## **Junior Showmanship**

Conformation Classes Offered Pee Wee (non-competitive); Junior Novice, Intermediate Novice, Senior Novice, Junior Open, Intermediate Open, Senior Open Age Structure: Pee Wee (4-6 years), Junior (7-11 years), Senior (12-18 years). Entry Fee: \$2.00 payable at registration. Dogs handled in the competition must be entered in the show/trial on that day. There will be a rosette and prize for Best Overall Junior Handler and Reserve Best Overall.

ATTENTION: CKC JUNIOR HANDLING RULES – EFFECTIVE JAN. 1, 2019. Section 3.4.1 “Junior Handler with the exception of PeeWees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number within 30 days of competing in their first Junior Handling event.

This Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handler Number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked.”

THE 2025 AKC SUMMER CLASSIC  
Foothills County Permit 24D 247**

The 2025 AKC Summer Classic is operating under  
Foothills County Special Event Development Permit 24D 247 (Annual)

Highway AB-2A is a major throughfare and approaching 306 Ave E from the North on 2A requires a left turn across busy lanes of traffic at an uncontrolled intersection. Please refer to the following maps and instructions for access to the show grounds.

*Please proceed to the entrance of the Okotoks Agricultural Society (OAS) Grounds  
from 306 Ave E to be escorted to your RV/Day Parking space*

*Thursday, July 31, 2025 – 8 am to 10 pm – RV Arrival*

*Thursday, July 31, 2025 – 2 pm to 10 pm Day Parking Benching Setup*

*If you cannot enter the grounds because of traffic into the show site,  
Foothills County and the Okotoks Agricultural Society have requested that  
vehicles NOT stop to wait on 306 Ave E.*

*The road is not wide enough to permit waiting.*

*Please go around again to the 306 Ave E exit off AB-2 S.*

*Parking is not first come, first served. Your space is assigned to you by the parking/security  
volunteers. Please be patient, we will get you parked.*

*The Alberta Kennel Club, its Board of Directors, staff, volunteers, contract employees and agents are not  
responsible for any damages to any party arising from the entry or egress to the Okotoks Agricultural Society  
Grounds (the Grounds) or from any activity taking place at the Grounds.*

1. **ARRIVING AT THE OKOTOKS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GROUNDS FROM THE NORTH**

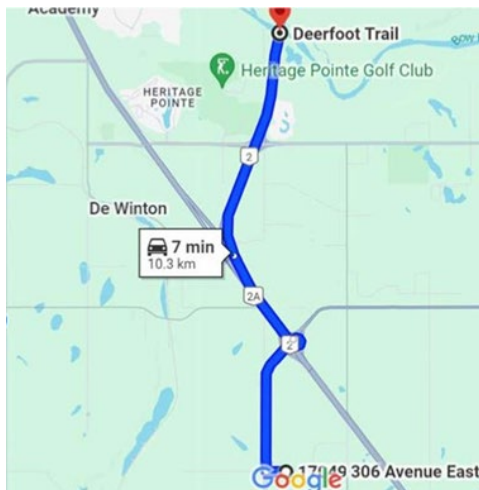


WHEN APPROACHING FROM THE NORTH  
USING RIGHT-HAND TURNS OFF HIGHWAYS

1. Heading South on AB-2 S (PAST EXIT 222) (3.7 KM)
2. Turn right onto 306 Ave E (right turn lane onto 306 Ave E) (2.0 KM)
3. Turn left into Okotoks Agricultural Society Grounds

2. **LEAVING THE OKOTOKS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GROUNDS TO THE NORTH**



1. Head west on 306 Ave E toward 17 St E (400 m)
  2. Turn right onto AB-2A N (2.8 KM)
  3. Use any lane to merge onto AB-2 N/AB-2A N via the ramp to AB-2A N/Calgary (2.5 KM)
  4. Keep right to continue on Deerfoot Trail / AB-2 N, follow signs for Trans-Canada Hwy E / AB-1 E (4.6 KM)

