DAY OF TRIAL ENTRIES

Day of Trial entries for obedience or rally will be accepted each day if the limit has not been reached, on a first come, first served basis. Entries must be made at least 60 minutes prior to the scheduled start time of each trial. Entry fee is \$40.00 payable in CASH only.

US exhibitors, please purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds for the full amount of your entry. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they must be payable in US funds for the full amount of the entry. Please do not mark cheques payable in Canadian Funds or “at par” as such items are not readily cleared through the bank and will be returned with your entry. Thank you

*TCN – Temporary Competition Number MUST be obtained from the CKC prior to entering any CKC event. TCNs will replace the previous system of entering events with dogs as “listed” and will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). Should you wish to withdraw your entry between the time that you enter and the close of entries you will receive a full refund of entry fees (any Credit Card, Apple Pay, Interac or e-transfer service charges WILL NOT be refunded as per dogshow.ca policy.) Each day is a separate show, and the above fees apply per day, per show except as noted. (These fees include CKC recording fees + 5% G.S.T.)

OBEDIENCE CLASSES OFFERED

OBEDIENCE: PRE-NOVICE – shall be for any dog which has not earned the title of P.C.D. (Pre-Companion Dog) in Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.

NOVICE “A” - No licensed handler, no trainer, nor any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its U.D. Title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be canceled.

NOVICE “B” - Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person & shall be for pure-bred dogs of any breed which have not won the title of C.D. in Canada

NOVICE “C” – as per Obedience Trial Rules & Regulation

INTERMEDIATE NOVICE - as per Obedience Trial Rules & Regulation

OPEN “HA”- The Open HA class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D. but has not earned the title of C.D.X. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate families. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a U.D. title may not handle a dog in this class. Group exercises in Open HA are out of site as before in the original open classes.

OPEN “18A” -The requirements are the same as Open HA and the same rule except the Long Sit is replaced with Change of Positions Exercises and the Long Down is replaced with a Group Sit-Walk around.

OPEN “HB” –The Open HB class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D. Dogs which have earned the title of C.D.X. or any higher titles may enter in the

Open B A dog may also be entered in the Utility Class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times. Group exercises in Open HB are out of site as before in the original open classes.

OPEN 18B – The requirements are the same as Open HB and the same rules apply except the addition of the new Change of Positions Exercises. As described in the Open HA and Open 18A classes

UTILITY “A” – For any purebred dog that has not earned the title of UD. No person who has earned a MOTCH title may handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or a member of their immediate families. Exercises will be performed in the usual order.

UTILITY “B” – Exercises will be done in random order. Order will be posted approximately 30 minutes prior to judging. **VETERANS (Unofficial class)**– For any dog that has earned the title of C.D. or higher and is 7 years old or older on the day of the trial. Exercises shall be performed and judged as in the novice classes. Dog entered in veterans must also be entered in any regular class or exhibition only. Owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class.

RALLY OBEDIENCE

• Rally Ring size will be approximately 50' x 50' • No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial. • No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Obedience CDX title shall be eligible to enter the A class in Rally Novice, Advanced or Excellent.

The following classes will be offered in each Rally Obedience Trial:

Rally Novice A, Rally Novice B, Rally Intermediate, Rally Advanced A, Rally Advanced, B, Rally Excellent A, Rally Excellent B, Rally Master

RALLY NOVICE A - Dogs competing in this class may not have earned the R. N. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY NOVICE B - Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY INTERMEDIATE - The Rally Intermediate Class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Rally Advanced Classes. (CKC rules, 10.1.2) This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.I. or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. This class (performed on leash, no jumps, no A or B division) may be entered indefinitely. Judges would ordinarily use the

same course for it as for their Advanced Classes, substituting one other exercise for the jump required in Advanced.

