Jean-Christophe Boulinguez QC

Jean-Christophe Boulinguez has been involved with purebred dogs and the Whippet breed since 1998 when his parents bought their first whippet from Patricia Miller of Woodsmoke Whippets in Canada. After graduating college in 2008, while still involved with Whippets, Mr. Boulinguez wanted to experience other hound breeds and acquired an Ibizan Hound named James, MBIS MBISS Am CH/Can GCHEX Harehill Goes All In, a dog that that ended up stealing his heart and made the breed become a true passion.

Before becoming a judge, Mr. Boulinguez started in the dog world as a junior handler, then got experienced with numerous breeds as semi-professional handler for about 10 years, mainly specializing in Hounds and Toys breeds. He currently breeds Ibizan Hounds under the Requiem prefix. Mr Boulinguez has also co-bred Whippets with his mother under the Interlude prefix as well as Wire-haired Pointing Griffons (Korthal) under the DuValin prefix with Ms Aline Tremblay.

Several dogs owned and bred by Mr Boulinguez have won All-Breed Best in Shows, Specialty Best in Shows, majors awards at Canadian and American National Specialties and the prestigious Westminster Kennel Club.

Mr. Boulinguez has always had affection for different breeds and over the years, other than Ibizans, Whippets and Wire-Haired Pointing Griffons; he has owned an Italian Greyhound, a Pharaoh Hound, a Samoyed, a couple Norwegian Elkhounds, a Grand Basset Griffon Vendéen and an English Bulldog.

He currently is one the youngest licensed judge in North America and has judged across Canada and the United States as well as in Argentina, France, Japan, Germany, Switzerland and Mexico. Mr. Boulinguez is a founding member and current President of the All Hound Club of Quebec

In 1992 my husband and I purchased our first bulldog puppy who I showed to her championship. We have loved and owned bulldogs ever since. Though we didn't breed many litters, over the years I have bred, owned or co owned 15 bulldog champions including a Best In Show winner and 2 national speciality winners.

In 2002 I started judging and I have been licensed to judge all breeds since 2017. I have judged all across Canada, in many states in the USA, Denmark, Czech Republic, Mexico, Argentina, New Zealand and Australia.

In 2018 I retired from a 38 year career in the airline industry. In addition to spending time with my family, my dogs and horses, I also enjoy running, cycling, gardening and travelling and of course attending dog shows, both as an exhibitor and as a judge.

Cheque payable to **Charlotte County Kennel Club** must be received before the closing date. No post dated cheques accepted. A service charge of \$50 will be levied on all NSF cheques.

Attention Foreign Exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

CKC Non Member Participation Fee: The Non-Member Participation Fee applies to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC; it is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. (For a Membership application, please go to www.ckc.ca under CKC Services and Forms On-Line). The Non-Member Participation Fee is a fee paid in the calendar year (January – December) in which the dog achieved its title and/or titles

Entries: Every dog, including baby puppies, must be one: of the following

a: Registered with the CKC or

b: have an Event Registration Number (ERN) or

c: have a Temporary Competition Number (TCN) and must be eligible for registration with the CKC or

d: Listed breeds must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN)

Event Registration Number (ERN): All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an ERN from the Canadian Kennel Club.

Send a photocopy of the dog's registration certificate (ie AKC) with a written request for an ERN

Accounts may be paid with personal or business cheque, money order, payable to the Canadian Kennel Club

Non residents of Canada please note that discounted cheques or money orders will not be accepted due to fluctuating currency rates.

Provide your full name and return address. -Faxed requests will be accepted. Please include your VISA/MasterCard number, expiry date, cardholder's name and signature.

An ERN must be obtained within 30 days of obtaining points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) : TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN). Listed Breeds that do not yet have a Miscellaneous Class Number (MCN) number will be eligible to apply for a TCN. There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN. TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly.

General Information

To comply with instructions issued by the Canadian Kennel Club we will be unable to accept, cancel or substitute an entry reaching our Show Secretary after the closing date. Moving class dogs to Specials is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

All entry confirmations and Judging Schedules will be sent as soon as possible after entries close.

It is your responsibility to verify the receiving of any electronic entries prior to the advertised closing date. A valid means of payment must accompany all entries.

Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have the dog in the ring when the dog's class is called to be judged.

The Charlotte County Kennel Club (CCKC), its officers and associates will use due care & diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of an accident or misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors, or patrons. If, because of riots, civil disturbances, or other acts beyond the control of the management, and it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry fees will be made.

The Dog Show will be open to the general public.

There will be no indoor grooming area, and power IS NOT supplied. You must be self-sufficient (portable generators).

Tents will be provided near the ring entrances. No cover will be provided for individuals in case of inclement weather.

Only Exhibitors who are having the breeds within their group judged are permitted to have crates, etc. under the tent until all the breeds in that group are judged.

The CCKC will not be responsible for equipment left behind at the site or on site overnight.

It is a privilege for us to have the use of the beautiful Ganong Nature Park for our shows. Please ensure we get to keep it by cleaning up after your dogs.

There will be a food truck available at the show all weekend.

Prizes

Rosettes will be offered for all Group Placements and General Specials. Suitable prizes will be offered for General Specials wins.

Booster Rosettes and suitable prizes will be offered in Boosters for BOB, BOS, SD, SB, BOW, WD, WB, BP, BBP, Altered BOB, BOS, WD, WB, Best Veteran in Breed, Best Veteran Male, Best Veteran Female

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. (conformation show rules and regulations 19.7)

No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action. (conformation show rules and regulations 4.1.5)

Conformation Junior Handling

Pee Wee Class - This class is for handlers four (4) years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 7th birthday. This class is optional and non-competitive. No placements are to be awarded; only participant ribbons, rosettes and token trophies may be presented.

Junior Novice Class This class is for handlers seven (7) years of age on the date of the competition up to the date their 11th birthday who have not won six (6) first places in the same class with competition

Junior Open Class This class is for handlers seven (7) years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 11th birthday who have won six (6) first places with competition.

Intermediate Novice Class This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have not won six (6) first places in the same class with competition.

Intermediate Open Class This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have won six (6) first places with competition and for any handler who has progressed through the Junior Open level and feels that they have enough experience to compete at this level.

Senior Novice Class This class is for handlers 15 years of age on the competition up to the date of their 18th birthday who have not won six (6) first places with competition in this class. Handlers from the Intermediate levels progress to this class.

Senior Open Class This class is for handlers 15 years of age on the competition up to the date of their 18th birthday who have won six (6) first places with competition in the Senior Novice Class, and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that they have enough experience to compete at this level.

Champions & Championship Points

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points ranging from zero (0) to five (5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winter shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

*Dogs Competing	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. To determine the number of championship points earned, total all the dogs in the competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and consult the schedule above.

A class dog awarded Best in Show will be credited with five (5) points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. A dog will not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.

Grand Champion Points

Grand Champion (GCh) The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. (a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch) The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh.

A maximum of 5 points may be earned per show of requirements above.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, 9 which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website. To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)
- b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career. NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion.

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
- 2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event); Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

Where to Stay

Trailers and tent camping is allowed on the show site for \$10 per night. No power, water or sewer hookups are available. There are public washrooms onsite, but no showers. The showground opens at 2PM on Friday July 3 2026 for setup. A club member will direct you where to park your trailer, and collect payment.
