Our Judges



Jason M. Hoke, Wisconsin

Mr. Hoke is a second-generation dog man whose family began in the sport of pure-bred dogs breeding German Shepherds. In the following years Mr. Hoke and his family became successful Great Dane and Dachshund breeders under the Jamara prefix. Along with showing Great Danes as a youth Jason competed regularly in Junior Showmanship. Mr. Hoke then continued his career by becoming a professional all breed handler garnering many top awards in his career in every recognized group.

Mr. Hoke has bred Great Danes, Dachshunds, German Shepherds, Pekingese and Maltese. As a professional handler Mr. Hoke exhibited all breeds and piloted his client's dogs to numerous Best in Show awards and Top Rankings in all seven groups. His dogs have won best of breed at National Specialties, as well as the prestigious Westminster Kennel Club.

Following his career as a professional dog handler, Mr. Hoke began a culinary career and was a chef at many esteemed restaurants such as the 3 Michelin Star, Inn at Little Washington, in Virginia. Currently Mr. Hoke resides in Madison, Wisconsin in the USA. Mr. Hoke was a board member of Show-Safe, a non-profit organization which assists people in the sport who are victims of abuse, as well as fostering leadership development of the youth of our sport.

Mr. Hoke has enjoyed great success in his judging career with appointments throughout the United States and worldwide, judging forty-two other countries. He has had the privilege of being invited to judge the National Specialties for fourteen different breeds, along with the Great Dane National show in six countries. Most notably he judged the Toy Group at the 2016 Westminster Kennel Club as well as the Junior Showmanship Finals at both Westminster, Crufts, and the World Dog Show. In 2022 Jason was nominated for Judge of the Year in the USA. Currently Mr. Hoke is a sitting member of the AKC Board of Directors. Mr. Hoke is still active with Great Danes and is the President of the Great Dane Club of America, sits on the Board of Directors of the Pekingese Club of America as well as being the judge's education committee chair for both clubs along with being the television commentator for Westminster Kennel Club and is a member of Santa Barbara KC, Morris & Essex KC, Chain O'Lakes KC as well as the Great Dane Club of America, The Pekingese Club of America, and The American Whippet Club.

Kim Leblanc, Ontario



Kim Leblanc CV I purchased my first dog, a Siberian Husky male in 1973. He, fortunately for us, was of good enough quality to become our first champion and sired our first litter. That was the beginning of Snowmist Siberians. My timing could not have been better for getting involved in this breed as many of the most famous kennels and their founders were still in existence. My mom and I had a short-lived trial with Alaskan Malamutes and decided they were not for us. But the adventure with other breeds continued and we enjoyed a Newfoundland and a few Salukis. During this time I handled many different breeds. In 1980 my late husband brought American Foxhounds into the picture. I am still actively showing and breeding on a small scale. My kennel (Snowmist Siberians) has been highly successful in Canada and around the world with many BIS winners in various countries. Here at home Snowmist Siberians have topped the charts in the All Breed System as well as at the breed level.

MBIS MBISS MCH Snowmist's Bodacious was my first Siberian to be #1 All Breeds in Canada. What a thrill! To make it even better his daughter MBIS MBISS MRBIS Can GChG GCh Ex Am Ch Snowmist's Taffy RN TDN VN was Canada's #1 Dog 2025 by a wide margin. My late husband and I competed in sled dog races winning our fair share of awards up until the fall of 1996 when family and business commitments forced us to retire. While racing, we actively participated in the Canadian Kennel Clubs Sled Dog Certificate Program earning over 90 titles. In 1993 and 1994 the Siberian Husky Club of Canada awarded our lead dog Northstars Snowmist Birch C.D., S.D.U. the Ward Young Trophy for successfully competing in sled dog racing, showing and obedience within one club year. This was the first time any dog had won this award in back-to-back years. I am a graduate of the canine course Dogs, A Hobby or Profession created by the late Casey Gardiner. Included in this educational program was a course on structure that taught structure based on a measuring process. I have used this process to improve my own knowledge, to help others understand what they see and to evaluate litters of puppies and grown dogs. I have conducted all breed measuring clinics as well as seminars on this topic. Today I am a licensed All Breed Canadian Kennel Club judge. I began my judging career officially in 1994. Since that time I have had the honor of judging at several World Dog Shows, the Euro Dog Show and many other exciting shows around the world. I have been an active member for many years of the all breed club, Barrie Kennel & Obedience Club Inc. I have held such positions as President, Show Chair Person, and Judges Selection Committee. I served as the Canadian Kennel Club Director for Zone 4 - Ontario North from 2004 through 2008. My duties included; Chair of the Canadian Kennel Club Junior Kennel Club Council, past Chair of the Club Relations Committee, member of the Breed Specific Legislation Committee, and Judges Hospitality and Transportation Chair for the Purina National CKC Charity Event.

