East (right) on Twp Rd 520 3.3 km to Rge Rd 224.
North (left) on Rge Rd 224 600 meters to Ceretzke Rd/Fultonvale.
Turn east (right) 300 meters. School is on the left side.

From Sherwood Park - East on Wye Road to Hwy 21.
South (right) on Hwy 21 to Twp Rd 520.
East (left) on Twp Rd 520 3.3 km to Rge Rd 224.
North (left) on Rge Rd 224 600 meters to Ceretzke Rd/Fultonvale.
Turn east (right) 300 meters. School is on the left side.

- The field is a mown sport field. It is out of direct sight of roads but is not fully fenced.
- A continuous loop system will be used for all the events.
- Dogs are required to be present at Handlers' Briefing unless prior arrangements have been made with the Event Secretary. They are free to leave after completion of their run(s).
- Handlers may use a slip lead when releasing their dogs.
- Dogs are expected to be aroused and excited in the presence of the lure, but handlers must be able to control their dogs for everyone's safety.
- Dogs may wear muzzles and/or catch collars at the owner/agent's discretion. All tags must be secured or removed.
- **Retractable (Flexi type) leads and/shock collars are not permitted.**
- The Chair may excuse any hound from competition for any reason deemed justifiable.
- A \$20.00 fine, payable to ALCA, will be levied for any dog loose on the field at any time between Handlers briefing and the completion of the last test/event.
- There is limited shade and no water available, so please come PREPARED.
- Portable toilets will be available.
- ALCA, its agents, members, representatives, volunteers, etc. assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assume no responsibility for injury to children or spectators.

WHAT IS THE CHASE ABILITY PROGRAM (CAP) TEST?

This exciting event, developed after the ever-popular Lure Coursing, was introduced by the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) March 1, 2016. ALCA hosted the first CAP in Canada. The Chase Ability Program test allows dogs to uncover their natural prey drive by chasing a lure - all while having lots of fun. CAP also provides purebreds and mixed-breeds with the opportunity to compete and earn multiple titles in a field event that all dogs are capable of performing.

Two types of courses will be available: one for dogs shorter than 14 inches at the withers or brachycephalic dogs and another course for the remainder of the dogs entered. The Chase Ability program is a pass/fail event. How does your Dog earn a Pass? A dog must run alone, chasing the lure and complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption.

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS

Chase Ability Program participation is open to all purebred and mixed-breed dogs at least 12 months of age that are:

- individually registered with the CKC, or
- have an Event Registration Number (ERN), or
- have a Performance Event Number (PEN), or
- are eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed, or
- have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) if it's a mixed breed.

The CAP is an athletic pursuit that requires your dog to be in very good condition. Your dog relies on you to ensure this. Females in season may not compete.

If in the opinion of the Test Committee, any entry is found to be lame, unfit to participate or a female in season, it shall not be allowed to run and the entry fees shall be refunded.

COURSE LENGTHS OFFERED

300 yards: For dogs shorter than 14 inches at the withers and/or brachycephalic (flat-faced) dogs.

150 yards: If a Veteran Stake is offered, dogs 7 years or older may enter this stake. Dogs shorter than 14 inches at the withers and/or brachycephalic (flat-faced) will run 150 yards.

600 yards: For all dogs not eligible to run the short distance.

300 yards: If a Veteran Stake is offered, dogs 7 years or older may enter this stake. They will run 300 yards.

TITLES

Chase Ability (CA) - awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability event three (3) times under at least two (2) different judges

Chase Ability Excellent (CAX) - awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability event a total of ten (10) times (CA + seven (7) additional passes)

Chase Ability Excellent 2 (CAX 2) - awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability Event a total of 20 times (CAX + ten (10)). For every further ten (10) passes the dog may add a higher number after the CAX (CAX 3, CAX 4, etc.)

And, beginning in 2024:

Veteran Chase Ability (VCA) - awarded to a dog that passes the Veteran Chase Ability event three (3) times under at least two (2) different judges

Veteran Chase Ability Excellent (VCAX) - awarded to a dog that passes the Veteran Chase Ability event a total of ten (10) times (VCA + seven (7) additional passes)

Veteran Chase Ability Excellent 2 (VCAX 2) - awarded to a dog that passes the Veteran Chase Ability Event a total of 20 times (VCAX + ten (10)). For every further ten (10) passes the dog may add a higher number.

AWARDS

A qualifying ribbon will be awarded to each dog that achieves a Pass. ALCA also awards a rosette to each dog that achieves a CKC CAP title.

WHAT IS THE SPRINTER EVENT?

The SPRINTER EVENT was launched by the Canadian Kennel Club on July 1, 2018. ALCA hosted the first event in Canada. The Sprinter is a fun event open to all dogs to enjoy the challenge of running a 100 meter dash. This is a timed event. Dogs run singly. The dog's time to complete the 100 meter distance is converted to kilometer per hour (KPH). Dogs earn points based on their handicapped speed. Titles are awarded upon the dog accumulating a given number of points.

