TCN FEES: Temporary Competition Number (TCN), replacing Listing: TCNs will replace the current system of entering events with "listed dogs", and will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). The current TCN fee is \$11.50 per trial (i.e. per dog, per day). https://www.ckc.ca/en/News/2021/March/TCNs-What-Are-They-And-How-Do-You-Get-One. The number is free to apply for a TCN.

24-12-3. CKC Non-member Participation Fee

- a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee (\$170.00 + taxes).
- b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be canceled.
- c) The Premium List must carry a note stating that "This only applies to dogs wholly owned by Canadian resident non-members and is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member."

PLEASE NOTE

Bitches in season may not compete and must be withdrawn. Entry and listing fees paid for any dog withdrawn because of estrus, injury, illness or death shall be refunded in full. An appropriate veterinary certificate must be given to the Hunt Test Secretary before the start of the stake to qualify for a refund.

Release and indemnification of Landowners

By entering this Hunt Test, each participant agrees to assume all risks and hazards incidental to participation in the test and agrees to release, save harmless and indemnify the owner(s) of any property upon which the test is held together with their officers, agents, employees and representatives from all claims, actions, costs, expenses and demands in respect to death, injury, loss or damage to the person or property of the participant howsoever caused, arising out of or in connection with the participant's use or entry upon the property. It is understood that this agreement is binding upon the participant, or his heirs, his executors and assigns.

Rule 21.7 "It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to any indignities of any kind. The Retriever Field Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred."

Chapter 20, Sec. 5 of the Field Trial Rules and Regulations:

Any person participating at a Hunt Test held under these Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the Test, and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the Test to see that this rule is effectively carried out. On report to the test-giving Club of an alleged indignity of any kind, the Hunt Test Committee of the Club shall forthwith conduct an investigation and shall at once render its decision to the parties concerned. It shall also within ten days after the trial, report to the Canadian Kennel Club its findings. The Board of Directors of the CKC shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.

This notice is to provide clubs with a reminder regarding the health of the dogs on the premises of events. No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);

Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.