Carl Liepmann, Michigan



Carl Liepmann's earliest recollection of a purebred dog is about 1945 when the family got a Harlequin Great Dane named "Eric Von Stroheim III." While Eric was never shown, Carl did show a bloodhound and a Collie in 1953 at the Genesee County Kennel Club Show in Flint, Michigan. His first serious "dog ownership" occurred in 1961 during his honeymoon with Jan, when they went to Canton, Ohio to pick up their German Shepherd at a training academy. That started over 60 years of involvement in the dog world.

In 1962 he started his career with the Flint Fire Department, and purchased his first Retriever, a Golden, from breeder Marcia Schlehr of "Kyrie Kennels." This was the beginning of the Liepmann family's love of the Retriever breeds. In 1964, after the birth of daughter Lora, the Liepmann's founded The Flint Retriever Club.

The next two decades were filled with dog activities, including his work as a Professional Handler in Conformation and Obedience, and the opening of a boarding and training kennel called Triple L (for all three Liepmann's). In 1968 they bred their first litter of Labradors. Over the years they produced and owned many Labrador and Golden champions and obedience titleholders, including the Labrador AKC Centennial BOB winner.

In 1980 he was approved to judge the five Retriever breeds and now judges

all Sporting, all Herding, and all Working breeds, Junior Showmanship and BIS. In 1985 he retired from the Flint Fire Department and in 1988 ran for public office and was elected as Treasurer of Flushing Township, a position he held until 2008. He has also served as president of the Genesee County Kennel Club since 1980 and Secretary of the American Dog Show Judges Association (ADSJ) since 1991. He created and designed the "Judge's Ready Reference Calendar", a 5-year planner that has been a popular tool for over 1,000 dog show judges.

Carl started the very successful and locally well-known "Santa Dog Fundraiser" at Bueche's Food World in Flushing in 1983. Every year at Christmas time, he dresses his top Labradors or Golden Retrievers in a Santa suit and sits at the store's entrance encouraging donations and food to the Genesee County Humane Society where he has served on the board of directors since 1974. In 2023, his efforts resulted in over \$20,000 in much needed funds. The 41-year effort will go over \$500,00.00 in 2024.

An avid hunter, he has hunted big game in Newfoundland, Quebec, Manitoba, Michigan, Ohio, Arizona, Montana, and South Carolina. With his retrievers he has hunted waterfowl and upland birds in Ontario, Newfoundland, Manitoba, Michigan, Montana, Louisiana, Alabama, Arkansas, Nebraska, Iowa, and South Dakota.

In 2004, during their 44th year of marriage he lost Jan, the love of his life, after a 2-year battle with Leukemia. Since he and Jan had always been proud of their daughter Lora's music performing and teaching accomplishments, Carl worked to establish the "Jan Liepmann Memorial Scholarship". This scholarship is awarded each year to a Flushing High School graduate who plans to pursue a college vocal music degree.

In 2007, Carl and Lora founded "Show Dog Topiaries", a web-based retail business which specializes in beautiful moss-filled wire art sculptures of many different true-to-the-standard dog breeds.

