TCN's will replace the previous system of entering events with dogs as 'listed' and will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).





LURE TRIAL OFFICIAL STAKES:

Open Stake - for all eligible hounds, including Field Champions.

Mixed Stake - if there are multiple breeds with entries of three or less, upon agreement of all owners, they will be combined in a Mixed stake.

CONFORMATION SHOW CLASSES:

Juvenile – for dogs 12 to 18 months

Bred by Exhibitor – for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder

Open - for all eligible lure coursing breeds

Specials Only - for Canadian Champions only

Altered – for dogs that have been spayed or neutered by veterinary procedure.

NOTES:

Hounds must be entered in the Open or Mixed Stake of the lure trial to participate in the Field Trial Conformation Show. As per CKC rule 1.2.2 Only those hounds that have competed in the Open or Mixed Stake and obtained a qualifying score may compete in the conformation show.

LURE TRIAL UNOFFICIAL CLASSES:

Best in Field – Sunday - Best of Breed and Mixed Stake winners from both days are eligible to participate

Puppy Stake (6-9, 9-12, 12-18 months) Sunday after completion of preliminary runs – dogs are run singly over a shortened course.

Veteran Stake (Unofficial) – (dogs 7 years and older) Sunday after completion of **Puppy Stake** – dogs are run singly over a shortened course.

Kennel Stake, Breeder Stake - Sunday - 2 dogs, determined by score adjusted for judges' average.

Club Stake - Sunday - 3 dogs, top 2 scores adjusted for judges' average.

Combinations for Kennel, Breeder & Club Stake to be named before first course runs on Sunday

What happens when you reply to a newspaper ad about lure coursing? You celebrate 43 years in the sport. Bruce and I got our first Borzoi in 1977 and answered an ad posted by the Foothills Gazehound Club in 1978 and have been involved ever since. I acted as the club's first Field Trial Secretary in 1980 having never attended a trial before.

I started judging in 1985 when lure coursing was done under the Canadian Sighthound Field Association. My first apprenticeships were when ALCA ran a three-day trial Thanksgiving weekend. I started out apprenticing everything, but as the weather deteriorated by day three it was only the breeds with the biggest entries, Greyhounds, Irish Wolfhounds and Whippets. I'm a pack rat and still have all the paperwork from my early apprenticeships and provisional assignments. I persevered and achieved All breed status in July of 1988. As a Lure coursing Judge, I also judge Chase Ability events.

Throughout the years we have bred/owned some of the top lure coursing Borzoi in Canada. The three Deerhounds that we have owned showed little or no interest in the "wabbit". We currently are owned by two Ibizan Hounds both of whom have done well in the coursing field. My Canadian judging assignments have taken me from Thunder Bay (when there was a club out there) to Vancouver Island. I have also judged both American Sighthound Field Association and American Kennel Club field trials in Montana, Washington, and California.

I've been involved with dogs since before I knew who I was. However, since 1979 I have been involved with Greyhounds. These dogs lead me astray to many parts of the world. We took part in the show ring, racing, oval track racing, open field coursing and Lure Coursing. Nearly all my dogs finished their lure coursing championships. Ch. Windwood Count of Monte Cristo FCHX, Ch. Terrible Tinker FCHX, CC (open field coursing champion), just to name my starter greyhounds. Few will remember these dogs today but they are in the history books – somewhere. I was very lucky with my hounds as they were well accepted in the show ring as well as being good performers in the open field, on the race track and of course, lure coursing. I still have the memories of all my greyhounds and the journey we took together, from Canada, to the US, to England, my dogs

Due to a lot of whippets and not a lot of judges around to judge them (most owned whippets and as you know, you can't judge your own dog) I started on the judging journey in 1984. The sport needed judges then and I think we still need talented and dedicated new judges today. I would strongly encourage more people to take on this fun and challenging task. Remember, you get the best view of all! Today, I no longer have greyhounds but I am still interested in the running dog, and it is still fun to judge all the dogs presented on the field today.





DIRECTIONS TO THE FIELD

This field is northeast of Sherwood Park. Shopping, gas & coffee are less than 10 min away.

Entrance to field has SVTA in big letters over the gate.

From South: Hwy 21 north to Township Road 534 (first north of Hwy 16) Turn right/East on Township Road 534 to Range Road 225 (approx. 2 km) Turn left/north on Range Road 225. Field is 1/2 km north of Twp Rd 534 on left.

From East: Hwy 16 West to Range Road 225 Turn right/north on Range Road 225. Field is approx. 4 km north of Hwy 16 on left.

From West: Hwy 16 East through Sherwood park to Range Road 225

Turn left/north on Range Road 225. Field is approx. 4 km north of Hwy 26 on left.

EQUIPMENT AND FIELD CONDITIONS

This filed is a mown hay field, flat on the west side, sloping towards the road. An electric drag will be used.

CONDITIONS AND INFORMATION

- Rolling inspection check in for inspection as you arrive, with your dog(s). It is your responsibility to take your dog for inspection prior to roll call.
- Lure Coursing is a strenuous athletic pursuit that requires your dog to be in excellent condition. Your dog relies on you to ensure this.
- All hounds will be run in trios or braces, twice, unless excused, dismissed or disqualified.
- Hounds not present at roll call will be scratched, and their entry fee will NOT be refunded. No exceptions.
- All handlers MUST use a slip lead when releasing their hounds.
- Hounds may wear muzzles and/or catch collars at the owner/agent's discretion.
- Bitches in season and lame hounds will be excused and will have their entry fee returned if notice is given to the secretary **prior** to roll call.
- The Chair may excuse any hound from competition for any reason deemed justifiable.
- A \$10.00 fine, payable to ALCA, will be levied for any hound loose on the field at any time between Roll Call and the completion of Best in Field Trial Conformation Show.
- There is limited shade and no water available, so come PREPARED.
- There will be limited overnight camping. Please contact Ed Molloy to reserve your spot. (780) 922-5218.


