#### JEAN-CHRISTOPHE BOULINGUEZ

Jean-Christophe Boulinguez has been involved with purebred dogs and the Whippet breed since 1998 when his parents bought their first whippet from Patricia Miller of Woodsmoke Whippets in Canada. After graduating college in 2008, while still involved with Whippets, Mr. Boulinguez wanted to experience other hound breeds and acquired an Ibizan Hound named James, MBIS MBISS Am CH/Can GCHEX Harehill Goes All In, a dog that ended up stealing his heart and made the breed become a true passion.

Before becoming a judge, Mr. Boulinguez started in the dog world as a junior handler, then got experienced with numerous breeds as semi-professional handler for about 10 years, mainly specializing in Hounds and Toys breeds. He currently breeds Ibizan Hounds under the Requiem prefix. Mr Boulinguez has also bred Whippets with his mother under the Interlude prefix as well as Wire-haired Pointing Griffons (Korthal) under the DuValin prefix with Ms Aline Tremblay.

Several dogs owned and bred by Mr Boulinguez have won All-Breed Best in Shows, Specialty Best In Shows, majors awards at Canadian and American National Specialties and the prestigious Westminster Kennel Club.

Mr. Boulinguez has always had an affection for different breeds and over the years, other than Ibizans, Whippets and Wire-Haired Pointing Griffons, he has owned an Italian Greyhound, a Pharaoh Hound, a Samoyed, a Grand Basset Griffon Vendeen and an English Bulldog.

He currently is one the youngest licensed judge in North America and has judged across Canada and the United States as well as in Argentina, France, Japan, Germany, Switzerland and Mexico. Mr. Boulinguez is a founding member and current President of the All Hound Club of Quebec.

#### JUDITH BROWN

I have been involved in the sport of pure-bred dogs since 1970. In that time, I have bred 30+ Champions and many Obedience titled dogs. I am an AKC Breeder of Merit and an AKC Outstanding Sportsman.

I served on the Board of the Doberman Pinscher Club of America for 20+ years as President, Vice President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary and Director and am the recipient of the DPCA Lifetime Achievement Award.

I am approved by the American Kennel Club to judge the Sporting Group, Hound Group, Working Group, Non-Sporting Group, Toy Group, Herding Group, and one-half of the Terrier Group, as well as Junior Showmanship and Best in Show. I have judged in Argentina, Australia, Canada, Russia, Mexico, Venezuela, El Salvador, China, Puerto Rico, Japan, Thailand, South Korea, Brasil, and nearly every U.S. state including Hawaii and Alaska.

I am honored to be judging once again in Canada! Best of luck to everyone!

### OBEDIENCE/RALLY

Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch comes into season (CKC Rule 6.5) *after* the close of entries if a Veterinarian's Certificate (certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial) is delivered to the show Secretary before the starting date and the time of the trial. The club will refund entry, recording and listing fees if the above conditions are met. No refunds will be given for the service fees provided by the dogshow.ca.

A 50% refund of entry fees only will be made for a bitch in season without a Veterinarian's certificate with written notification presented to the Show Secretary at least ONE HOUR before the start of the Trials for Performance events ONLY. The bitch must be available to be examined by the show superintendent to verify she is in season.

### ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS:

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

### EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

All dogs that are foreign-born and foreign-owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering Canadian Kennel Club events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will **require an ERN – Event Registration Number.** An ERN does not register a dog with CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act but rather enables a foreign-owned dog to be awarded titles by the Canadian Kennel Club. Each dog must have its own ERN number. A CKC ERN registration form and ERN fee details can be downloaded from the CKC website: [www.ckc.ca](http://www.ckc.ca) To obtain an ERN, mail or fax the Canadi-

an Kennel Club the ERN form with a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate plus a certified cheque, money order, VISA or MasterCard number (expiry date, cardholder's name and signature). Provide your complete address for return of the ERN to you. ERN MUST BE APPLIED FOR WITHIN 30 DAYS OF FIRST DAY OF ENTERING A CKC EVENT.

### ATTENTION CANADIAN EXHIBITORS

#### CKC Non-Member Participation Fee

- a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.
- b) In order to protect awards/titles earned, the non-member may EITHER become a CKC member OR pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be canceled.
- c) "these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by Canadian resident non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members"

The owner of a dog entered in this show is entirely responsible for any error in the entering of his dog, regardless of how, or by whom the entry was made. An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex, may be amended up to one hour before the start of the show.

#### EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Rule books are \$6.00 and can be obtained by contacting the Canadian Kennel Club.

# CLASSIFICATION

---

Please see CKC rule books for specific class descriptions. These rules may be viewed on the CKC website. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the Conformation, Obedience & Rally rules as set out by the Canadian Kennel Club.