Carl enjoys spending time with his daughter Lora, his son-in-law David, and their two grown children, Derek and Taylor along with Taylor's two children Sydney and Grant. He also enjoys dining out with his friends. He currently spends most weekdays serving on boards and working with his three dogs, "Gunner", (labrador), and "Birch" and "Winston" (golden retrievers). His many judging assignments have taken him to all 50 states and to more than a dozen different countries around the world. He has had the honor of judging various breeds at the AKC National, including Best in Show, Best Bred-By in Show, the Sporting Group, the Herding Group, and Best Puppy in Show. He has also judged more than 20 national specialties and is especially proud to have judged the Golden Retriever National Specialty in both the United States and Canada.

Nikki Riggsbee, Florida

Nikki Riggsbee is approved to judge all Sporting, Hound, Working, Terrier, Toy, and Non-Sporting breeds and two herding breeds. She is and has been active in both all-breed and specialty clubs for over forty years. She was delegate to the AKC for Manatee Kennel Club for about ten years.

She began showing dogs in 1980 with Norwegian Elkhounds and Great Danes, owner-handling them as long as she was able. Under the affix McEmm, she bred nearly one litter of Great Danes per year on average. She has owned and bred over fifty champions, with many more produced

from her dogs. In addition to conformation, Nikki has exhibited and titled Great Danes in obedience and has involved her dogs in therapy dog work. Her web site is www.mcemn.com.

Professionally, she was a systems architect for Verizon Data Services. Upon retirement, she wrote four books on dogs for Barrons Publishing, on Irish Wolfhounds, Havanese, Bernese Mountain Dogs, and Cocker Spaniels. In 2004, she began writing the award-winning *Breed Priorities* series which began in *Dogs in Review* and is now published in each issue of *Canine Chronicle* magazine. The series has covered over one hundred and fifteen breeds so far, with new ones added each year.

She lives in Valrico, FL, with her partner Kent and three Great Danes.

Doris Willis, Ontario



Doris' love for dogs began early in life with her family's pair of German Shepherds followed by a variety of other breeds. Her appreciation for conformation and pedigrees derived from junior handling of purebred livestock. With marriage came her husband's Doberman which had attained CKC and AKC titles in Tracking and Obedience. "Dandor Kennel" was later developed by Doris, her husband and children, with Cairn Terriers as the primary breed. It expanded over the years to include West Highland White, Sealyham and Cesky Terriers, PBGV's and Golden Retrievers. Dedication to a standard of excellence resulted in numerous champions and multiple awards. She is a member of the CDJA and lifetime member of the CKC. For the first 16 years of retirement her constant companion was a sweet, clever Tibetan Spaniel shown to her Championship by Doris. Besides devoting time to judging, her other loves are gardening, embroidery, sewing, reading, painting and astronomy. Along with judging Rare Breeds, she has enjoyed the honour of assignments in Colombia, Mexico, Australia, New Zealand, Argentina and USA. She looks forward to seeing the dogs and exhibitors at your show.

4.1 Class Structure (Age Requirements)

(a) **PEE WEE CLASS**

For handlers 4 years of age up to 6 years of age. Optional and non-competitive. No placements are to be awarded, participant ribbons, rosettes and token trophies may be presented.

(b) **JUNIOR NOVICE CLASS**

For handlers 7 to 10 years who have not won six first places in the same class with competition.

(c) **JUNIOR OPEN CLASS**

For handlers 7 to 10 years of age, who have won six first places with competition in the Junior Novice Class, OR any handler wishing to enter this level. It is understood that once that handler has entered and competed in the Open Class, he/she may not compete in the Novice Class again.

(d) **INTERMEDIATE NOVICE CLASS**

For handlers 11 to 14 years of age, who have not won six first places in the same class with competition.

(e) **INTERMEDIATE OPEN CLASS**

For handlers 11 to 14 years of age, who have won six first places in the same class with competition.