RALLY ADVANCED A - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R. N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY ADVANCED B - This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.A. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

RALLY EXCELLENT A - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R. A. title, but have not earned the R. E. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. There is also a sit stay exercise after the finish sign. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY EXCELLENT B - This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.A. title. A dog completing the R.E. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. There is a sit stay exercise after the finish sign. **RALLY MASTER** - This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.E. TITLE. A dog completing the R.M. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class

RALLY MASTER - This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.E. TITLE . A dog completing the R.M. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE TRIALS

A description of all Obedience and Rally Classes and Rule and Regulations can be found at
www.ckc.ca

1. The club reserves the right to remove any person from the trial. The Trial Chairperson shall have full control of the trial, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the chairperson or veterinarian for any reason, shall not, after being excused compete in any class for any award the balance of the trial.
3. The Trial Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability for, either dogs, exhibitors or patrons in the event of an accident or misfortune.
4. Dogs must be on the grounds one hour prior to the judging of their respective class.
5. The owner of a dog entered in these trials is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
6. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and equipment left at the trial grounds.
7. Dogs are to be exercised in designated areas only, not in the show building.
8. If, because of civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the club, if it is impossible to open or complete the trials, there is no refund of entry.
9. No dog entered in any trial will be allowed to be off leash at any time on the precinct grounds unless it is in the ring being judged according to the trial rules and regulations.
10. It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, or competitor at an Obedience or Rally Trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind.
11. Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch entered in these trials comes into season after entry of the bitch has been submitted, if a veterinarian's certificate (certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial) is delivered to the Trial Secretary on or before the date of the trial.
12. The Trial Superintendent has the authority to expel any dog deemed to be a danger to other dogs or exhibitors. There will be no refunds for dogs that are expelled.

PRECINCTS OF THESE TRIALS WILL BE THE HENDERSON PAVILION OR ANY OTHER AREA DESIGNATED BY THE CLUB All exhibitors, handlers and patrons are expected to know the trial rules. CKC Non-Member Participation Fee - (24-12-3) a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee. b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled. c) "these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by Canadian resident non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members" *Please note that the CKC Membership Application and the Non-Member Participation Fee forms are available on the website, <http://www.ckc.ca> under CKC Services and then Forms On-line. If submitting a Membership Application, please ensure that you also complete the Non-Member Participation Fee form so that we are aware of the dogs involved.

CKC COVID 19 OBEDIENCE & RALLY RULES GENERAL
GUIDELINES UPDATE FOR 2022

Clubs will follow all Federal, Provincial and local health rules when holding a trial and the protocol will be detailed in the Premium List. Judges, Officials and handlers will abide by the rules specified. The following are allowable temporary changes to the Obedience Rules & Regulations that a club may opt to use during their event in the year 2022 while operating under covid restrictions. However, any other changes to any other rule that is not mentioned here will not be allowed. All municipal directives regarding vaccinations, mask wearing and social distancing must be upheld.

OBEDIENCE TRIALS – Judges can wear a mask even if not required by the club. – Following federal and provincial rules all the temporary rules regarding leash and dumbbell placement can be allowed. Clubs can still allow leashes and dumbbells to be placed on a table or chair determined by the judge, located in the ring such that the handler can obtain the item without leaving the ring. Sanitization, paper towels or paper are not required between equipment. – If the club decides to use the guidelines for leash and dumbbell, the exhibitor may either leave the dog on a sit stay or heel with the dog to the location of the chair to obtain and return their leash and dumbbell used during the exercises. – Articles will be handled as in regular rules. – Scoresheets and awards may be given out in the ring, but the club may opt to have handlers pick up scoresheets and awards outside the ring. – It is recommended that the club publish either in the premium list or judging schedule or both, the modified rules. – In all cases the club can choose to follow regular or covid rules as long as local and provincial health guidelines are followed.

5 RIBBONS & PRIZES 5.1 Ribbons and Rosettes 5.1.1 A club or association holding a trial under these rules shall provide ribbons and rosettes as specified in this section. Only those dogs earning a qualifying score will receive ribbons. The hosting club can determine how prizes and ribbons will be presented, mailing them to exhibitors will be allowed or having them available for exhibitors on a separate table for pick up or in the ring following covid distancing protocol.

8 REGULATIONS FOR PERFORMANCE & JUDGING 8.10 Scoresheets 8.10.1 At the conclusion of the judging of each class, judges are required to provide meaningfully marked individual scoresheets to each exhibitor. Scoresheets need not be handed out in the ring but may be distributed to the exhibitor in any manner as decided by the individual club in order to follow covid protocol.

8 REGULATIONS FOR PERFORMANCE & JUDGING 8.11 Announcement of Scores 8.11.3 After all the scores for the class are recorded, the judge shall call for all available dogs that have earned qualifying scores to be brought into the ring. This can be modified by club if needed to follow covid protocol.