## CONFORMATION

---

The following CKC conformation classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

**Junior Puppy:** for dogs 6 mths of age but under 9 mths of age.

**Senior Puppy:** for dogs 9 mths of age but under 12 mths of age.

**12-18 Months:** for dogs 12 mths of age and under 18 mths of age.

**Canadian Bred:** for dogs born in Canada; champions in any country excluded.

**Bred by Exhibitor:** for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

**Open:** for all dogs.

**Specials Only:** dogs which are registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club and have attained championship status may be entered in the 'Specials Only' class.

**Exhibition Only:** for all dogs over 6 mths of age and eligible for registration with the CKC (non-competitive class).

**Veterans:** Veterans will be divided Males and Females with a Best of Breed judged for each. The Best of Breed winner will go on to Best Veteran in Group and Best Veteran in Show. Dogs must be 7 years or older on the day of the show.

**Baby Puppy (4-6 Mths):** for dogs 4 mths of age & under 6 mths of age – dogs will compete in this unofficial class for Best Male/Best Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Group & Show. They do not compete for Winners.

## OBEDIENCE

---

**Pre-Novice:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title PCD (Pre Companion Dog) title in Canada. Only dogs that have NOT earned the CD title may enter Pre-Novice.

**Novice A:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not won the title of CD. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The handler in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families.

**Novice B:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed has not won the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'sit' and 'down' exercise.

**Novice C:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed has gained a CD or any higher obedience titles.

**Novice Intermediate:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a CD or higher obedience title. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are NOT eligible for High in Trial.

Open: 12.1.1/12.1.2 & 18A...there will be two classes, Open A and Open B – effective January 1st, 2025

**OPEN A:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has won the title of CD but has not won the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in these classes must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH title may NOT handle a dog in this class.

**Open B:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has won the title of CD and any dog that has earned the CDX or any higher obedience titles may enter either of the Open B classes. A dog may also be entered in the Utility class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person.

**Utility A:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has won the title of CDX but not the UD. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Handlers may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

**Utility B:** for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CDX or UD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class but the same person must handle the dog in all exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial.

## RALLY

---

**Rally Novice A:** dogs entered in this class may not have earned a CKC Rally Novice title or any CKC Novice Obedience title other than PCD.

**Rally Novice B:** Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. No dog may be entered in Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

**Rally Intermediate:** for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RI or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. Dog handled by owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

**Rally Advanced A:** for dogs that have earned the RN title but have not won the Rally Advanced title or any CKC Obedience title other than PCD. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title shall be eligible to enter this class.

**Rally Advanced B:** for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the RA title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class.

**Rally Excellent A:** for dogs that have earned the RA title but have not won the RE title or any CKC Obedience title other than PCD.

**Rally Excellent B:** for dogs that have earned the RA title. A dog completing the RE title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

**Rally Master:** for dogs that have earned the RE title. A dog completing the RM title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB RE: INFECTIOUS DISEASES – POLICY STATEMENT

---

(Board Motions #20-09-18, #89-05-19)

The Canadian Kennel Club Genetics and Medical Committee reminds breeders and owners about the risks of infectious diseases and the Baby Puppy class.

The CKC Rules and Regulations for shows, trials and tests, with some exceptions, have explicit rules to minimize the transmission of communicable diseases.

- A dog may not be entered or exhibited at a show, trial or test if it has any communicable disease. Dogs entered in a show, trial or test must have current immunization status.
- No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of a show, trial or test if it:
  - (a) is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
  - (b) has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease with the last 30 days;
  - (c) has been housed within 30 days prior to the show, trial or test on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;

8.1.3 Where it is found that these rules have been contravened, the dog in question shall be removed from the show, trial or test premises/grounds and **the exhibitor will be subject to disciplinary action.**

**IMPORTANT NOTICE: RV owners and large grooming set-up users who do not pre-book/pay in advance will not be guaranteed space and will be parked only after all exhibitors who have reserved are parked/benched and there are spaces available. Thank you for your cooperation!**

**NOTE: There will be no assigned parking. NO PARKING REFUNDS WILL BE MADE AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.**

**Extracts From CKC Dog Show Rules**

**Chapter 8 Entries and End of Show Section**

**8.2.5** An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

**Section 8.3.1** Entries: Every dog entered in a Championship show must be one of the following:

- a) registered with the CKC,
- b) have an Event Registration Number (ERN)
- c) be eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d) if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

**Section 8.4.1** Listed Dogs: If a dog is not registered as in 8.3.1 (a) or (b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC, it may be entered at a show as a listed dog provided:

- b) that if born in Canada, it is eligible for individual registration;
- c) that if not born in Canada, is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC.
- d) that if it is a foreign born and owned dog, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtain from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

**Section 8.4.2** Entry of a listed dog at a show must be accompanied by a listing fee as set by the Board in addition to the regular entry fee.

**Section 8.5.1** Acceptance of Entries: If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.

**Section 8.5.3** No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for pure bred dogs.

**Section 8.5.4** After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in case of a postal strike.

**Section 8.6.1** Refusal of Entries: The authorities of any show may:

- a) decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or
- b) refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness.
- c) in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.

**Section 8.8.2** Fees: Tendering of a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card in payment of an entry fee shall be considered non-payment of said fee and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.

