**MEET AT HEADQUARTERS – CHECK IN TIME WILL BEGIN AT 7:15 AM.**

The Wild Rose Hunting Retriever Club is a member in good standing of the Canadian National Master Retriever Club. As of July 1, 2010, only passes at Hunt Tests hosted by member clubs in good standing with the Canadian National Master Retriever Club are considered in determining eligibility to enter the National Master Hunt Test Stake.

**Cost \$12 for burgers and hotdogs with all the trimmings**

**RIBBON PRESENTATION to follow test each day**

**Qualifying ribbons will be awarded at each stake immediately following its completion**

**TEST GROUNDS:** These grounds are private property. The landowner has generously allowed us to hold our event on their property, so we ask that you respect the grounds. Drive and park as directed while on the land. Clean up after yourself and your dogs. No training on the grounds before, during or after the event. The landowners will not be approached for private / group training.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Copies of the Hunt Test Rules and Regulations are available from the Canadian Kennel Club, 5397 Eglinton Avenue W, Suite 101 Etobicoke, Ontario M9C 5K6. A judge officiating at a hunt test held under these rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the hunt test. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the hunt test to see that this rule is effectively carried out.
2. Entries made online through [dogsgow.ca](http://dogsgow.ca) only.
3. Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of Friday June 28th, 2024 at 6:00 pm. In the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a judge or barred from competition by action of the Test Committee or the Canadian Kennel Club, or because it has been entered incorrectly, or if it is impossible to open or complete the test, no refund of entry will be made.
4. Running order will be available shortly afterwards and posted/emailed to all participants before the tests.
5. Bitches in season shall not be eligible for entry and shall not be allowed on the test grounds.
6. Ducks and pheasants may be used in all stakes. Pigeons may be used for the upland hunting test in the Master Hunt Tests. Wingers may be used in any stake.
7. Tests will be run at separate locations.
8. All throwers, judges and competitors should wear dark or camouflaged clothing.
9. Any dog not appearing within 15 minutes of being called to the line by the Marshall may be disqualified.
10. You are responsible for your own lunch.
11. Entry and TCN fees paid for any dog withdrawn because of estrus, injury, illness or death shall be refunded in full. An appropriate veterinary certificate must be given to the Test Secretary BEFORE the start of the test to qualify for a refund. All other refunds must be requested in writing within 14 days of the event, explaining the reason for the scratch. Scratches will be refunded at the discretion of the Hunt Test Committee, all but a fee of \$15.00.
12. The Wild Rose Hunting Retriever Club and its members will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, BUT will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of an accident, injury or other misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
13. Electric Collars (either dummy or live) as well as prong or pinch type collars shall not be worn by any dog on the test grounds at any time during the event.
14. There shall be no training of dogs on the test grounds, except for single training bumpers, which are thrown by hand by the trainer, within 24 hours of the commencement of the event or anytime during the event.
15. Drive only on designated roads or areas on test grounds and pick up trash.
16. WRHRC reserves the right to substitute and/or replace judges due to circumstances beyond their control.
17. Alcoholic Beverages Are NOT ALLOWED on the Test Grounds during the tests!
18. All qualifying dogs will receive a rosette.

**Temporary Competition Number (TCN):** Owners of unregistered CKC recognized breeds entering events are required to obtain a Temporary Competition Number (TCN). A TCN allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). Dogs not registered in Canada must obtain a TCN before submitting an entry for a hunt test. A TCN fee of \$10.50 (includes GST) must be included with your entry fees. CKC Registration or ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the hunt test or all awards will be canceled.

## **NOTICE TO COMPETITORS AND SPECTATORS**

It shall be the duty and obligation of the event giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at a hunt test held under these regulations, is not subject to any indignities. The Hunt Test Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.”

Any person participating in any capacity at a Hunt Test or Working Certificate Test held under the CKC rules and regulations shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the tests and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Wild Rose Hunting Retriever Club to see that this rule is effectively carried out. On report to the Wild Rose Hunting Retriever Club of an alleged indignity of any kind the Test Chairman will report the infringement to the CKC, and the Test Committee shall forthwith conduct an investigation and shall have the power to take action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.

**WAIVER OF LIABILITY:** The Wild Rose Hunting Retriever Club (WRHRC), the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC), and the owners of the Field Test grounds, and adjoining property are not responsible for any damages and/or injuries sustained to humans, animals, and/or property while on the Hunt Test grounds or traveling to or from the Hunt Test grounds. All participants, spectators, and guests recognize that this is an outdoor gunning event and attend at their own risk and agree to hold harmless CKC, their officers, the Hunt Test Committee, WRHRC, and the Property Owners/Operators from any and all claims of personal property, loss, damages, and/or injury.

