ATTENTION CANADIAN EXHIBITORS - INFORMATION REGARDING TITLES: The following has been copied from the CKC website:

At the December Board meeting input provided by the membership was reviewed and considered to the board regarding the noticed posted to the CKC website on November 6, 2010 regarding a new Tracking fee for non-members. The Board has made changes to the original motion approved at the September Board meeting and the following motion was passed in December and therefore the following non-member participation fee now applies and is retroactive to January 1, 2011. The non-member participation fee applies to all Canadian residents who participate in a CKC event and a participating non-member can chose to purchase a CKC membership or pay the non-member fee. This only applies to dogs wholly owned by non-members and is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the CKC to efficiently manage recording and tracking points, it's important that non-members select one of the two options within 30 days of notification or, unfortunately, we will be forced to cancel any awards and titles.

24-12-3. Non-member participation fee

- a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.
- b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.
- c) The Premium List must carry a note stating that these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS:

- **SMOKING AND VAPING IS NOT PERMITTED ANYWHERE ON THE HOST'S PROPERTY** violation of this rule will result in excusal from the test grounds and could potentially lose the club access to the property for future events.
- The Test precepts will include the entire field area with test track contained within the fence and gates as well as a designated potty area along the shelter belt on the east side.
- Exhibitors are to provide sun protection /shade and lots of water for your dogs.
- There will be a \$10.00 fine for dogs loose on the field or on the host's property, including potty area. All dogs MUST be on a leash and secure collar/harness when outside their vehicle or on the track. All leashes must be held by a person, not attached to a ground stake or vehicle.
- Lame dogs will be excused and their entry refunded, provided notice is given prior to or during roll call.
- Bitches in season must wear panties.
- Dogs not present at roll call shall be marked absent with no refunds.
- Muzzles and catch collars may be used at the handler's discretion. Per CKC rules, no prong or shock collars are permitted on test grounds. NO FLEXI or RETRACTABLE leashes permitted on test grounds. The only permitted collars during a dog's run are a flat, buckle collar with tags removed. The dog may also be run without a collar. Slip, half-check, or martingale or head collars are not permitted and will result in an NQ. Harnesses must be removed.
- People are expected to clean up after their dogs. There will be a \$20.00 fine for NOT cleaning up after your dog. Dogs are not to be off leash on the venue host's property at all, including areas outside of the defined Test precepts. Please do not let your dog urinate on the gates/gate posts, private vehicles or tents or anything else people have to handle. There are plenty of trees to choose from.
- The grass test track is mowed and will be enclosed by fencing.
- All exhibitors and spectators must remain away from the drag line and out of lure operator's marked area. The Event Officials will mark an area such that the lure line will not be interfered with and the lure operator will have clear line of sight of the entire field. This is a safety issue for exhibitors and their dogs.

- All exhibitors will follow Event Official's (Event Secretary, Lure Operator, Field Marshall, Event Chair) instructions. Refusal to comply will result in dismissal from the trial and grounds without refund of fees.
- -There will be NO canteen on site. All attendees will need to bring their own water, drinks and food. A port-a-potty will be the bathroom facilities available. There is no shade available.

PARKING -Field will open at 8am each day. Vehicles leaving the field are to be given the right of way. Parking area will be marked – please park in such a way to allow all vehicles to be accommodated. Drivers are to obey all directions from trial committee as to where to park. Please drive carefully and do not drive on the planted field!!! Dogs and people on foot have the right of way on all parts of the trial grounds.

To avoid congestion, when a dog has completed its second run, the handler and catcher are encouraged to leave the field unless they are volunteering for the Test.

Due to fire danger, do not idle your vehicle for long periods while parked.

DIRECTIONS TO THE TEST FIELD



From the Regina Bypass, take the center road exit (Exit 4) and head west. Turn south (left) at bottom of interchange (Range Road 2204). Follow the gravel road almost to the end. Entrance to field will be marked. Please stay on the trail; do not drive onto the cultivated field.

How Will This Test Work?

First, the Secretary will assign each entry a group number. This number will be relayed to each entrant before the day of the Test. The handler's meeting will be delivered via email on the Friday evening before the test. It is the handler's responsibility to read and understand. The secretary's phone will be available for calls, however, she will be setting up on the field and it may be better to text her.

On the day of the Test, dogs will be brought to the field at the time indicated for their Group number. DO NOT arrive before your group time. Dogs are permitted ONE (1) handler to release them and ONE (1) catcher to retrieve them.

When you arrive you will approach the secretary's office with your dog (tent at mid-field). The Test committee will assess the dog for lameness by having the owner gait the dog about 30' away from and towards the test committee. The handler and catcher will wait at their vehicle until the dog's name is called. There will be a warm up area, however, handlers warming up their dogs should stretch them at their vehicles and make sure to keep physical distance from anyone else. The potty area will be marked.

Camping

Dry camping on site for tents and smaller campers will be available at no cost. Propane bbq's are permitted; no open fires allowed. Contact for availability.
