The Calgary Pointing Dog Club will conduct a licensed field trial for all pointing breeds near Bragg Creek, AB on September 8 & 9, 2012. This trial is held under the rules of The Canadian Kennel Club, Suite 400, 200 Ronson Drive, Etobicoke ON M9W5Z9 and the minimum requirements of the Amateur Field Trial Clubs of America, 360 Winchester Lane, Stanton TN USA 36069.

Courses and Birds: All courses will be single course. Released birds will be chukar and/or pheasant. Other game birds may be present. No birds will be released for the puppy stake. In the event of adverse course conditions, the Field Trial Chairman may adjust the courses (including adding or deleting bird field) to suit.

Location: The Club is grateful to have these grounds owned by Brian and Susan Copithorne.

We ask for your co-operation in keeping the grounds free of litter by using the garbage bags provided. Parking will be restricted to the marked areas. No smoking will be allowed beyond camp or on the back course. Fire conditions are extreme and a fire ban may be in effect.

Accommodations: Camping will be allowed on the grounds on Friday and Saturday nights and will be restricted to marked areas. Facilities are limited so please come prepared. An outhouse will be provided. Cochrane motels: Bow River Inn – 403.932.7900; Cochrane Super 8 – 403.932.6355; Harvest Country Inn – 403.932.1410.

Food: There will be no concession food available. We invite you to participate in a potluck dinner on Saturday night. Please also bring your lawn chairs.

General Information:

- Running and Handling: Horseback handling is optional in all stakes. If one handler is mounted and the other is walking, the judges shall set a reasonable pace. Mounted handlers must keep their horse at a walk unless otherwise authorized by the judge.
- Handler's horses will not be provided by the Club. Handlers will be responsible for making their own arrangements. The trial will not be held up waiting for horses at the line.
- Blank pistols only will be fired over all dogs with bird work in the senior and derby stakes. Blank pistols may be fired over puppies if both handlers agree. No live ammunition will be allowed in any stake. Pistols must have solid barrels
- Total entries will be limited to the number of dogs that can be run in the available daylight hours.
- The senior and derby stakes will be 30 minutes in length; the puppy stake will be 20 minutes in length. The Club reserves the right to rearrange the running order of the junior stakes should conditions warrant.
- Collaring a dog away after game contact will be allowed.
- Bitches in season will not be permitted to run.
- Backing tests: If a dog has placed in one of the senior stakes of the Trial and needs only a backing test to complete the requirements for a Championship, the owner may request a backing test. This test will be allowed at the discretion of the Field Trial Chairman and will depend on the availability of birds. The test will cost \$20.00
- Tracking Collars: Approved electronic tracking collars may be used. Any questions regarding their use should be referred to the Field Trial Secretary.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that any judge, marshal, club official, volunteer, or any other participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities of any kind.

Reminder: The CPDC wishes to remind all participants and spectators that there will be no exercising or training of any dogs on the grounds before, during, or after the Trial without the permission of the Field Trial Chairman or the Field Trial Secretary. All participants must be familiar with the CKC Rules and also the rules & provisions of this Premium List. CKC Field Trial rulebooks are available from the CKC or on-line at the CKC website for CKC members.

Prizes: Standard CKC rosettes will be awarded to the placing dogs in all stakes. AFTCA will award win certificates to all qualified dogs placing first, second or third in all stakes except the Puppy. Perpetual trophies will be given out to all first placing dogs.

Entries will close at 6:00pm sharp on Wednesday, September 5, 2012 and the draw will be held immediately after the close at the home the field trial secretary.

Entry fees: Are to be paid in Canadian funds by cash, cheque or money order payable to the Calgary Pointing Dog Club. The Field Trial Secretary will acknowledge the receipt of electronically transmitted entries. All entry forms are to be completed and in the hands of the Field Trial Secretary and entry fees paid in full prior to the running of a dog.

Listing Fee: A listing fee as established by The Canadian Kennel Club must accompany the entry of a dog for which a Canadian Kennel Club individual registration number or Event Registration Number (ERN) is not shown on the entry form. This listing fee is \$8.82 per dog per each event entered during the field trial and is in addition to the entry fee(s).

All entries for this Field Trial are accepted on condition that the CPDC, its officials and members, land and horse owners, are released from all liabilities for loss, damage or injury sustained by dog, horse or person in conjunction with, or during the running of, this Field Trial. All minors shall be under the direct care and supervision of the parent or guardian.

A map to the trial location will be forwarded to all participants along with the running order upon completion of the draw and prior to the running of the trial.