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS

SPRINTER EVENT participation is open to all purebred and mixed-breed dogs at least 12 months of age that are:

- individually registered with the CKC, or
- have an Event Registration Number (ERN), or
- have a Performance Event Number (PEN), or
- are eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed, or
- have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) if it's a mixed breed.

Sprinters are an athletic pursuit that requires your dog to be in very good condition. Your dog relies on you to ensure this.

Females in season may enter at the discretion of the event giving club. In 2024 ALCA will **NOT** allow bitches in season to participate.

If, in the opinion of the Test Committee, any entry is found to be lame or unfit to participate it shall not be allowed to enter and the entry fees shall be refunded.

YOUR TEAM

CKC rules state that 'It is recommended that an owner or someone familiar with the dog stand at the finish in order to catch the dog once the course has been completed.'

ALCA would like to reinforce this recommendation. Please find a 'buddy catcher' to support your team.

EARNING POINTS

The dog's time to complete the 100 meter dash is converted into Kilometers Per Hour(KPH).

A handicap system is applied to a dog's KPH to determine the number of points earned.

The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:

- (a) 18" or greater - handicap is 1.25.
- (b) 12" up to less than 18" - handicap is 1.5.
- (c) Below 12" - handicap is 2.0.

Points - KPH multiplied by the dog's handicap. For example 20 KPH x 1.5 = 30 points. Points are rounded to the nearest whole number.

TITLES

Novice Sprinter (NS) - awarded to a dog that earns 150 points

Sprinter (S) - awarded to a dog that earns 500 points

Advanced Sprinter (AS) - awarded to a dog that earns 1000 points

Sprinter Excellent (SX) - awarded to a dog that earns 1500 points

Sprinter Excellent 2 (SX2) - awarded to a dog that earns 2000 points. For each additional 500 points the dog may add a higher number after the SX (SX3, SX4, etc.)

And, beginning in 2024:

Veteran Novice Sprinter (VNS) – awarded to a dog that earns 75 points

Veteran Sprinter (VS) - awarded to a dog that earns 250 points

Veteran Advanced Sprinter (VAS) - awarded to a dog that earns 500 points

Veteran Sprinter Excellent (VSX) - awarded to a dog that earns 750 points

Veteran Sprinter Excellent 2 (VSX2) - awarded to a dog that earns 1000 points. For each additional 250 points, the dog may add a higher number after the VSX (VSX3, VSX4, etc)

AWARDS

A qualifying ribbon will be awarded to each dog that achieves a score. ALCA also awards a rosette to each dog that achieves a CKC Sprinter title.

!!! VETERAN CAPs !!!

Veteran CAPs is a set of titles for dogs 7 years of age or older that was introduced in 2024.

What stays the same:

Dogs under 14" or brachycephalic will run the shorter distance

Dogs 14" and over will run the longer distance

Dogs must complete the entire course with enthusiasm and without interruption

What is new:

Dogs entered in the Veteran Stake shall run half of the regular course for their height category

Veteran Chase Ability (VCA) - awarded to a dog that passes the Veteran Chase Ability event three (3) times under at least two (2) different judges

Veteran Chase Ability Excellent (VCAX) - awarded to a dog that passes the Veteran Chase Ability event a total of ten (10) times (VCA + seven (7) additional passes)

Veteran Chase Ability Excellent 2 (VCAX 2) - awarded to a dog that passes the Veteran Chase Ability Event a total of 20 times (VCAX + ten (10)). For every further ten (10) passes the dog may add a higher number.

When you select the VETERAN Stake on your entry form, your dog will earn Qualifying runs towards the veteran title. If you choose not to select the VETERAN Stake the run will count towards the regular titles.

!!! VETERAN SPRINTERS !!!

Veteran Sprinters is a set of titles for dogs 7 years of age or older that was introduced in 2024.

What stays the same:

Distance: 100 meters

Maximum allowed time: 60 seconds

Points: time converted to KPH multiplied by Handicap

Handicap: based on height at withers

What is new:

Veteran Novice Sprinter (VNS) – awarded to a dog that earns 75 points

Veteran Sprinter (VS) - awarded to a dog that earns 250 points

Veteran Advanced Sprinter (VAS) - awarded to a dog that earns 500 points

Veteran Sprinter Excellent (VSX) - awarded to a dog that earns 750 points

Veteran Sprinter Excellent 2 (VSX2) - awarded to a dog that earns 1000 points. For each additional 250 points, the dog may add a higher number after the VSX(VSX3, VSX4, etc)

When you select the VETERAN Stake on your entry form, your dog will earn points towards the veteran title. If you choose not to select the VETERAN Stake the points will count towards the regular title.
