CKC Policies & Procedures Manual – Shows and Trials - page 6:13

When a regular scheduled judge draws an overload entry (175+) and some entries must be reassigned by the Show Secretary to meet CKC regulations, Baby Puppy entries will be reassigned before regular class dogs. Baby Puppy Groups and Best in Show will be a judged by the judge assigned in the Premium List

A ramp will be available for use at the Judge's discretion.

Only dogs entered in one (1) of the regular, non-regular or unofficial classes shall be allowed within the show precincts.

CKC 12.2.1

Dogs younger than 4 months of age are not permitted in any area of the dog show site unless isolated in owners camping space.

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;***
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);***
- Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.***

Alberta Kennel Club had the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

At events where judges will be checking bites, judges should be encouraged to have the exhibitors show the bite. If the judge insists on checking bites themselves, they are expected to use hand sanitizer or soap and water in between each exhibit.

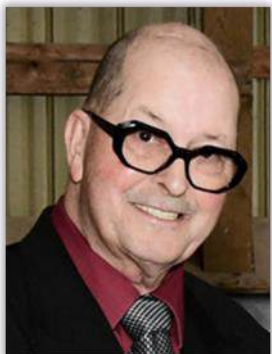

Personal cheques in US funds will be accepted. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor, due to fluctuations in currency rates.

Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as they will not be cleared by the banks. Your understanding and cooperation are appreciated.

Exhibitors Please Note:

An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry at any time up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone but **written or electronic notification must be received by the show secretary not later than closing date and time.** If written or electronic notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the show.

When a CKC registration number for a listed dog is received after the closing date and prior to the date of the show, this number may be added to the entry and noted in the marked catalogue. Listing fees will not be refunded. This then allows a dog who completes the requirement for championship status to be moved up to Specials. *CKC Section 8.3.4*

An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. *CKC Section 8.1.5*

The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than 90 days following the date(s) of the event(s). *CKC Section 9.9*

Moving to Specials - A dog may not move to the Specials class with a TCN. The dog must be fully registered with the CKC – CKC registration, ERN or MCN.

Moving a dog from Specials back to the classes - A dog can be moved back into the classes [any class] from a special if it has been entered incorrectly only where shows have already closed.

There will be no refunds on duplicate entries or overpayment.

Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch entered in Agility, Rally Obedience or Obedience comes into season after the close of entries if a Veterinarian's Certificate (certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10-day period preceding the trial) is delivered to the Show Secretary before the starting date and the time of the trial.

The Alberta Kennel Club will refund entry, recording and listing fees if the above conditions are met.

A 50% refund of entry fees only will be made for a bitch in season without a veterinarian's certificate with written notification presented to the Show Secretary at least ONE HOUR before the start of the Trials. The bitch must be available to be examined by the Show Superintendent to verify she is in season.

No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes, Act of God, or any other cause beyond the control of the Alberta Kennel Club.

No entry fees will be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering these shows, regardless of how or by whom the entry is made.

ANIMALS LEFT IN VEHICLES will be monitored.

If animals are in distress due to heat or any other circumstance, the vehicle will be forcibly entered, the animal recovered and the owner will be subject to penalty under the Animal Protection Act 2(1) (1.1) 2.1©. The Alberta Kennel Club will not accept any responsibility for damage to any vehicle entered to remove an animal(s) in distress.

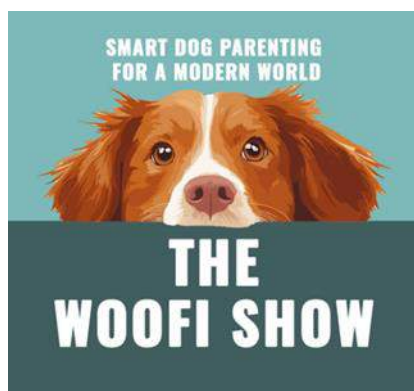

The Alberta Kennel Club (the "AKC") reserves the right to refuse any entry for cause, subject to CKC Conformation Show Rules and Regulations (8.5.1).

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I (we) agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club and by any additional rules and regulations of the AKC that appear in this premium list.

Aa an Exhibitor in the Alberta Kennel Club (AKC) Conformation Shows and Obedience, Rally-Obedience, Agility Trials or associated Specialty Shows, I (we) expressly understand and agree that participation in the AKC's events may present risk to any exhibitor, both serious and minor. If unwilling to assume all the risks associated with the shows, do not accept the terms contained herein.