### **Notice to All Clubs/Exhibitors - Health Reminders**

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event).
- Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

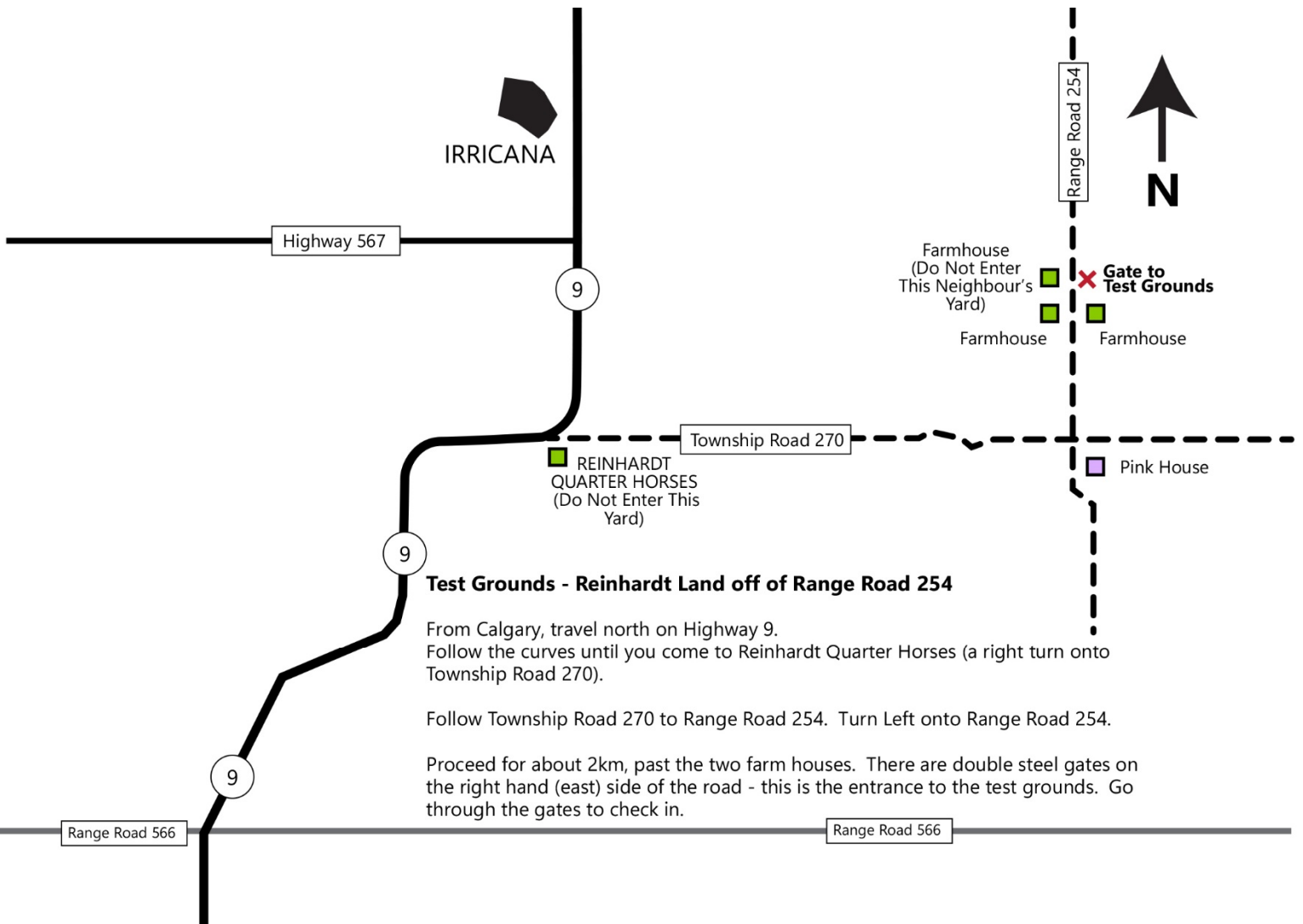

### **Test Grounds - Reinhardt Land off of Range Road 254**

From Calgary, travel north on Highway 9.  
Follow the curves until you come to Reinhardt Quarter Horses (a right turn onto Township Road 270).

Follow Township Road 270 to Range Road 254. Turn Left onto Range Road 254.

Proceed for about 2km, past the two farm houses. There are double steel gates on the right hand (east) side of the road - this is the entrance to the test grounds. Go through the gates to check in.

**Further signs will be posted once you hit the turnoff at Reinhardt Quarter Horses**
