskimo Dog.

Born in Munich, Germany on January 22, 1963, she came to Canada as an infant and grew up in Montreal and Ottawa. Her love of the natural world began early as a Junior Forest Ranger in Thunder Bay that led her to complete a Master of Science in Biology at the University of

Waterloo. As an ecologist with the Government of Canada, she contributed to the Northern Contaminants Program, drafting international protocols addressing Persistent Organic Pollutants in the Arctic. She also participated in research on 200-year-old hydrocarbon deposits on the Agassiz Ice Cap on Ellesmere Island — work reflecting her deep commitment to protecting fragile northern ecosystems.

In 1998, she moved to Iqaluit to live and work in the North. Over the years, Siu Ling has worked to raise awareness about the heritage and significance of the Canadian Inuit Dog and the knowledge of Inuit who have lived and travelled with these dogs for generations. She continued to share her experiences and insights in order to support the preservation and appreciation of this remarkable Arctic partnership between people, land, and dog.

In 1999, she established her first team of Inuit Dogs — Atsuli, Aiviq, and Fiddich — entrusted to her by experienced Iqaluit dog teamers. She went on to breed, raise, and train her dogs with exceptional dedication, honouring Inuit traditions and the working heritage of the breed, guided by the historical significance of this remarkable Arctic working breed. She ensured her puppies were thoughtfully socialized, and that her retired dogs lived out their years in comfort and care. To her, every dog was family.

A passionate and accomplished qimuksiᑭti, she travelled extensively across Baffin Island, participating in races and undertaking long-distance expeditions.

In 2009, six years after her cancer diagnosis, Siu Ling completed a remarkable 1,000-kilometre expedition along the east coast of Baffin Island from Qikiqtarjuaq to Pond Inlet with her team of ten dogs — a testament to her resilience, skill, and profound bond with her team.

Siu Ling Han passed away in Ottawa on August 29, 2016. Her legacy lives on in the dogs and their descendants who continue to run across Arctic ice, and in the community of mushers who honour her memory with every journey.

Non-member participation fee

- a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.
- b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled
- c) These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members."

EXTRACTS FROM CONFORMATION SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

4.7.1 A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty, and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

Show Officials 5.1.6

The officials of a show-giving club will be held responsible for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators during the show. Any person acting in an objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent.

ENTRY FORMS – SECTION 8.1.3

Entry forms received by the CKC that are incomplete and/or contain incorrect information may result in awards being cancelled.

ENTRY FORMS – SECTION 8.1.5

An error in an age-specified class, the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

ENTRIES - SECTION 8.3.1

Every dog entered in a conformation show must be one of the following:

- a. registered with the CKC
- b. have an Event Registration Number
- c. eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d. Listed breeds must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

REFUSAL OF ENTRIES – SECTION 8.5.2

A Club may refuse any entry form from an exhibitor known to have tendered a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card unless entries are accompanied by cash, money order or certified cheque.

DISQUALIFICATIONS – SECTION 14.1.4

Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. A dog disqualified under Section 14.1.2 (b) is not eligible for reinstatement.



CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 - 5	6 - 9	10 - 12	13 +
Points Awarded	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the Group level.

15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.

15.1.10 Permission shall be granted a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a specialty for that breed or group.

15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners that also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion and its owner provided with a championship certificate, the dog must: (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges; (b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN) or have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN); (c) have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

15.1.13 The Board interprets the words “earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges” to mean: (a) Three (3) or more Winners awards at not less than three (3) different shows, under three (3) different judges at the breed level; (b) each of the three (3) judge’s awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing; (c) all points required for championship status may be earned at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Opposite Sex, Best of Breed or group placing.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from the CKC, 400 200 Ronson Dr., Etobicoke, ON M9W 5Z9

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
6. **DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING.** The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are **MDT**
7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 plus GST which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog **BEFORE** taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.
13. The Club has a zero tolerance of abuse of any description involving any person involved with these shows, including spectators.

AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Battle River Canine Association, Canadian Eskimo Dog National Club of Canada, their members, directors, governors, officers,

agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog

by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.