I (we) agree to hold the AKC, their members, directors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim.

I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage, or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the AKC or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred

CKC Conformation Show Rules and Regulations (19.7)

Dogs not entered in the Show(s) are not permitted on the show premises. See Show Secretary for "In Transit" pass.

Dogs should arrive in adequate time for their breed judging (allowing for absentees). It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to have the dog at ringside when the dog's class is scheduled for judging. Waiting for dogs will not be possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their breeds' conflict.

Dogs must be on leash at all times on the show grounds with the exception of the Agility, Obedience and Rally-Obedience Rings.

Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and equipment left at the show grounds. No dogs are to be left overnight in the day benching areas.

Exhibitors must pick-up after their dogs and ensure that the dogs do not lift their leg against ring fences and any structures on the show grounds. Failure to comply will be referred to the Show Superintendent for action.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children. The AKC will not be responsible for injury to any child whether by accident or any other cause.

The Alberta Kennel Club does not allow the use of spike or pinch collars on its show grounds

MOVING A CLASS DOG TO SPECIALS

CKC Section 8.9 A dog which is individually registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of closing of entries for the show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner/handler at least one (1) hour prior to the opening of the show. When one or more all-breed championship shows and/or specialty shows are held on the same date in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to specials must be made a minimum of one (1) hour prior to the scheduled start of the show for which the dog is being moved up to.

CKC Section 8.9.2 If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the Championship requirements, all awards will be canceled and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.

CKC Section 8.10.5 A dog can be moved back into the classes from a Special if it has been entered incorrectly, only where the shows have already closed.

ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

Effective Jan/1992 all dogs that are foreign-born and foreign-owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC (Canadian Kennel Club) events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an ERN - Event Registration Number. This ERN does not register a dog with CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act but rather enables a foreign-owned dog to be awarded titles by the Canadian Kennel Club. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN, mail or fax a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with cheque or VISA/MasterCard number (expiry date, cardholder's name, and signature). Provide your complete address for return of the ERN to you.

MIXED BREED OR UNRECOGNIZED BREED ENTRIES IN PERFORMANCE EVENTS

Amendments have been made to the Agility, Obedience and Rally Obedience Rules & Regulations such that mixed or unrecognized breed dogs are allowed to participate in the CKC Performance Events of Agility, Obedience and Rally Obedience Trials. The amendments are effective July 1, 2014.

Extracts From CKC Conformation Show Rules & Regulations

Section 4.1.5 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act.

Section 8.1.5 An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

Section 8.2.1 Entries: Every dog entered in a Championship show must be one of the following:

- registered with the CKC,
- have an Event Registration Number,
- be eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

Section 8.3.1 Listed Dogs: If a dog is not registered as in 8.2.1 (a) or (b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC, it may be entered at a show as a listed dog provided:

- that if born in Canada, the dog has a Temporary Competition Number (TCN), and it is eligible for individual registration;
- that if not born in Canada, the dog has a Temporary Competition Number (TCN), and it is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC;
- that if it is foreign-born, the dog has a Temporary Competition Number (TCN). An Event Registration Number (ERN) or CKC registration number must be obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

Section 8.3.2 Entry of a listed dog at a show must be accompanied by a listing fee as set by the Board in addition to the regular entry fee.

Section 8.4.1 Acceptance of Entries: If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.

Section 8.4.3 No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for pure bred dogs.

Section 8.4.4 After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in case of a postal strike.

Section 8.6.1 Refusal of Entries: The authorities of any show may:

- decline to accept entries for just cause;
- refuse to receive, or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness. A club declining an entry or ordering the removal of a dog from its show must report, in writing, all such matters to the CKC with a full explanation and/or reason within 14 days after its show has been held;
- in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.

Section 13.8.1 Altered Champion and Altered Points

Championship points will be awarded as per Chapter 15, with the exception of 15.1.11. The winner of an Altered Best in Show shall be awarded points according to the total number of dogs in competition following the point schedule in Section 15.1.2.

Section 14.1.2 Disqualifying or Excusing Dogs

- The judge shall have the authority to excuse, disqualify or permanently disqualify a dog that menaces, threatens or attempts to bite the judge, another person or any dog in the ring. If a dog is twice excused for any combination of these actions, it shall have the status of a disqualified dog. The judge shall also have the authority to disqualify or excuse a dog that attempts to bite, or bites in response to an attack from another dog.
- The judge shall disqualify or permanently disqualify a dog that bites the judge, another person or any dog in the ring. Dogs permanently disqualified under this provision will not be eligible for reinstatement. The decision to permanently disqualify a dog must be clearly indicated on the judge's disqualification form.

