GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Working Certificate Test Rules and Regulations Books are available from the Canadian Kennel Club, 200 Ronson Drive, Suite 400, Etobicoke ON M9W 5Z9.
- 2. Entry fees will not be refunded after 10:00 pm, Wednesday June 29, 2022. In the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a judge or barred from competition by action of the Test Committee or the Canadian Kennel Club, or because it has been entered incorrectly, or if it is impossible to open or complete the test, no refund of entry will be made. Scratches will be refunded fully for a bitch in season, with a veterinarian's certificate. All other scratches will be refunded at the test committee's discretion, other than a fee of \$15.00.
- 3. The TCN Fee per test of \$10.50 must be submitted for any dog without an individual CKC registration number or ERN
- 4. "Day of Event" entries will not be accepted.
- 5. Running order will be determined by random selection after closing date and will be made available the day of the test.
- **6.** Bitches in season shall not be eligible for entry in any Working Certificate Test and shall not be allowed on the test grounds.
- 7. Ducks and/or pheasants will be used on land and ducks will be used for all water tests.
- 8. All Throwers, Judges and Competitors should wear dark or camouflage clothing. Handlers shall not wear white or light clothing at any time, but handlers may wear handling jackets for the blind in the WCX.
- 9. Any dog not appearing within 15 minutes of being called to the line by the Marshall may be disqualified.
- 10. You are responsible for your own lunch.
- 11. Effective Jan.1992, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an event registration number (ERN). Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN number, send a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with cheque or VISA/Mastercard number. Provide your complete address for return of ERN number. Cost \$64.00 (plus GST). ERN numbers must be applied for within 30 DAYS of the FIRST day of entering a CKC event.
- 12. Electric collars (either dummy or live), prong or pinch type collars shall not be worn by any dog on the grounds, at any time during the event.
- 13. There shall be no training of dogs on the test grounds, except for single training bumpers which are thrown by hand by the handler, within 24 hours of the commencement of the event or at any time during the event.
- 14. All exhibitors will be expected to follow all COVID-19 related procedures as indicated by the test committee, Marshals, Judges, and/or GRCA officials.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

Any person participating in any capacity at a Hunt Test or Working Certificate Test held under the CKC rules and regulations shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the tests and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Golden Retriever Club of Alberta to see that this rule is effectively carried out. On report to the Golden Retriever Club of Alberta of an alleged indignity of any kind the Test Chairman will report the infringement to the CKC and the Test Committee shall forthwith conduct an investigation and shall have the power to take action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.

ATTENTION: CANADIAN EXHIBITORS CKC Non-Member Participation Fee

- a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee is \$170.00 + GST.
- b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.
- c) "these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by Canadian resident non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members"



REMINDER TO ALL EXHIBITORS: No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
- 2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- 3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable event.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

To follow current Alberta Health Regulations due to Covid-19 there will be restrictions in place during the event. Please respect the guidelines to ensure we keep everyone safe.

If you have any symptoms DO NOT ATTEND the event.

- 1. Do you have any of the following symptoms:
 - a. A fever
 - b. A cough that is new or different from usual if you have a chronic cough
 - c. A sore throat that is not related to a pre-existing condition
 - d. A runny nose that is not related to a pre-existing condition
 - e. Nasal congestion that is not related to a pre-existing condition
 - f. Shortness of breath that is not related to a pre-existing condition
- 2. Have you travelled internationally within the last 14 days?
- 3. Have you come into contact with individuals who have a confirmed or presumptive diagnosis of COVID-

Any attendees exhibiting symptoms will not be allowed on the grounds.

- All handlers will be notified to go directly to the site of their stake and avoid all congregating in central areas.
- Social distancing practices will be in place. Be mindful when speaking with others.
- Bring your own food and drinks.
- Remove all your garbage from the grounds. There will NOT be garbage bins available.
- Bring your own duck call and whistle. We will NOT supply them.
- You may be required to place the bird in the bucket and/or on the drying rack. Judges will NOT be required to take the bird from the handler but it will be entirely up to the judges discretion as to how this is handled at each stake
- Bring your own mask and gloves (if you choose to wear them). If handlers choose to wear rubber gloves to the line, they must dispose of the gloves after leaving the line and put on new gloves with each ensuing series. If handlers choose to wear a mask to the line, they cannot touch the mask to move it up or down to use their whistle. This is equivalent to touching their face/mouth and MUST sanitize their hands immediately.
- If possible, only the handler of the dog should attend the event. This helps to keep attendance numbers low and reduce the risk.
- A hand hygiene station will be set up at each stake between the last holding blind and the line. The station will include a hand pump bottle of hand sanitizer. Hand hygiene is required to be performed by everyone when:
 - o on their way to the line
 - o after leaving the line
 - o routinely throughout the day

Please bring your own sanitizer for your personal use outside of the stake area.

Commonly touched areas will be cleaned and disinfected as necessary.
