ENTRIES: Please complete one entry form per dog, per stake, per day in which you wish you enter your dog(s). All entries must contain complete information as required by the CKC rules. All entries must be accompanied by the entry fee in full and all applicable listing fees. A listing fee of \$8.48 must be submitted for any dog without an individual registration number. Scratches will be refunded for a bitch in season totally. All other scratches will be refunded at the field trial committee's discretion.

RULE 23.7 of the Rules and Regulations for Retriever Trials states:

"It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a Judge, Club official, Volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not to be subject to indignities of any kind. The Retriever Field Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Dead ducks and or pheasants will be used in all stakes.

RUNNING ORDER

The starting dog in the first series will be determined by using the last two digits at closing of the Toronto Stock Exchange (TSE) S&P/TSX composite index on the Thursday immediately preceding the trial.

(a) The starting dog will be the dog assigned the number in the draw that corresponds to the last two digits (including digits, if any to the right of the decimal point) of the closing

S&P/TSX composite index (the TSX number) on the Thursday immediately preceding the trial.

- (c) If the TSX number is 00, the dog given number 1 in the draw shall be the starting dog for the first series.
- (d) If the TSX number is greater than the number of dogs entered in the stake, the number of dogs entered in the stake will be subtracted from the TSX number and the resulting number (the Second TSX number) will determine the starting dog for the first series. The starting dog will be the dog assigned that Second TSX number in the draw.
- (e) If the Second TSX number is still greater than the number of dogs entered in the stake the number of dogs entered in the stake will be subtracted from the Second TSX number. This subtraction process will be repeated as many times as is necessary until the number resulting from this subtraction corresponds with a number given in the draw to an entered dog. That dog will start the first series.

It is understood that this agreement is binding upon the participant and all of his heirs, executors and assigns.

COVID GUIDELINES

Please read the following guidelines which have been established to promote health and safety of everyone during the covid situation. It is assumed that sending in your entry means you accept and will abide by these recommendations.

- 1. Clubs, officials and participants are required to follow guidelines that apply to the area where the event is held. If at the time of the draw, travel between provinces is still being discouraged, then only Ont. entries will be accepted
- 2. Practice social distancing. Avoid congregating to the extent possible. Gallery must practice social distancing 6 ft. between chairs.
- 3. Avoid shaking hands or hugging
- 4. Avoid touching dogs or equipment that is not your responsibility
- 5. Park with sufficient distance between vehicles if possible
- 6. Remain near your vehicle until just prior to running and follow marshal's instructions regarding running order and entering the holding blinds.
- 7. Any special instructions from the judges will be posted in the last holding blind
- 8. Handlers will be invited to the line in smaller groups. It is possible, depending on your number, that you will not see the test dog run from line. You will have the opportunity to see other dogs run from the holding blind while waiting to run.
- 9. Anyone on line should maintain adequate distance from the handler as blowing a whistle could project a vapour.
- 10. Gloves must be worn while running
- 11. Judges should bring their own equipment chairs, coolers, pens/pencils. Hand sanitizer will be provided

To reduce the number of people on the trial grounds we may hire fewer gunners and throwers. Handlers may be requested to assist with gunning and throwing.