CKC Policies & Procedures Manual – Shows and Trials - page 6:13

When a regular scheduled judge draws an overload entry (175+) and some entries must be reassigned by the Show Secretary to meet CKC regulations, Baby Puppy entries will be reassigned before regular class dogs. Baby Puppy Groups and Best in Show will be a judged by the judge assigned in the Premium List

Championship Points and Cancellations

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 & more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

**Includes the dog awarded Winners.*

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused, or ordered from the ring by the judge shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

Section 15.1.3 If a Dog awarded Winners was also awarded Best of Breed, then at the show all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included the total.

Section 15.1.4 If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.5 If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.6 If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.

Section 15.1.7 The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

Clarification: Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Winners which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that the dog was defeated at the Group level.

Section 15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than 5 championship points in a single show:

Section 15.1.10 A breed or class shall not be allowed more than 2 sets of championship points per sex on any day in the same venue.

Section 15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners which also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with 5 championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship certificate, the dog must:

- earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 judges; and,
- be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number.
- have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

Grand Champion

15.2 Grand Champion (GCh) (47-06-12)

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

Section 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group, or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System

Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level:

(b) The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at Group level for all levels of GCh:

(c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

(d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all Events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE:

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

CKC Section 9.9

The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than 90 days following the date(s) of the event(s).

ALL-BREED CONFORMATION CLASSES

REGULAR CONFORMATION CLASSES

Junior Puppy	Dogs six (6) months of age and under nine (9) months of age on the day of the show.
Senior Puppy	Dogs nine (9) months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show.
12 – 18 Months	Dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.
Canadian Bred Class	Dogs born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded.
Bred By Exhibitor Class	Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner and breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/ breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards. Should the owner/breeder be unable to handle the dog in this class, the dog may be moved to the Open class (at least one hour prior to the judging of the breed in question).
Open Class	All dogs. This class may be divided by colour if permission of the CKC is obtained.
Specials Only	Dogs that have a recorded CKC registration, Event Registration Number (ERN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and have attained the required points for championship status. All awards earned at the show will be cancelled if it is found that a dog is not registered or has not completed the requirements for a CKC championship. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible. After awarding Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best of Winners in each breed, the judge may choose a Select Dog and Select Bitch.

NON-REGULAR CONFORMATION CLASSES

Baby Puppy Class (4-6 MONTHS)	In this optional class for All-Breed Shows, the puppy must be 4 months and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. Winners of this class do not compete for points. Awards for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group and Best Baby Puppy in Show
Veteran Class	In this optional class for All Breed Shows, dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. The awards for this class are: Best Male Veteran and Best Female Veteran, Best Veteran in Breed, Best Veteran in Group, Best Veteran in Show. A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Breed is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Group. A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Group is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Show.
Exhibition Only	Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in non-Regular classes and/or Parades if provided for in this premium list.
Exhibition Only (4-6 MONTHS)	Puppies 4-6 months of age may be entered in Exhibition Only 4-6 Months provided the owner(s) has entered a dog in a Regular Official Class. <u>These Puppies may not participate in any regular, non-regular or unofficial classes or Parades – but they may compete in Sweepstakes if a 4–6-month class is offered.</u>

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Pre-Novice	The Pre-Novice class is an elective class for exhibitors and earning the title is not a requirement for a dog to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title of PCD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all five exercises unless he has two or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of CD may enter the Pre-Novice class.
Novice A	The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families, and must be eligible to handle under Section 10.1.4. Section 10.1.4 No person who has exhibited a dog that has earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.
Novice B	The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all six exercises unless he has two or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Novice A and Novice B class at any one trial.
Novice C	The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title CD or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all six exercises unless he has two or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice C class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice C class are not eligible for High in Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.
Novice Intermediate	The Novice Intermediate class is an elective class for exhibitors and earning the title is not a requirement for a dog to enter the Open classes. The class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a CD or any higher obedience trial titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all six exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.
Open A	The Open A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Only one (1) dog per handler is allowed in this class and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH title may not handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.
Open B	The Open B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD. Dogs that have earned the title of CDX or any higher obedience titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one (1) dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all seven (7) exercises.
Utility A	The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of UD. Any person who has exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.
Utility B	The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CDX or UD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.
UNOFFICIAL OBEDIENCE CLASSES	
All dogs entered in the Unofficial Classes must be entered in one of the Official Classes or Exhibition Only.	
Brace Class	Open to any 2 dogs of any breed and either sex, which has attained not less than a CD title in Canada. It is not necessary that the same person owns both dogs, nor that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial. Exercises same as Novice.
Team Class	The Team Class is open to any 4 dogs of any breed that have earned the title of C.D. or higher. It is not necessary that the same person own all dogs in the team or that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice Class
Veteran's Class	Shall be for dogs that have an obedience title and are seven (7) years old or older on the day of the trial. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice Class. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice Class.