8 REGULATIONS FOR PERFORMANCE & JUDGING 8.13 Ring Procedure 8.13.9 In the Novice intermediate, Open and Utility classes the handler shall place the dumbbell and leash on a chair as designated by the judge in the ring. Utility articles shall be handled as in regular rules. Dumbbell, leash and articles shall be retrieved by the handler before leaving the ring.

9 PRE-NOVICE 9.6 Figure 8 9.6.3 In the Figure 8 exercise, the handler will stand with the dog sitting in heel position facing the judge, midway between the two stewards cones at least 0.46m (18”) high, chairs or similar inanimate objects placed about 3.66m (12ft) apart. The handler may go around steward object first. On the judge’s order, the handler, with the dog on a loose leash, shall go twice completely around the Figure 8 with one halt at the end of the exercise. The handler may give the dog a verbal command to sit.

9 PRE-NOVICE 9.9 Group Sit or Down exercise 9.9.4 All dogs in the class that are eligible to compete in the group exercises may be judged separately or as part of a group after the completion of the individual exercises. If there is more than on dog completing in the group exercise, the dogs must be placed at least 2.44m (8’) apart. In order to accommodate the distance requirement, there may be more than one group. A dog who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to compete.

9 PRE-NOVICE 9.9 Group Sit or Down exercise 9.9.5 Handler will enter the ring with their dogs on leash and line up in a straight line in catalogue order, at least 1.22m (4’) 2.44m (8’) apart. In order to accommodate the distance requirement, there may be more than one group. A dog who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to complete. Clubs may continue to use the 8’ distance if

required for social distancing or use regular rules and may choose to use the rule that a dog who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to compete in the group exercises. 10 NOVICE CLASS 10.6 Heel on Leash & Figure 8 10.6.8 In the figure 8 exercise, the handler will stand with the dog sitting in heel position facing the judge, midway between the two steward's cones at least 0.46m (18") high, chairs or similar inanimate objects placed about 2.44m (8') apart. The handler may go around steward object first. On the judge's order, the handler with the dog on a loose leash shall go twice completely around the figure 8 with at least one halt during and another at the end of the exercise. 10 NOVICE CLASS 10.7 Stand for Examination 10.7.3 On completion of the Figure 8 exercise, the handler will remove the leash and give place it to a steward, who will place it on the judges table on a chair designed by the judge. If necessary, the dog may be guided gently by the collar. 10 NOVICE CLASS 10.9 Recall 10.9.7 On completion of the Recall, the handler may ask the dog to stay or may guide the dog gently by the collar in order to retrieve the leash from the chair previously designated by the judge and put it on the dog before leaving the ring. 10 NOVICE CLASS 10.10 Group Sit and Down exercises 10.10.4 All dogs in the class that are eligible to complete in the group exercises may be judged separately or as part of a group after the completion of the individual exercises. If there is more than one dog completing in the group exercise, the dogs must be placed at least 2.44m (8') apart. In order to accommodate the distance requirement, there may be more than one group. A dog who fails any of the individual exercises is not eligible to complete. will do so together. If, however, there are more than eight dogs completing, they will be split into groups of not more than eight. 10.10.5 When the same judge judges the Novice A, B and/or C classes, the classes may be combined provided the total number of dogs eligible to complete in the group does not exceed eight can be placed at least 2.44m (8') apart. 10.10.6 Handler will enter the ring with their dogs on leash and line up in catalogue order along on side of the ring at least 2.44m (8') apart where the judge indicates. Handlers will place their armbands, weighted with leashes behind the dogs. 10.10.8 The judge shall take a position in the ring where both the dogs and handlers can be observed but must be at least 2.44m (8') from any person. One minute after giving the order to "Leave your dogs" the judge will order the handlers to return promptly to their dogs, each walking around behind his own dog to the heel position. The dogs should not move from the sitting position until the judge says, "Exercise finished." A 10-minute walk-through for each class level must be included in the scheduled judging times and walk-throughs may be extended by the judge if required. (A & B classes of each level judged by the same judge may be combined for walk-throughs.) Walk-through's will be limited to 5 exhibitors at a time who must observe 6' social distancing. If a large class is scheduled, judges will allow an additional 10-minute walk-through every two hour for the next block of dogs to be judged in the class.
