
OFFICIAL PREMIUM LIST



IMPORTANT DETAILS – (please read before entering)

This event is a WC, WCI & WCX in a partnership between the BCLRC and GRCBC. In order for competitors to potentially enter all three on the same day, it must be treated like 3 separate tests, each one has to open and close before the next can begin. (The reason for 3 Premium Lists).

You must pass a WC to enter the WCI, and you must pass a WCI to enter the WCX, thus if you are entering all 3 tests, you start by entering the WC at Dogshow.ca. If you pass, you may enter the next level onsite with an entry form and cash only, etc. Please bring completed entries for WCI and WCX and the correct cash the day of, so we can quickly move you along, if that is what you choose to do.

NOTE: You are not required to enter all 3 tests and you can enter at any level (with prerequisites), but **initial entry must be on Dogshow.ca AND the mandatory survey below must be completed before entry is accepted**. A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) as established by the CKC, and a fee of \$10.50, must accompany the entry of a dog for which a CKC individual registration or an ERN is not shown on the entry form.

A TCN cannot be used for dogs that require a PEN (Performance Event Number) or CCN (Canine Companion Number) ERN's for foreign born or foreign owned dogs can be obtained from the CKC.

ERN must be applied for within 30 days of entering a CKC event.

When using DogShow.ca, use the Agent field to enter the handler's name if a dog has multiple owners or if the handler is different than the owner.

No Catalogues Distributed

Catalogues and a Running Order will be emailed to handlers prior to the test. They will not be distributed at the test. A Running Order will be posted on site for hands free reference.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Please familiarize yourself with the WC RULES
- 2. The **running order** will be determined by a draw for each stake at the home of the Secretary after time of closing. The running order may be changed on the day of the tests as provided by the Official Rules.
- 3. **Entry fees** will not be refunded after August 27, 2023. In the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a judge or barred from competition by action of the Test Committee or the Canadian Kennel Club, or because it has been entered incorrectly, or if it is impossible to open or complete the test, no refund of entry will be made.
- 4. Bitches in season are not eligible for entry and are not allowed on the test grounds.
- 5. Entry Fee refunds will be given for any dog withdrawn because of estrus, injury, illness or death and unless otherwise agreed by the trial committee must be accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate. Other entry fee refunds (less a scratch fee of \$10.00 per dog) may be given for an extraordinary reason at the discretion of the trial committee. All requests for a refund must be in writing and must be received by the trial secretary within 2 days of the last day of the trial.
- 6. Ducks, pheasants or chukars may be used.
- 7. Dogs are permitted to wear Neoprene vests for water marks and blinds.
- 8. All participants and spectators shall wear hunting attire or dark clothing.
- 9. Rosettes will be awarded for all qualifying dogs and will be presented immediately at the end of each test.

LEGAL MATTERS

Working Certificate Test Rules & Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club state in Section:

10.1.6 No training will be allowed on the test grounds within 24 hours of the start of the test. A bumper thrown by the handler for the purpose of a warm-up shall not be considered training.

20.73.6.1 A judge officiating at test held under these rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the test. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the test to see that this rule is effectively carried out.: "It shall be the duty and obligation of the event giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at a hunt test held under these regulations, is not subject to any indignities. The Hunt Test Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue."

Release and Indemnification:

By participating in these tests (as handler, spectator or in any other role) each participant agrees to assume all risk and hazards incidental to these tests and agrees to release and to save harmless and indemnify the British Columbia Labrador Retriever Club Society and its members, any volunteer and the owners of the property upon which the tests are held together with their officers, agents, employees and representatives from all claims, actions, cost expenses and demands in respect to death, injury, loss or damage to the person or property of the participant howsoever caused, arising out of or in connection with the participants use or entry upon the property. It is understood that this agreement is binding upon the participants, his or her heirs, executors and assigns.
