What is included:

Working spot – 4 hours of instruction/group work per day with dogs of similar skill level, lunch, and auditing for the rest of the day. Auditing Spot – Observation of both working groups and lunch

A little about our Instructor Kiersten Lloyd:

I was born in Australia and moved to Canada in 1981. I rode horses competitively from the age of 7 to 20yrs. The skills learned training and competing with horses have helped me greatly over the years of dog training. I got my first dog, Archer the Kuvasc, in 1994 and started training him in obedience. During the process of training this big, hardheaded male I discovered that dog training was something that came naturally and that I really enjoyed. After I lost Archer at too young of an age due to severe allergies I moved to the Labrador Retriever breed. In 1996 I welcomed Quiggly into my home and heart. Since then I have had Kes, Q, Repeat, Zoom, Swift, Furai, and Kicks. These wonderful Labradors have meant everything to me. They have been my best friends, my team mates and my challenges. Each one has taught me something different. Over the years my Labradors have received many awards in both agility and obedience which stand as milestones in our lives. A few of these include 2 Top 10 Obedience Dogs of Canada All Breed, 1 MOTCh, 2 OTCh, 4 CDX, 5 ATChC, 2 MACH, 5 AAC National Championships, many AAC Regional Championships, 2 memberships of World Agility Teams, 3 AAC Lifetime awards and many, many other titles. My dogs and I have competed in AAC, CKC, NADAC, AKC, UKI and USDAA. While these titles in themselves are valueless in some minds, in my mind they are landmarks that tell of the wonderful relationship I have with my dogs.

At this point in time I am competing mostly with Swift, Furai and Baby Kicks. Swift and Furai have qualified to run in the 2014 AKC Nationals in Harrisburg, PA. Kicks at just 2yrs old is working toward her Excellent and Masters titles in AKC, and working thru the titles in CKC and AAC.

As the years passed I found myself teaching both obedience and agility in the weekly class and the seminar environment. I have also been an AAC and CKC judge since 2000. I have written regularly for Dog Sport Magazine and written/co-written 3 agility practise books.

I believe that our dogs must be our friends and pets before anything else. When I write, teach or judge I do so with the intent to help people understand and relate better to their dogs. When I teach agility I attempted to see each dog and human team as unit different to all the others in a class. My goal is to find a way to help each particular team enjoy the sport of agility in whatever method is best for those individuals. I hope that my input into the dog world will increase people's enjoyment of their four legged buddies.

Seminar Info:

Registrants will be split into two groups based on current training level. GROUP 1- The more experienced group – for owners and dogs who are competing or working at a more advanced level. Curriculum to be specified based on the needs of the working spot applicants.

Group 2- For owners and/or dogs new to the sport. Will cover obstacle performance foundation work, teaching jump patterns, and introduction to sequencing (again, exact curriculum will be based on an appropriate level for the registered participants).

*** Please note – all dogs (novice or experienced) must be sound and healthy (up to date on vaccinations/titres), non-aggressive, and under control at all times. If this is your first agility seminar, please make sure your dog is reasonably obedient off leash before registration, and is reasonably quiet when not working. The seminar will take place in a securely fenced ring.

Registration Fees – Half of your registration fee is due now, please send a post dated check for July 1st for the other half. You will receive a receipt for your registration fees at the seminar. *Checks should be made payable to Eromit Labrador Retrievers *

Cancellation fee- if you must cancel your registration – refund policy is as follows: Cancelled before March 1st – full refund After March 1st – July 1st half refund After July 1st – NO REFUND (unless your spot can be filled)