RALLY-OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Rally Novice A	Dogs competing in this class may not have earned the RN title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.
Rally Novice B	Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
Rally Intermediate	The Rally Intermediate class is an elective class for exhibitors and earning the title is not a requirement for a dog to enter Rally Advanced classes. This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RI or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. Dogs may be entered in this class as a regular entry or changed to it from another official class within the same trial. The request to change must be made on the appropriate CKC form and be submitted to the trial secretary at least thirty (30) minutes before the start of the trial.
Rally Advanced A	This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RN title but have not earned the RA title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.
Rally Advanced B	This class will be for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RA title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
Rally Excellent A	This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RA title, but have not earned the RE title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial.
Rally Excellent B	This class will be for dogs that have earned the RA title. A dog completing the RE title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
Rally Master	This class will be for dogs that have earned the RE title. A dog completing the RM title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.
UNOFFICIAL RALLY-OBEDIENCE CLASSES	
All dogs entered in the Unofficial Classes must be entered in one of the Official Classes or Exhibition Only.	
Brace Class	Open to any 2 dogs of any breed and either sex, which has attained the title of R.N. or higher in Canada. It is not necessary that the same person owns both dogs, nor that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed specialty obedience Trial. Offered in all Regular Classes
Team Class	The Team Class is open to any 4 dogs of any breed that have earned the title of R.N. or higher. It is not necessary that the same person own all dogs in the team or that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial. Offered in all Regular Classes

SPECIALTY CONFORMATION CLASSES

OFFICIAL CLASSES (ALL SPECIALTIES)

Divided Classes at Specialty Conformation Shows

A club holding a specialty may, where applicable and with the permission of the CKC, divide regular official, non-regular or unofficial classes by colour, weight, or coat type except for the Specials Only class. Only one Winners award may be given in each sex.

Junior Puppy	A dog between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show.
Senior Puppy	A dog between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show.
12 - 18 Months	A dog between 12 months and under 15 months on day of show.
12 – 15 Months (optional)	A dog between 12 months and under 15 months on day of show.
15 – 18 Months (optional)	A dog between 15 months and under 18 months on day of show.
Canadian Bred	A dog which is born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded.
Bred By Exhibitor	Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner and breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The breeder/owner must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.
Open Class	For all dogs.
Veterans	For all dogs seven (7) years of age and over on the day of the show. This class may, at the discretion of the club, be divided by age into not more than three age divided classes. The winners of each class in each sex will compete for Best of Breed. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.
Field Class (optional)	This class is optional at Specialty shows for breeds that have performance events in the field. Dogs entered in this class must have attained a title or placement in a field trial or test. This class is to be judged prior to Best of Breed judging with winners of each sex competing for Best of Breed. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.
Specials Only	Dogs that have a recorded CKC registration, Event Registration Number (ERN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and have attained the required points for championship status. All awards earned at the show will be cancelled if it is found that a dog is not registered or has not completed the requirements for a CKC championship. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible. After awarding Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best of Winners in each breed, the judge may choose a Select Dog and Select Bitch.
Award of Merit	At the judge's discretion, Awards of Merit may be awarded up to one Award for every ten dogs competing for Best of Breed. Rosettes will be given for the Awards of Merit which will be presented following Best of Breed.

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASSES (optional)

Limited to dogs and bitches over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinarian procedure.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES (optional)

Baby Puppy	A dog between 4 months and under 6 months on day of show. Baby Puppies do not compete for points.
Exhibition Only	All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in non-Regular classes and/or Parades.
Brace	Two dogs of same breed (not necessarily of the same sex) and must be handled by one person on one lead. Dogs may be spayed or neutered.
Team	Four dogs of same breed (not necessarily of the same sex) and must be handled by one person on one lead. Dogs may be spayed or neutered.
Stud Dog & Get	Entry comprises the Stud Dog and two or more of his Get, ownership in this class need not be identical. Stud Dog may be neutered.
Brood Bitch & Progeny	Entry comprises the Brood Bitch and two or more of her Progeny, ownership in this class need not be identical. Brood Bitch may be spayed.