### 3. **ARRIVING** AT THE OKOTOKS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GROUNDS FROM THE SOUTH



WHEN APPROACHING FROM THE SOUTH,  
**USING RIGHT-HAND TURNS off HIGHWAYS**

1. Heading North on AB-2 N
2. Take EXIT 209 toward Diamond Valley / Aldersyde / High River (700 m)
3. Use the left lane to take the AB-7 W ramp to Okotoks (170 m)
4. Turn left onto AB-7 W (1.0 KM)
5. Use right lane to turn onto Hwy 7 E / AB-2a N / AB-7 W (signs for Okotoks / Black Diamond / Turner Valley) (5.9 KM)
6. Turn right onto AB -2a N (8.5 KM)
7. Turn right onto 306 Ave E (350 m)
8. Turn right into Okotoks Agriculture Society Grounds

### 4. **LEAVING** THE OKOTOKS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY GROUNDS TO THE SOUTH



1. Head west on 306 Ave E toward 17 St E (400 m)
2. Turn right onto AB-2A N (2.3 KM)
3. Use the right lane to merge onto AB-2 S via the ramp to Fort Macleod (28.1 KM)

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### **RV Parking:**

*RV Parking or Overnight Tenting is permitted in designated areas only.*

AKC reserves the right to require vehicles be moved if parking in non-designated areas.

All vehicles must be out of the designated areas by 8:00 am. Failure to comply may result in expulsion from the rest of the show.

### **Please note the following parking requirements/restrictions:**

1. Those wishing to park together must arrive together – **NO EXCEPTIONS**
2. If you have prepaid for a spot in our Handicapped area, you must provide a valid, government issued handicapped placard, and if you do not have one of these, we will have to assign you to another available space.
3. Space changing will not be permitted. All vehicles must park as directed by parking personnel.
4. **Once your RV is parked you will not be able to remove it from the facility in some designated areas until the show closes on Monday, August 4, 2025.** If you need to leave during the weekend, you may do so before 8:00 am, Noon or after Best in Show, once you have vacated you will not be able to enter the park with your RV again.  
A few Angled RV sites will not be allowed to exit until Monday afternoon due to having a neighbor behind you.  
Please discuss with parking volunteers before being situated in the RV Park.

5. Tow-vehicles must fit into assigned RV space (not in the aisle or fire lanes).
6. There will be no people movers at the show. Please provide your own method of moving your equipment.
7. Grass mats are permitted.
8. Please ensure you have planks of wood/leveling materials for under your tires/jacks to avoid any sinking into the grass areas in the event of heavy rain. Terrain is not all flat, there are some slopes, dips, grass/gravel combinations, sand/gravel. **Please make sure you have adequate leveling materials with you when you arrive.**
9. Motorhome exhaust pipes must be vented up (**mandatory**); portable generators must be placed on a board and not directly on the gravel/grass and situated away from your neighbors.
10. **All generators must be turned off between 11 pm and 6 am daily. Be a good Neighbor!**
11. The OAS does not allow fire pits of any kind allowed (wood/propane). Propane BBQs are OK.
12. No Fresh Water on site for filling, ensure to have your freshwater tank full before you arrive.
13. No dumping of gray water or sewage is allowed. **Please keep your sites CLEAN.**
14. All parking is at your own risk:
  - a. THE ALBERTA KENNEL CLUB IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR WEATHER RELATED DAMAGE TO PERSONAL PROPERTY. PLEASE BE PREPARED FOR UNFORSEEN EVENTS ESPECIALLY WIND AND/OR HAIL.
  - b. If you must leave the show grounds, dogs in your care must be moved inside. **DOGS MAY NOT BE LEFT UNATTENDED IN ANY OUTDOOR ENCLOSURE or space.** FAILURE TO COMPLY will result in excusal from the show.
  - c. Please ensure that the awnings are down and/or secured if you are leaving the show grounds. This applies to day tents in your RV setup as well, they must be lowered (or canopy removed every day before you leave).
  - d. All set-ups are required to have a contact phone number posted in case of emergency.
15. No abusive language will be tolerated; anyone not following parking rules will be asked to leave, no refunds will be given.
16. Overnight RV parking is available from 7:00 am – 10:00 pm Thursday, July 31, 2025. Those arriving other days/times will not be allowed to park RV's during show hours. Friday to Sunday any new RV arrivals must be between 7 am and 8 am daily or after Best in Show Daily.
17. All days – those arriving after 10 pm must NOT park themselves! Do not enter the grounds, please go to the nearest parking lot for the evening and return to the entrance at 7 am the next day where you will be escorted to your spot. This is a safety concern for the Alberta Kennel Club and ignoring this request will result in withdrawal of the right to park on the show grounds.
18. On Monday afternoon, August 4, 2025, we invite RV patrons to exit through the West Gate to 17 Street East.

**NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON MONDAY NIGHT – NO EXCEPTIONS!**

**Vehicle Day Parking:**

**NO PARKING IS ALLOWED IN THE MILL STORE PARKING LOT ADJACENT TO THE SHOW SITE**

1. Designated Handicapped day parking areas – refer to facility site map, you will be guided to your spot by our parking/security volunteers.
2. The Alberta Kennel Club reserves the right to have vehicles towed that are in areas other than described, this includes those areas that are designated “No Parking.”
3. **The speed limit on the grounds (including the RV Parking area) is 5 km/hour. Safety for all & Dust Control!!**
4. Any indignities to the service providers or to the volunteers of the Alberta Kennel Club will result in IMMEDIATE EXPULSION from the shows. Thank you for your cooperation!
5. All parking is a privilege at the Okotoks Agricultural Society grounds. Anyone abusing these privileges will be excused immediately from the show, and all future shows on this venue by the parking authorities and/or show superintendent.

## Reserved Day Benching:

1. Move-in – Thursday, July 31, 2025 @ 2 pm
2. If you have a generator, please secure with a lock and bring your own power cords (at least 100' in length). Generators on the Polocrosse field must be placed on the North side of the field, along the fencing. Covered Stalls, please place your generator outside of the stall.
3. Your contact information must be visible in your benching area in the event of an emergency.
4. You are responsible for leaving your benching area as you found it.
5. **All benching must be vacated 1 hour following Best in Show on Monday, August 5, 2024.**
6. **Absolutely no vehicles on the fields at any time, please ensure you have a cart/trolley to move your items to your reserved benching spot.**
7. Pick-up/Drop-off must be before 8:00 am, immediately unload, then park your vehicle in a designated area. You may only pick up after the BIS events have completed.

**Note that you only have 15 minutes to drop off/pick up. The area will be supervised.**

8. No smoking in the Agriplex, benching areas or the competition fields at any time!
9. **Dogs are not to be left overnight in outdoor benching spaces per permit 24D 247**
10. **ALL DAY TENTS MUST BE SECURELY TIED DOWN AND TOP DROPPED AT THE END OF EACH DAY.**
11. **Grass mats are permitted** in the day tenting areas on grass. Mats are permitted and recommended on areas of wood shavings or packed earth.
12. Generators (civilized ones please, excessively loud generators will not be permitted) are permitted in the day tenting area, however the generators must be housed up against the fence line and at no time are to infringe on your neighbors' space so that exhaust fumes would enter their area. Please ensure you have a long extension cord if you are using a generator.
13. You are responsible for leaving your space as you found it... **CLEAN!** Please ensure that you have a rake/tool handy to clean up your area, left behind garbage, dog hair, rubber bands, etc. are not the responsibility of the Alberta Kennel Club Volunteers. We thank you for your cooperation in this regard!

## Un-Reserved Outdoor Benching:

*North side of show grounds (please refer to site map) – available Thursday July 31, 2025 @ 2 pm*

## Dog Bathing:

We have bathing stalls available on the south end of the Agriplex, all complete with bath tubs.

Bathing open Thursday July 31st at 5pm.

No filling of RV's or water jugs permitted here.

## Drinking Water:

There will be several water stations around the grounds with potable water for you and your dogs.

## Concessions:

## Recycle, Garbage & Dog Poop:

- You are **TOTALLY** responsible for picking up after your dog. The Okotoks Agricultural Society and the Alberta Kennel Club have **ZERO** tolerance for dog droppings on the grounds. Let us be responsible and set a great example keeping the grounds pristine. **Exhibitors who are found not picking up after their dogs will be asked to leave the show immediately.**
- All Exhibitors are responsible for putting their recyclables, garbage, and hair in the large garbage bins. If you are disposing of boxes, please break them down flat before putting in garbage bins. Please do not leave piles of garbage on the ground.
- Please leave your benching areas clean at the end of the show as a courtesy the volunteers who run the show.
