WHAT IS THE CHASE ABILITY PROGRAM (CAP) TEST?

This exciting event, developed after the popular Lure Coursing allows dogs to uncover their natural prey drive through chasing a lure. Most dogs, big and small really enjoy this activity. The Chase Ability Test also provides both purebreds and mixed breed dogs with the opportunity to compete and earn multiple titles and certificates in a field event that all dogs are capable of performing.

Two lengths of courses will be available: One for dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers or brachycephalic dogs and another for the remainder of dogs entered. The Chase Ability program is a Pass/Fail test. How does your dog earn a Pass? The dog must run alone, chasing the lure and complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption.

300 YARD COURSE:

This distance is for dogs shorter than 14 inches at the withers or brachycephalic (flat faced) dogs.

The CKC has determined the following breeds are brachycephalic.

- Affenpinscher
- Boston Terrier
- Boxer
- Brussels Griffon
- Bulldog (all breeds)
- Chihuahua - Apple-Headed
- Chow Chow
- English Toy Spaniel
- Japanese Chin
- Lhasa Apso
- Pekingese
- Pug
- Shih Tzu
- Shar-Pei
- Tibetan Spaniel

600 YARD COURSE:

This distance is used for all dogs that do not run the 300 yard course.

IF THERE IS A QUESTION AS TO WHICH COURSE A DOG SHALL RUN THE JUDGE SHALL DECIDE.

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS:

The Chase Ability Program participation is open to all purebred and mixed-breed dogs at least 12 months of age that are:

- Individually registered with the CKC, or
- Have an Event Registration Number (ERN), or
- Have a Performance Event Number (PEN), or
- Have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed, or
- Have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) if a mixed breed, or
- Have a TCN Registration Number (TCN) if eligible for Registration – TCN (Listing) Fee required.

Dogs with Breed disqualifications are eligible to enter.

Females in season may not enter.

A dog may only enter once per test.

Dogs run in singles (by themselves).

The CAP is an athletic pursuit that requires your dog to be in very good condition. If in the opinion of the Test Committee, any entry is found to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season, it shall not be allowed to compete and the entry fees shall be refunded.

COURSE PLAN:

The club reserves the right to alter the course plans as required by weather and/or field conditions on the day of the test. The course will be reversed for the second test of the day. Field is mowed grass.

RIBBONS: Gold Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to dogs passing their test.

TITLES:

Dogs can earn the following titles by participating the Chase Ability Program:

- Chase Ability (CA)
 - Awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability test three (3) times under at least two different judges.
- Chase Ability Excellent (CAX)
 - Awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability test a total of ten (10) times
 - (CA plus 7 additional passes)
- Chase Ability Excellent 2 (CAX2)
 - Awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability test a total of twenty (20) times
 - (CAX plus 10 additional passes). For every further 10 passes the dog may add a higher number after the CAX (CAX3, CAX 4 etc.).

All rules governing these tests are available on the CKC website.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS:

- There will be a \$10.00 fine for dogs loose on the field or in the area of the event other than the dog(s) running the course.
- Lamé dogs or bitches in season will be excused and their entry refunded, provided notice is given prior to or during roll call.
- Dogs not present at roll call shall be scratched with no refunds. **No exceptions.**
- A veterinary clinic is located in Portage La Prairie.
- There is plenty of parking. Bathrooms available.
- Lots of room for crates but bring shade for your dogs and plenty of water.
- People are expected to clean up after their dogs and themselves. There will be a \$10.00 fine for being caught NOT cleaning up after their dogs.
- No food or beverages will be provided by MGA. Please ensure you bring water for your dog and water/snacks for yourself.

DIRECTIONS TO THE FIELD:

Travelling West from Winnipeg:

Head west on Trans Canada Highway #1 towards Portage La Prairie for approximately 55 km. (From West Perimeter).

Turn left onto Hwy 13 (south). There are signs for Oakville/Carman.

After 2.5 km turn right (west) onto HWY 331. There is a sign for Newton.

Park entrance on the left hand side (south) very near the intersection.