Each entrant for Brace, Team, Stud Dog, or Brood Bitch must be entered in one of the Official Classes in the Specialty or Exhibition Only.

All Get and Progeny must be entered in an Official Class.

UNOFFICIAL CLASSES (optional)

Parade of Champions, Titleholders or Veterans	Champion dogs must have completed all requirements for Championship status. Titleholders must have titles recognized by the CKC and AKC. Veteran dogs must be over seven years of age as of the date of the show. Spayed & neutered dogs or dogs in unorthodox trim may be entered.
Field Trial Class	Shall be for dogs having Canadian WC or better (WCI, WCX) title, a CKC licensed Field Trial placement in an official class or a Junior Hunter (JH). Dogs must be at least 6 months of age or older and eligible for registration. Each entrant for Field Trial Class must be entered in one of Official Classes in the Specialty or Exhibition Only.
Lure Coursing Class	Open to any dog who has a CKC, ASFA, or AKC Coursing Championship, OR points toward it's Championship OR a CKC NC Title Dogs & Bitches judged together.
Field Champion Class	for Field Champions of record only, each entrant for these Unofficial Classes must be entered in one of Official Classes in the Specialty or Exhibition Only. Dogs entered in Obedience cannot be used as part of these classes.
3 Generation Class	Consists of three or more dogs in a three or more generation DIRECT line (i.e., Mother or Father with son or daughter and grandson or granddaughter or great grandson or great granddaughter). These dogs are shown together (handled separately). To be judged on similarity of type (similar to stud dog or brood bitch). Dogs may be spayed/neutered and breeder(s) owner(s) need not be identical. Each dog must also be entered in a Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

EXCERPTS FROM THE JUNIOR HANDLING RULES & REGULATIONS 2024

Classes in Junior Conformation Handling competition shall be divided by age as follows:

Pee Wee Class	This class is for handlers four (4) years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 7th birthday. This class is optional and non-competitive. No placements are to be awarded; only participant ribbons, rosettes and token trophies may be presented.
Junior Novice	This class is for handlers seven (7) years of age on the date of the competition up to the date their 11th birthday who have not won 6 first places in the same class with competition.
Junior Open	This class is for handlers seven (7) years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 11th birthday who have won six (6) first places with competition.
Intermediate Novice	This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have not won six (6) first places in the same class with competition.
Intermediate Open	This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have won six (6) first places with competition and for any handler who has progressed through the Junior Open level and feels that they have enough experience to compete at this level.
Senior Novice	This class is for handlers 15 years of age on the competition up to the date of their 18th birthday who have not won six (6) first places with competition in this class. Handlers from the Intermediate levels progress to this class.
Senior Open	This class is for handlers 15 years of age on the competition up to the date of their 18th birthday who have won six (6) first places with competition in the Senior Novice Class, and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that they have enough experience to compete at this level.

Classes in Junior Obedience Competition shall be divided as follows:

Junior Obedience Pre-Novice	This class is for handlers seven (7) years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 11th birthday who have not achieved 500 score points in any Pre-Novice competition.
Intermediate Obedience Pre-Novice	This class is for handlers 11 years of age on the date of the competition up to the date of their 15th birthday who have not achieved 500 score points in any Pre-Novice competition.

In 1989 Christina was elected Secretary of the International Borzoi Conference (IBC) as well as Chairman of the Conference in Macon, France. She was elected President of the IBC at the conference in England in 1992 and re-elected to this position in Canada 1995 and Sydney 1998. Christina obtained her Hound licence in 1983 and has since been approved to judge all breeds at Championship level in 1999, having coordinated the Hound Group Training under Mrs Margaret Spira in 1984 & 1985. In 1986, she judged Junior showmanship at the "Sydney Royal" Show; Baby, Classic and Intermediate Sweepstakes at "Brisbane Royal" 2004. She has judged in all States of Australia, both North and South Islands of New Zealand, as well as India, Thailand, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Canada (including Lower Mainland Dog Fanciers and Ontario Sighthound Specialty). In America she has judged Best in Show in Philadelphia (1992) and Santa Fe, New Mexico (2003).