**Section 8.9.1** Moving a Dog to Specials: A dog which is individually registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a Championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for a show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one hour prior to the opening of the show.

**Section 8.9.2** If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the Championship requirements, all awards will be canceled and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.

**Section 8.9.3** When one or more All-Breed and/or Specialty Shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the moving of class dogs to Specials must be made prior to the scheduled opening of the first show.

**Chapter 4 Judges Section 4.1.3** A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

**Section 4.1.5** No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act.

**Chapter 14 Disqualifying or Excusing Dogs**

**Section 14.1.2** (a) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to excuse or disqualify a dog which menaces, threatens, attempts to bite or bites the judge, another person, or another dog in the ring. When a dog is twice excused on this account, it shall have the status of a disqualified dog.

(b) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to permanently disqualify a dog which bites the judge or another person in the ring. Dogs disqualified under this provision will not be eligible for reinstatement. The decision to permanently disqualify a dog must be clearly indicated on the Judge's Disqualification Form.

**Section 14.1.4** Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until

the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. A dog disqualified under section 14.1.2 (b) is not eligible for reinstatement.

**Section 14.1.5** Any dog that is disqualified under section 14.1.2(a) shall automatically be disqualified from entering in any CKC event in any other discipline until such time as the dog is officially reinstated, if the dog is eligible for reinstatement.

**Championship Points and Cancellations**

**Section 15.1.1** A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

**Section 15.1.2** The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 & more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

\*Includes the dog awarded Winners.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

**Section 15.1.3** If a Dog awarded Winners was also awarded Best of Breed then at the show all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included the total.

**Section 15.1.4** If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total.

**Section 15.1.5** If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.

**Section 15.1.6** If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.

**Section 15.1.7** The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

**Clarification:** Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

**Section 15.1.8** In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Winners which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that the dog was defeated at the Group level.

**Section 15.1.9** A dog may not be credited with more than 5 championship points in a single show:

**Section 15.1.10** A breed or class shall not be allowed more than 2 sets of championship points per sex on any day in the same venue.

**Section 15.1.11** A dog awarded Winners which also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with 5 championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

**Section 15.1.12** In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship certificate, the dog must:

- (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 judges; and,
- (b) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number.
- (c) have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.

**15.2 Grand Champion (GCh)**

15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

**(a) Grand Champion Point System**

Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

(b) the following schedule shall be employed in determination of points awarded at Group Level for all GCh:

c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

(d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

Win	Points
Best in Show	5
Best of Breed at a National Specialty Show	5
Reserve Best in Show	4
Best of Breed at a Specialty Show (other than National)	3

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

**15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)**

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

## **RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS**

The Northern Alberta Canine Association and the specialty clubs reserve the right to remove from the shows or trials any person or dog for any just cause. Any dog excused by the show superintendent or veterinarian, for any reason, shall not compete in any classes or accept any awards for the duration of the shows or trials. No refund of any fees will be made. If because of riot, civil disturbance or any other acts beyond the control of the show committee, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refunds shall be made.

Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch entered in Rally/Obedience comes into season after the close of entries if a Veterinarian's Certificate (certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial) is delivered to the Show Secretary before the starting date and the time of the trial. The Club will refund entry, recording and listing fees if the above conditions are met. No refunds will be given for the service fees provided by the dogshow.ca. A 50% refund of entry fees only will be made for a bitch in season without a Veterinarian's certificate with written notification presented to the Show Secretary at least ONE HOUR before the start of the Trials. The bitch must be available to be examined by the Show superintendent to verify she is in season.

- 4.1.5 No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.
- 19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times on the show grounds or within the show building.
  - The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of these shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
  - **ANYONE PARKING IN THE FIRE LANES OR OTHER AREAS DESIGNATED AS "OFF LIMITS" WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE SHOW.**
  - All recreational units must have buckets underneath for their drains. Those discharging of any water on the grounds will be removed by order of the health department and subject to a fine.
  - A judge officiating at this show held under CKC rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. (4.7.1)
  - A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent (5.1.6)
  - There is to be NO SMOKING in the large show tent, nor entrances to it, and NO SMOKING is allowed in the show building.
  - Dogs must be on the show grounds 1 hour prior to judging of their breed.
  - All vehicles are left on the show grounds at your own risk. No security is provided.
  - **No abuse of parking personnel. NACA members or volunteers will be tolerated!!**
  - RV's will not be allowed to travel on the show grounds when judging is occurring. Under special circumstances (in case of emergency) the show superintendent will stop the show and parking personnel will assist in the safe removal of vehicle.

## **ENTRY AGREEMENT**

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules" and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Northern Alberta Canine Association has the right to refuse this entry for just cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of entries made in these all-breed shows, obedience trials, agility trials or any of the associated Specialties, and of the holding of these shows and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Northern Alberta Canine Association, associated Specialty Clubs, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, or show secretaries, and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club(s) or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves) or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in these shows and trials, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.