(f) **SENIOR NOVICE CLASS**

For handlers 15 years of age and up to 18 years of age, who have not won six first places in the same class with competition. Handlers from the Intermediate levels progress to this class.

(g) **SENIOR OPEN CLASS**

For handlers 15 years of age and up to 18 years of age, who have won six first places with competition in the Senior Novice Class and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that he/she has enough experience to compete at this level.

4.2 BEST OVERALL

Optional at the discretion of the host club.

All dogs must be entered in one of the Official Classes or Exhibition Only on the day of competition. Entry to be made at the show.

Specialty Classes

(both sexes)

REGULAR CLASSES:

JUNIOR PUPPY – A dog between 6 months and under 9 months.

SENIOR PUPPY – A dog between 9 months and under 12 months.

12-18 MONTHS – A dog between 12 months and under 18 months.

12-15 MONTHS – A dog between 12 months and under 15 months.

15-18 MONTHS – A dog between 15 months and under 18 months.

CANADIAN BRED – A dog born in Canada.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR – Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The breeder/owner must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards. (Eligible for GCH points, if applicable.)

OPEN CLASS – For all dogs.

FIELD CLASS – Dogs entered in this class must have attained a title or placement in a field trial or test. This class is to be judged prior to Best of Breed judging and the winners in each sex will compete for Best of Breed. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

VETERANS CLASS – For all dogs over 7 years of age as of the date of the show. These dogs compete for the regular placements, and the 1st-place dog and bitch will compete for Best of Breed. Veterans may be broken down into separate age categories. The winner of the Veterans Class will not compete for points but go directly into the Best of Breed competition. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

ALTERED – Limited to dogs and bitches over 6 months of age that have been sexually altered by veterinarian procedure.

SPECIALS ONLY – Dogs that are Canadian Champions.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES:

BABY PUPPY – A dog between 4 months and under 6 months on day of show. Baby Puppies do not compete for points.

STUD DOG & GET – Stud Dog and two or more of his get. Stud must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class. Stud Dog may be neutered. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY – Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny. Brood Bitch must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Progeny must be entered in a Regular class. Brood Bitch may be spayed. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

BRACE – Two dogs shown by a single handler on one lead. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

TEAM – Four dogs of same breed (not necessarily the same sex) and must be handled by one person on one lead. Dogs may be spayed or neutered.

EXHIBITION ONLY – All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in Regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular/Unofficial classes and/or Parades.

CH and Champion Points

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

**includes the dog awarded Winners*

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge SHALL NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

Section 15.1.11 A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level.

Section 15.1.13 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges, with at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

GCH and Grand Champion Points

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

- a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

- c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation Grand Champion Bronze title.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GCHEx and Grand Champion Excellent Points

The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

Altered Champion and Altered Points

Section 13.8.1 Championship points will be awarded as per Chapter 15, with the exception of 15.1.11. The winner of an Altered Best in Show shall be awarded points according to the total number of dogs in competition following the point schedule in Section 15.1.2.

Section 15.1.13 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion [Alt] and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

Conformation Show Rules and Regulations

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 4.1.5 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

Section 19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Moving Class Dog to Specials Only

Section 8.9.1 A dog that is registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN), or Event Registrations Number (ERN) and has completed the requirements for a championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one (1) hour prior to breed judging. ***A dog that has a Temporary Competition Number (TCN) is not eligible to be transferred.***

Section 8.9.3 When one all-breed show, a limited breed show, and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to Specials Only must be made a minimum of one (1) hour before breed judging starts of the show for which the dog is being moved up to Specials Only.

Moving from Specials Back to the Classes

Section 8.9.5 A dog can be moved back into the classes from a Special if it has been entered incorrectly, only where the shows have already closed.

HEALTH REMINDERS



No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

At events where judges will be checking bites, judges should be encouraged to have the exhibitors show the bite. If the judge insists on checking bites themselves, they are expected to use hand sanitizer or soap and water in between each exhibit. Please ensure that sanitizer wipes and bottles of hand sanitizer are available at all times at events.
